



Park Development

Wheatland Park Disc Golf Project

In January, Buhler Recreation and the City of Buhler completed a project to improve the Disc Golf Course. Improvements included expanding the course from 9 holes to 18, adding 6 concrete tee pads, and adding tee signs to each hole.

Becker Park and Wheatland Park Improvements

Buhler Recreation and the City of Buhler worked to lay the groundwork for exciting Park improvements. In May, 2023 the Reno County Health Department announced that the City of Buhler has received a grant from Pathways to a Healthy Kansas, a Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas initiative, for \$100,000 to improve Becker and Wheatland Park. Additional funds were awarded through grants from Buhler Community Foundation, and Reno County Community Foundation. Improvement plans are expected to be completed in 2024 and include the following:

• Add a one-fifth mile, 6 or 8 foot wide, ADA compliant, multiuse trail around Becker Park

- Add a parking area to Becker Park
- Add trail amenities (benches, picnic tables, trees, dog station, & trash receptacles)
- Add trail lighting along sections of Wheatland Park's trail.



Recreation Programming Survey

BRC Staff administered a survey during the fall of 2023 to gather opinions and feedback on local programs and services provided by BRC and partners. The results of the survey were used to better understand community needs and wants to help prioritize valuable resources.

The online survey opened on Oct. 31, and closed on Nov. 19, with 178 participants.

The BRC Board held a workshop on 12/14/23 to review survey results to create a 3 year goal plan (2024 - 2026). The goals are listed below in order of priority:

 Develop and implement a Wellness Center equipment replacement plan. The Wellness Center is BRC's largest revenue source and most users would like equipment upgrades to be the top priority.



- 2. Improve Communications.
 - Website, marketing, registration software and rain out lines should be improved as program offerings expand.

- 3. Improve existing baseball and softball (youth and adult) leagues.
 - Emphasize:
 - Umpire recruiting and training.
 - Helping parents understand youth sports collaborations.



- 4. Add Senior Programs.
 - Partnerships with Buhler Senior Center and Sunshine Meadows should be explored to better serve the aging population in Buhler.
- 5. Add Fitness Classes
 - There is significant interest in Yoga, Zumba, and Intro to Weightlifting classes.
