Youth Rec Soccer League

Both leagues are organized by **Hutch Rec** in partnership with **Buhler Rec**, ensuring that families residing within the **Buhler Grade School boundaries** - whether attending public, private, or homeschool-can enjoy hometown benefits. By registering through Buhler Rec, we will strive to place your child on a team with neighbors and provide Buhler Rec teams with the opportunity to practice in town.

Lil Kickers: Lil Kickers is an introductory soccer league for youth ages 3-6 yrs old. Leagues are divided into two divisions: 3-4 yr olds and 5-6 yr olds.

Rec League: This is a recreation league for boys and girls ages 7-10 yr olds. Based on registration numbers, league divisions include: 7-8 yr olds and 9-10 yr olds.

- **Practices:** Practices will be held once a week in Buhler at Wheatland Park Soccer Field. Practice nights include Tuesdays, and Thursdays, with each team receiving one 1-hour practice slot per week. Practice nights will be assigned to coaches on a first-come, first-served basis. Practices will begin the week of March 16.
- **Games:** Games will be played on Saturdays, with each team participating in six games during April and May. All games will take place in Hutchinson.
 - **Game Weeks:** April 4 – May 9
 - **Registration Deadline:** March 1

A Word from Our Pastors

The violent entice their neighbors, and lead them in a way that is not good. PROVERB 16:29

Several years ago, my three sons and I excitedly headed to a KU basketball game in the hallowed Allen Fieldhouse. As the last seconds ticked away, the victory “Rock Chalk” chant started swelling when a brawl broke out. KU was dribbling out the clock and a K-State player stole the ball and headed to the basket for a last minute dunk. A KU player chased him down, blocked the shot, and stood over him in a taunting manner—and the fight was on!

As we walked back to our car, my sons and I reflected on what we just witnessed. I was appalled at their excitement about the fight. “There’s no way if someone comes into my face swinging, that I don’t swing back!” declared one of my sons, “that’s just normal—anybody would do that.”

Really?

We talked about how we can control our responses and how we might precondition ourselves for non-violent responses to tense emotional moments. We agreed that how we precondition ourselves before an event could help our instinctual responses. Can we train our first reactions? On the drive home, we listened to the post-game interview with KU coach Bill Self. Coach Self underscored the wisdom of Proverbs 16:29 of non-violent preconditioning: “What happened showed zero signs of toughness. It’s a sign of immaturity and selfishness... it’s no way for mature men to act.”

We live in a culture where people are socialized to react violently to being “dissed” or shamed (particularly in athletics). How will we precondition ourselves, families, and communities in ways where daily responses are defined by the wisdom of our faith and not aggression, violence, and dominance? What if the wisdom of today’s proverb was written from a positive perspective?

“The non-violent [gentle, merciful, constructive] entice their neighbors, and lead them in a way that is good.”
