

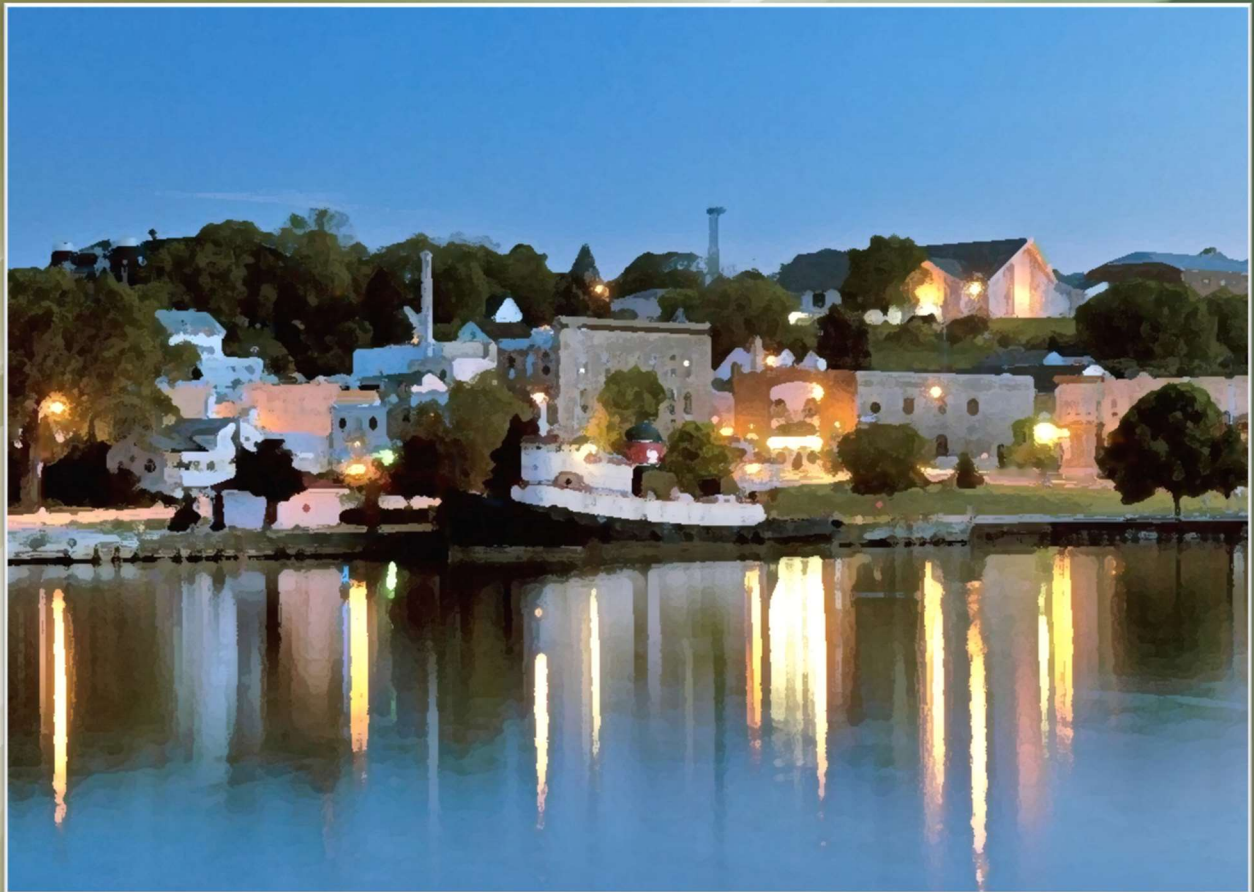

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Survey Overview

The City of Kewaunee is beginning the process of examining future needs for all-inclusive indoor community space(s) which could serve multiple functions. Driven by demographic changes, funding opportunities, and challenges with reduced or competing resources, the City feels this is an opportune time to initiate a more future-oriented conversation about area residents' vision for accommodating the diverse needs of the community. In general, this includes assessing needs for a senior center/senior meal site, a multi-use community center, a possible public library expansion, or other needs identified through the survey. This initial survey was conducted to broadly gauge general and specific needs of the community with the intent of utilizing the results to foster additional community discussions and project studies. The survey was developed with significant input from the appointed Ad Hoc Survey Development Committee, consisting of the following members:

Definition of Terms

This survey refers to a number of different facilities which can be defined as follows:

- **Senior Center:** Currently located in the basement of the Community Congregational Church (502 Center St.) the senior center connects older adults (60+) to vital community services that can help them stay healthy and independent. The facility serves meals M-F at 11:15 a.m. On Monday, card playing occurs from 1-4 p.m. and on Wednesdays, Bingo is held from 9 a.m.-12 p.m. Current needs have been identified as having a space which is more accessible, provides more opportunities for activities, as well as having more natural lighting.
- **Kewaunee Public Library:** Currently located at 822 Juneau Street, the Kewaunee Public Library provides quality materials and services which fulfill educational, informational, cultural, and recreational needs for the community in an atmosphere that is welcoming and respectful. Current needs have been identified as having: more parking (preferably off-street), study rooms, casual gathering and programming spaces (including addressing ADA accessibility issues), as well as additional technology improvements.
- **Multi-Use Community Center:** A public space designed to serve people of all ages, fostering interaction and connection across generations, and typically offering programs, activities, and services catering to diverse needs and interests. No such facility currently exists.

Survey Methods & Overall Response

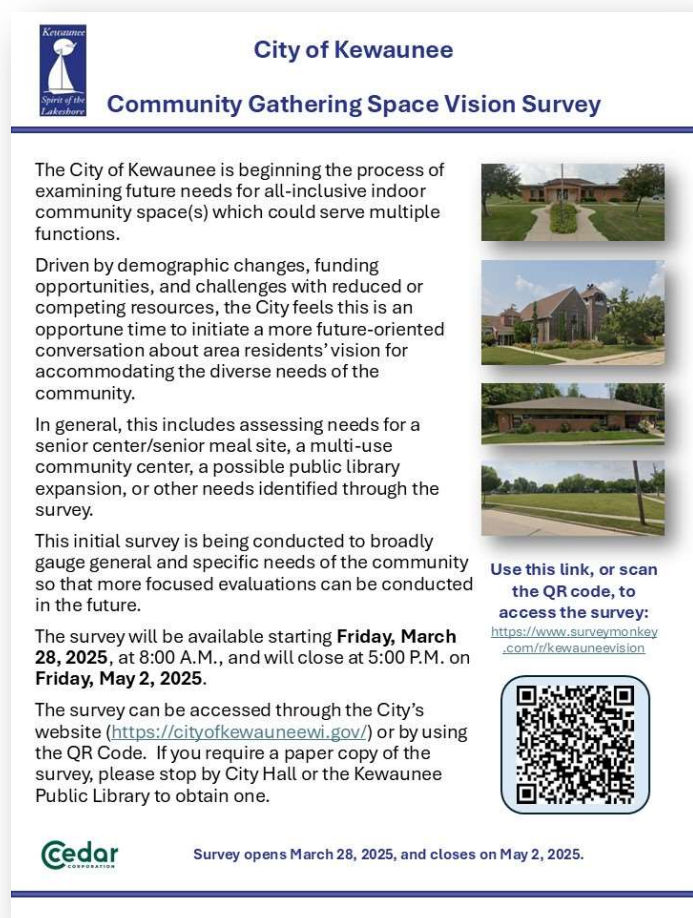
The survey contained a total of 25 questions and was put into an on-line format using Survey Monkey, linked directly from the homepage of the City's website. Promotional fliers with a QR Code (Figure 1) were distributed and regular postings to the City's social media pages were done to encourage participation. If needed, residents could pick up and fill out a paper copy of the survey at City Hall.

The survey was made available between Friday, March 28, 2025 and Friday, May 2, 2025, an approximate 5-week period. Overall, the survey garnered a total of 269 responses of which 224 were filled out on-line, and the remaining 45 were completed and submitted in a paper format. The information from the paper copies was subsequently added to the on-line results to create a single database of response information.

The 269 responses represents an overall 9.6% response rate when compared to the City's 2024 estimated population of 2,807 persons. Based on the size of the City only, at least 339 responses would have been needed to have statistically valid results (95% confidence interval with 5% margin of error). In this case one cannot claim the results are statistically valid, but this level of response for this type of survey is above average and likely comes close to representing the overall community's opinions.

For this reason, reliance solely on the survey results is not recommended for any decisions on this matter and it is suggested that follow up activities (community conversations, focus groups, etc.) be initiated to further flesh out details related to this potential project and how it best moves forward, if at all.

Summary of Responses

A general summary of the survey results, grouped by general topics and identified by the question numbers, is provided below. Detailed response information and a complete set of open-ended written comments are included in Appendix A. Also, due to the nature of the survey and its potential impact on seniors, data from those respondents 65 or Older has been separated and reviewed in the context of the overall survey results. Where appropriate, comparisons between these two data sets were described.

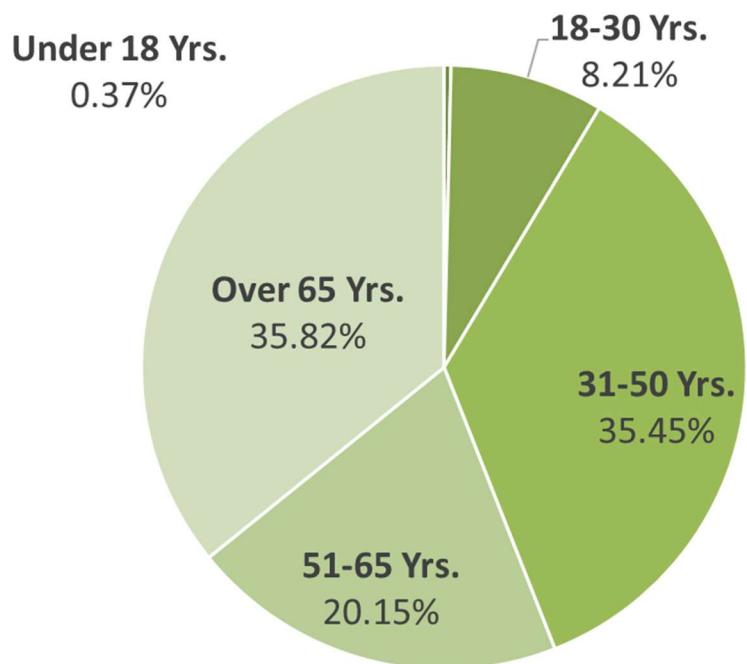
Demographics (Q1)

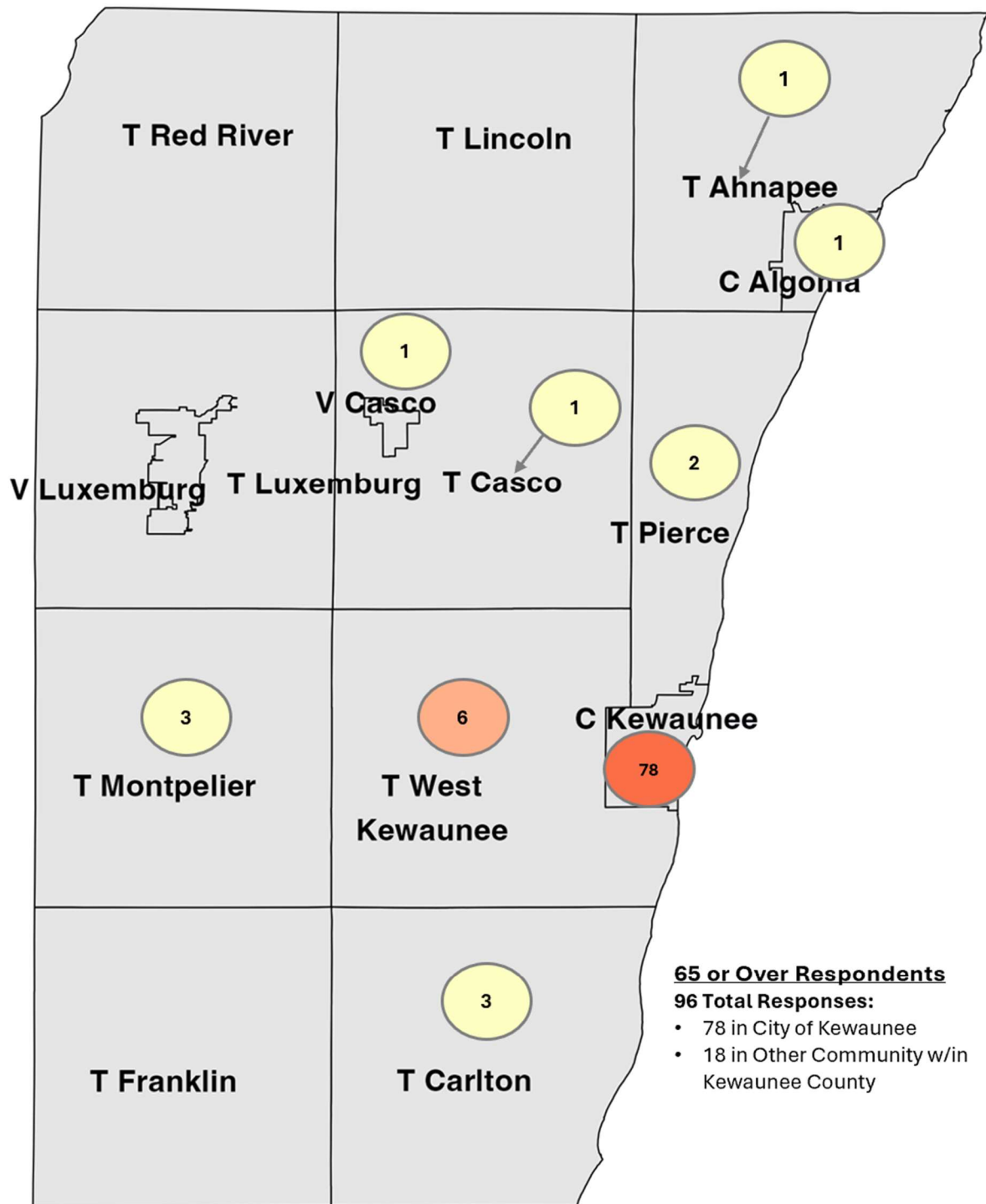
Figure 2: Age Distribution of Survey Respondents

- The largest group of respondents were in the 65 or Older age category (35.8%), with those in the 31-50 year-old category following a very close second at 35.5% (Figure 2).
- 20.2% of respondents were in the 51 to 65 year-old age category.
- 8.2% of respondents were in the 18-31 year-old age category.
- Only 0.4% of respondents (1 response) was from the Under 18 year-old age group. While the results are certainly underrepresented in this group, do note that 98 responses were received from households which had children less than 18 living at home.

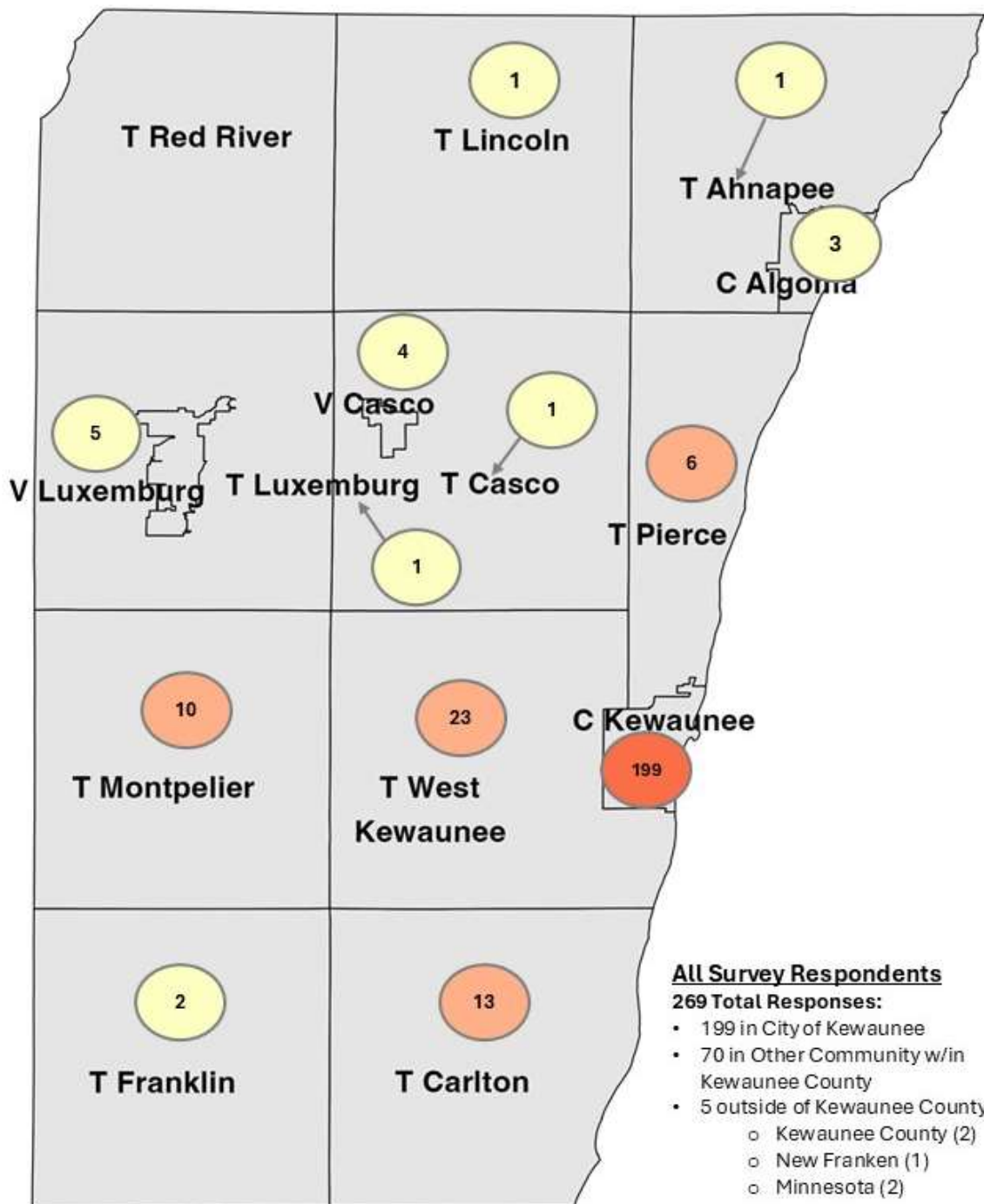
Location (Q2)

- 74% of all respondents were residents of the City of Kewaunee, while 25% lived outside of the City (but in Kewaunee County). 1.1% of respondents lived outside of Kewaunee County (Map 1).
- Of those respondents 65 or Older, 81.3% were residents of the City of Kewaunee, with the remaining 18.8% residing in another community within Kewaunee County (Map 2).
- Those respondents from outside of the County included places such as New Franken (Brown County), and Minneapolis (frequent visitor/future resident).

Household Composition (Q3-Q5)

- 37.5% of all respondents stated that they have children under the age of 18 residing in their home who would benefit from having additional indoor community space. Only 2% of respondents 65 or Older indicated the same.
- 44.5% of all respondents stated that they have middle-aged (19-64 years old) persons in their home who would benefit from additional indoor community space. 14% of respondents 65 or over indicated the same.
- 33.7% of all respondents indicated they have seniors (65 or Older) residing in their home who would benefit from additional indoor community space. 70.5% of respondents aged 65 or Older indicated the same.

Organization Involvement (Q6)

- A total of 262 responses were received from all respondents regarding which local organizations they are part of, or frequently attend meetings of. Table 1 contains a summary of the organizations (or broader organization type) which were mentioned in rank order. The most common response (36 mentions) was tied to a specific church or related group, with Friends of the Kewaunee Library coming in second with 18 mentions. Just over 150 (57%) of the mentions for this question were identified by those in the 65 and Older age group.

Organization Meeting Locations (Q7)

- A related question inquired as to the specific meeting location for the various groups mentioned. A total of 124 responses were given by all survey takers. In addition to the generalized mentions of private residences, local restaurants, and meeting virtually, 42 distinct facilities were identified as shown in Table 2.

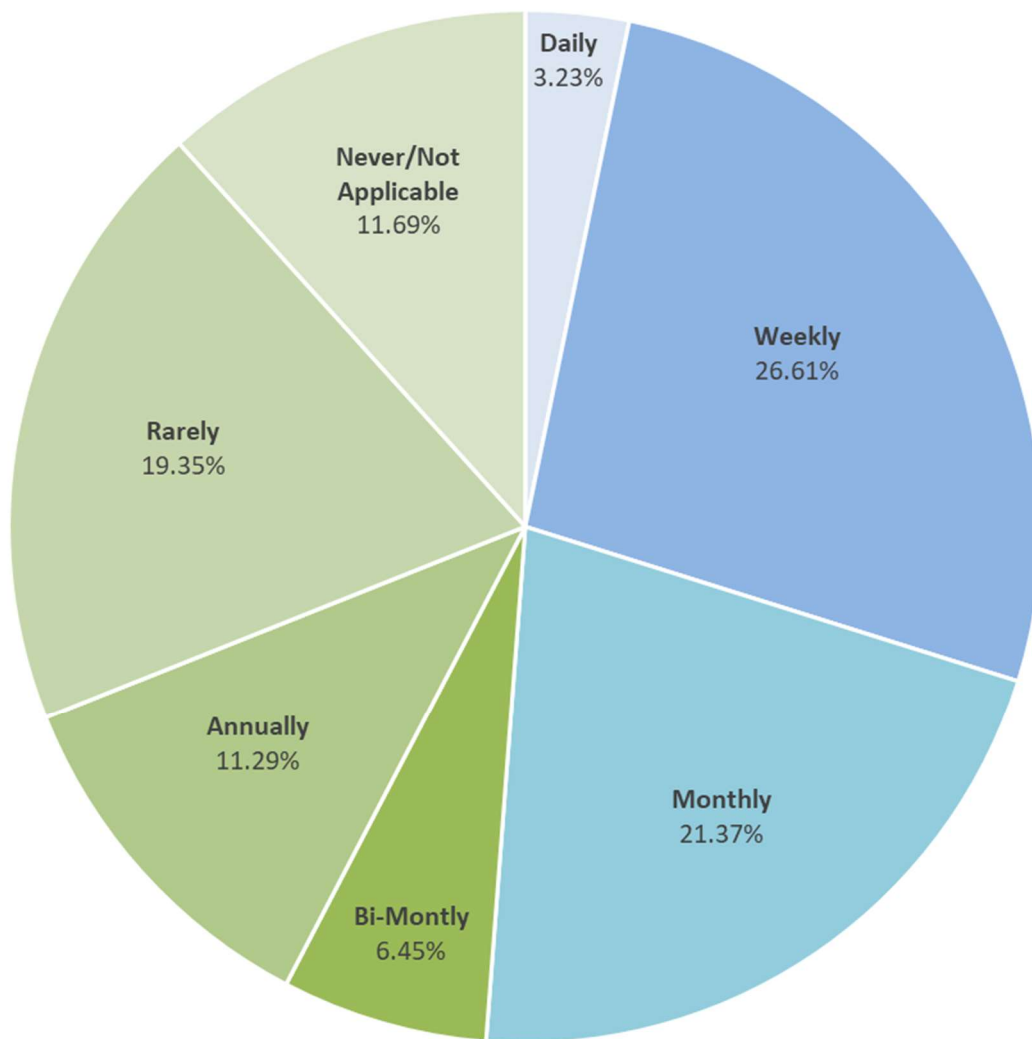

Use of Existing Facilities (Q8-Q9)

- When asked how often the respondent uses services offered to seniors at the **Community Congregational Church (Senior Center)**, an overwhelming majority (75%) said they never use the facility (or not applicable), citing a wide variety of reasons. The most common reasons for not using this facility included: age requirement (not a senior yet!), unaware of the facility, don't like the space, parking/access problems, limited offerings, and a preference for mixed-age environments. The next largest group was for the "rarely" category with 11.3% of responses. Only 10.9% of all respondents said they utilize the facility on a daily, weekly, or monthly basis.
- When evaluating responses to this question from the 65 or Older age group only, 48.9% of the 92 respondents stated they never use the **Senior Center** facility (or that it's not applicable). Within this age group, 27.2% (25 individuals) said they use this facility on a daily, weekly, or monthly basis.

- When asked how often the respondent uses services or facility at the **Kewaunee Public Library**, the results were more spread out. However, just over one-half (51.2%) of all respondents stated they used this facility or its services on a monthly or more frequent basis (Figure 3). Just Older 31% stated they rarely or never utilize the facility or its services. The most common reasons for not using this facility included: “no need” (i.e., utilization of other information sources such as the internet), lack of materials, use of other libraries, lack of time available, and activities not appropriate for the age of their children.

- When evaluating responses to this question from the 65 or Older age group, the results were similar, with 46.2% stating they use the **Kewaunee Public Library** facility on a daily, weekly, or monthly basis. 31% stated they rarely or never utilize the facility or its services. The most common reasons for not using this facility included: “no need” (i.e., utilization of other information sources such as the internet) and the use of other libraries.

Current Programming (Q10-Q11)

- When asked if the City provides sufficient program for various age groups, the survey results for all respondents was quite telling. Within each age category, a resounding “No” was indicated and ranged from 59.8% (Seniors) on the low end, to a high of 81.3% (teens). Young Children came in at 66.4% while both Adults and Families had “No” responses near 75% each. When reviewing this question’s results from just the 65 and Older age group, deficiencies (“No” responses) were also indicated across all age groups, but with slight differences. The Senior age group showed a 10-point increase with 69.1% responding “No”. Teens came in at only 72.7%, Young Children at 59%, and both the Adults and Families categories had “No” responses in the 71-72% range.
- Survey participants were then asked if sufficient programming was occurring in several general areas, regardless of age group. For all survey participants, a majority of the responses were “No” for each of the three areas as follows: Indoor Recreation (81.4%), Outdoor Recreation (58.7%), and Education (56.5%). In reviewing these results for just the 65 and Older age group, a similar pattern existed, with all three areas having a majority “No” response: Indoor Recreation (75.6% - somewhat lower), Outdoor Recreation (59.5% - similar), and Education (72.5% - substantially higher).

Facility Improvement Needs (Q12-Q14)

- Participants were asked to rate the two existing facilities (Senior Center and Kewaunee Public Library) based on the general amount of improvements needed to keep them functioning into the future. For all survey results, the **Senior Center** had the most responses in the “Needs Complete Renovation” category (50%), with “Needs Minor Improvements” coming in second with 25.3%. The **Kewaunee Public Library** had the most responses (35.8%) in the “Needs Expansion” category, although “Needs Minor Improvements” came in second at 31.2%. When reviewing just the 65 and Older age category responses, the results show a 20-point increase (70%) in the “Needs Complete Renovation” responses for the **Senior Center**, while the ratings for the **Kewaunee Public Library** are very similar to the whole set of responses.
- 74.5% of all respondents did not feel there were any issues (or just not being applicable) in accessing the **Senior Center**. Building Parking was the most noted issue with 18.5% of the response for all participants. When reviewing just the responses from the 65 or Older age-group, the “No Issues” rating dropped by nearly 20 points to 55%. Of this population sub-set, the largest issues were Building Parking (33.8%), Facility Location (25%), and Bathroom Access (20%).

- A similar question for the **Kewaunee Public Library** had slightly different results with the overall satisfaction (No issues/Not Applicable) being in the range of 59.5% (all responses) to 64.3% (only 65 and Older responses). Individual access issues were similar across both sets of results with the largest issues noted as Building Parking (32% and 33% respectively) and Hours of Operation (14.4% and 6.0% respectively). The 65 and Older age group responses did have 10.7% of respondents stating there were issues with Bathroom Access, however; some of the survey-takers may not be aware of the recent bathroom upgrades done in 2024.

Comparable Facilities (Q15-Q16)

- 41% of all responses (and only 34.6% of the 65 and Older responses) thought there were sufficient existing private or non-profit spaces which exist to cover all event/meeting/function needs within the City.
- When prompted to select various existing facilities which are utilized for gathering, the top five facilities for all survey takers were: Bruemmer Park (78.5%), Lakehaven Hall (58.4%), Fitness Center (42.9%), Winter Park (38.2%), and Selner Park/Beach (37.8%). Responses for the 65 and Older age-group had slightly different results with their top five facilities being: Bruemmer Park (65.1%), Selner Park/Beach (34.9%), Winter Park (23.3%), Ryan Park/Father Marquette Park (tied with 12.8%), and City Hall (10.5%). Several written comments were noted by all survey takers regarding other facilities utilized for gatherings, including: Clock Corner, Vintage Brick, Wildflower Supper Club, Uptown, Miller Street Park, Riverview ATV Park, and Harbor Park.

New Facility Support (Q17-Q22)

- Just over 52% of all survey takers “Strongly Agreed” that area residents would benefit from a re-imagined, all-inclusive facility which serves as a Multi-Use Community Center. An additional 26.9% of respondents “Agreed”. Only 15.1% of all respondents “Disagree” or “Strongly Disagree”. The results from just the 65 and Older age group mirror the results from all survey-takers. Some of the reasons given for those that “Strongly Disagree” include: waste of tax dollars which should go to roads and other needs; lack of benefit vs. cost; lack of income generation from such a facility; adequate spaces exist already and should be repaired, and; the thought that no place could do it all.
- When asked if support would be given to combine the Kewaunee Public Library and Senior Center into a single all-inclusive Multi-Use Community Center, a majority of respondents (60.8%) either “Agreed” or “Strongly Agreed”. A stronger 77.9% of the 65 and Older age group responded in the same manner.

- Survey participants were then asked if they, or someone they knew, would use a new Multi-Use Community Center for a variety of individual functions. All applicable functions could be marked. For all survey takers, every function listed did get some votes (the least being Child Day Care at 16% of responses), however; the top five functions selected were: Arts & Crafts Classes (65%), Indoor Market/Craft Market (61.2%), Education/History Talks (58.9%), Exercise Classes (58.4%), and Senior Programs/Education (53.6%). The top five responses from just the 65 and Older age-group were: Senior Programs (74.1%), Education/History Talks (66.7%), Senior Meals (59.3%), Daytrips/Tours (53.1%), and Indoor Market/Craft Market (50.6%).
- When asked how often they would use a new Multi-Use Community Center, 42.5% of all survey respondents said “Weekly”, with an additional 18.9% stating “Monthly”. 17.7% stated they would “Rarely” or “Never” use such a facility. For the 65 and Older population, 49.4% would use it “Weekly” with an additional 12.4% stating “Monthly”. This age group had 18% who would “Rarely” or “Never” use such a facility.
- 35.6% of all respondents stated they would “Strongly Agree” with investing tax dollars into a new, centralized, all-inclusive Multi-Use Community Center. An additional 28.1% of respondents “Agree”, while 21.2% chose “Disagree” or “Strongly Disagree”. For the 65 and Older age-group, 42.2% “Strongly Agree”, with another 28.9% stating they “Agree”. Only 16.7% of this age-group chose to “Disagree” or “Strongly Disagree”. In addition, 37 comments were provided regarding why the “Strongly Disagree” choice was made and includes such concerns as: There is no need for such a facility; the library and senior center should be in separate facilities; the need to raise taxes, and; other infrastructure priorities.
- Over 78% of all respondents, and over 74% of 65 and Older respondents, stated they would be willing to pay rental fees to use a new publicly-owned, centralized facility for private events.

New Facility Location (Q23)

- Only 121 respondents (45% of all respondents) answered the question about thoughts or preferences for the potential location of a new facility as described previously. Some respondents mentioned multiple sites and therefore, a total of 126 separate suggestions were submitted and assessed. Of these, 104 of the suggestions were for (or against) a very specific site. The other 22 suggestions were general in nature or offered somewhat unrelated thoughts. The most common specific locations are shown below along with the total number of mentions, as well as the percent of mentions. These sites, along with other generalized areas, are shown on Map 3.

Additional Comments (Q24)

The last open-ended question simply asked respondents for their general or specific thoughts, opinions, or ideas which hadn't been expressed through previous responses. A total of 84 comments were received, of which 33 (39%) were from respondents in the 65 and Older age-group. These comments were reviewed and organized by broad topic as shown in Table 3.

Due to privacy reasons, this information has not been included in the report appendices, but has been provided to the Ad Hoc Committee for this project.

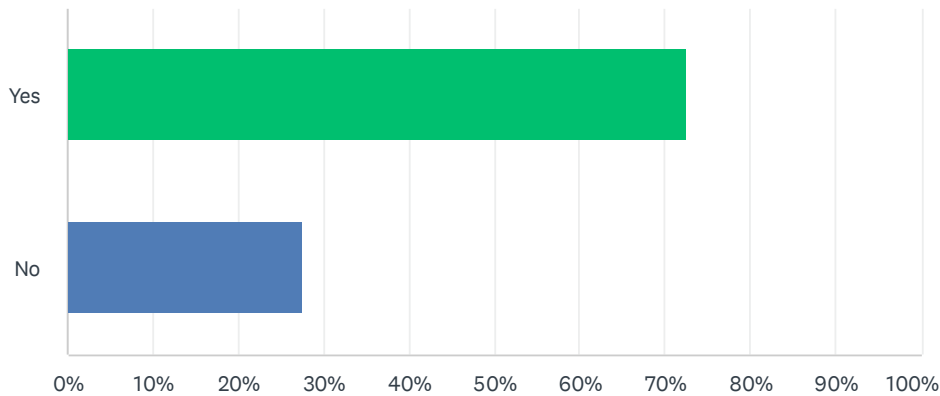

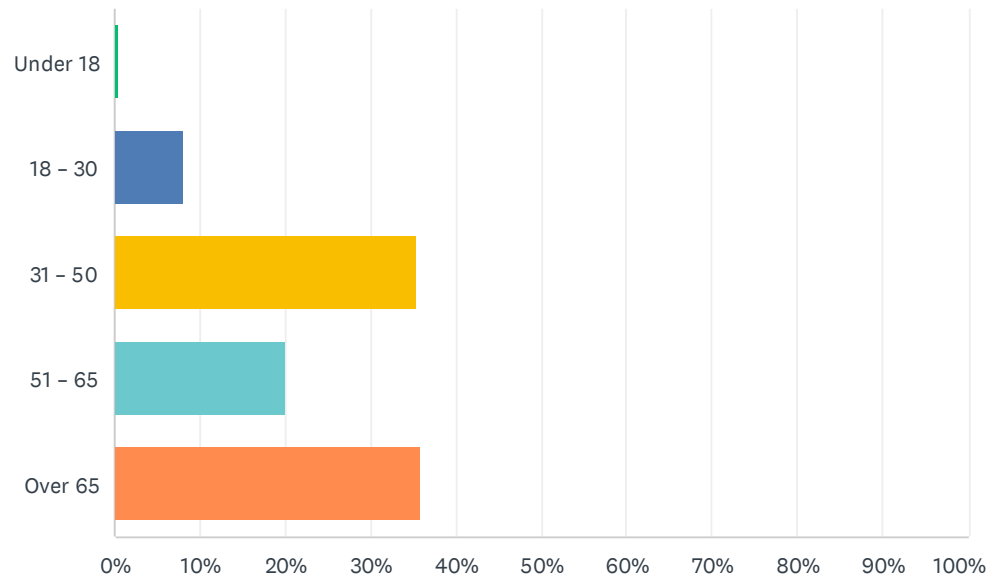

Q2 What is your age group?

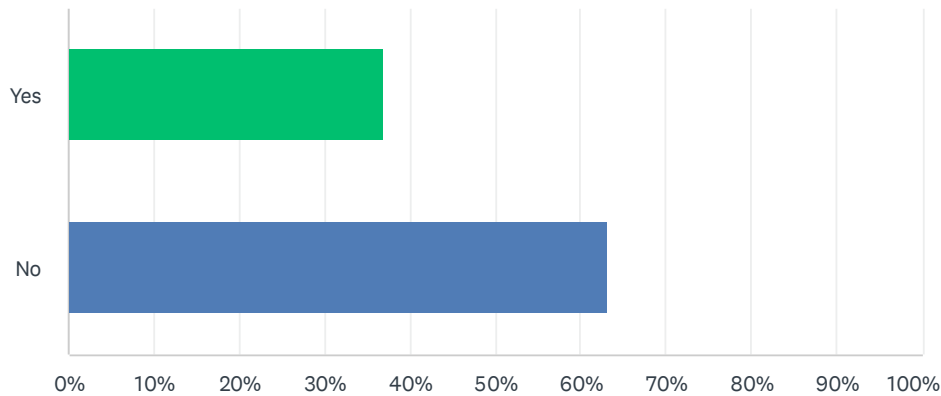

Q3 Do you have children (<18 yrs. old) residing in your home who would benefit from having additional indoor community space?

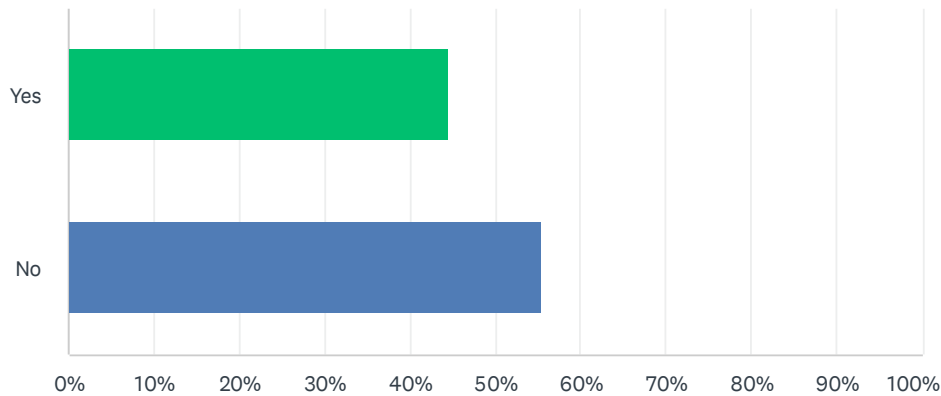

Q4 Do you have middle-aged (19-64 yrs. old) persons in your home who would benefit from having additional indoor community space?

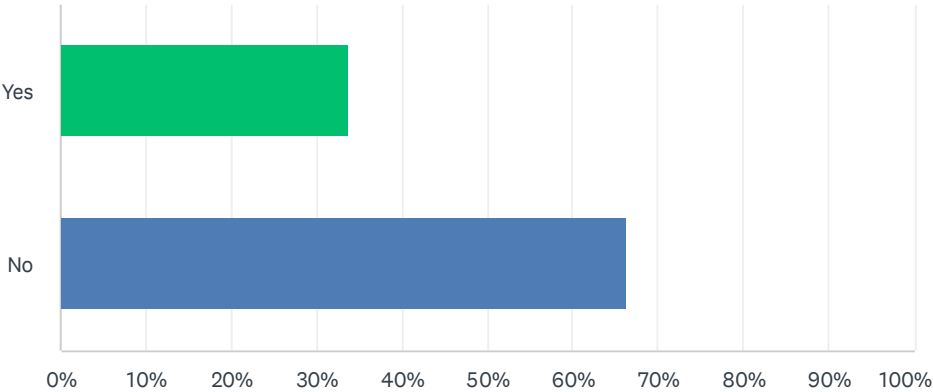

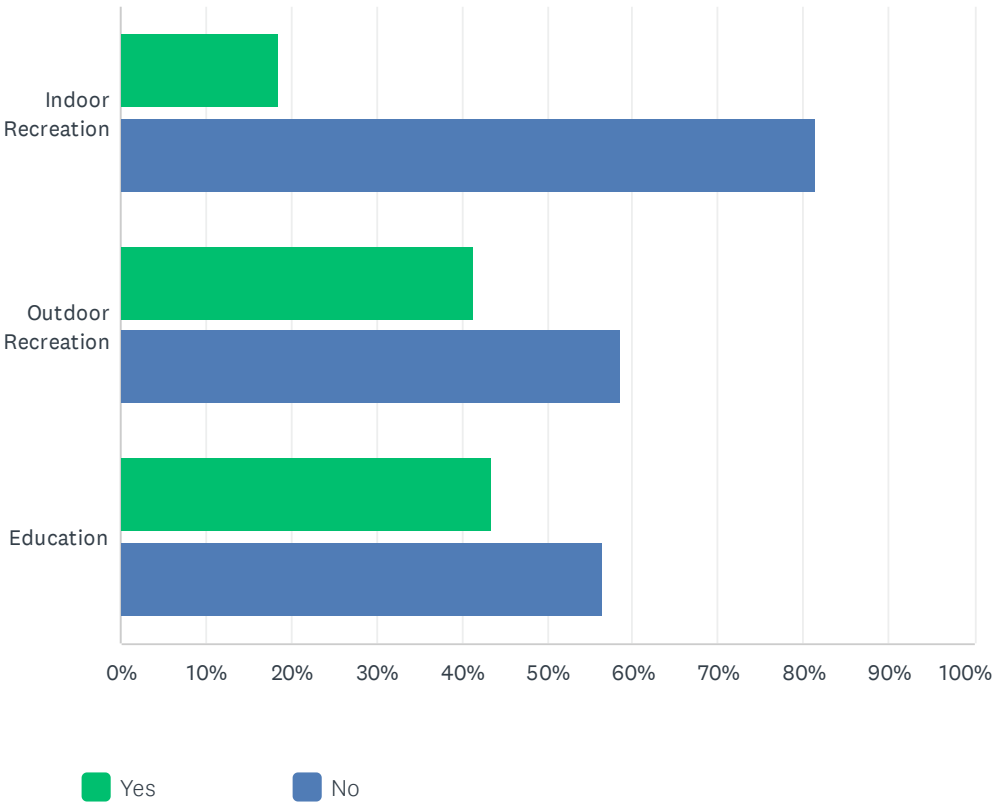

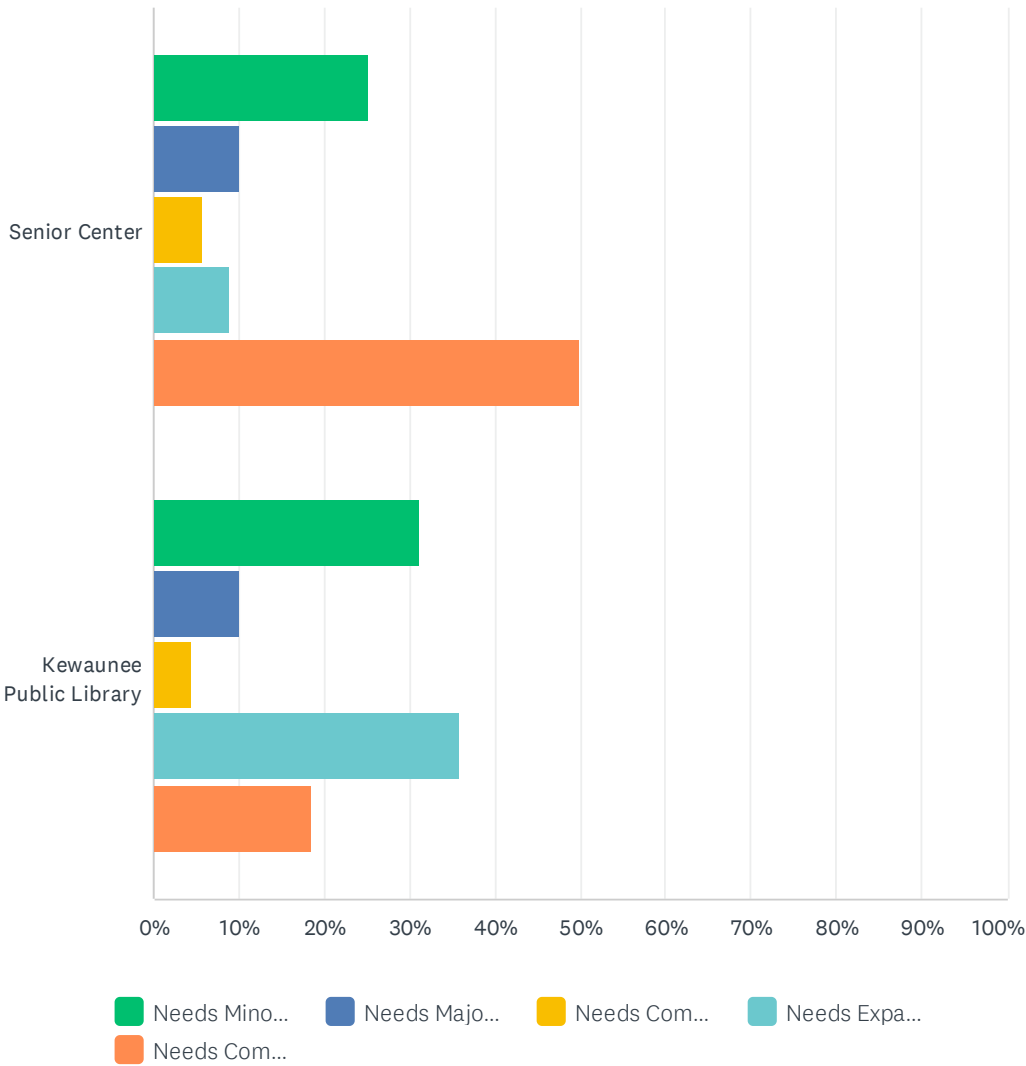

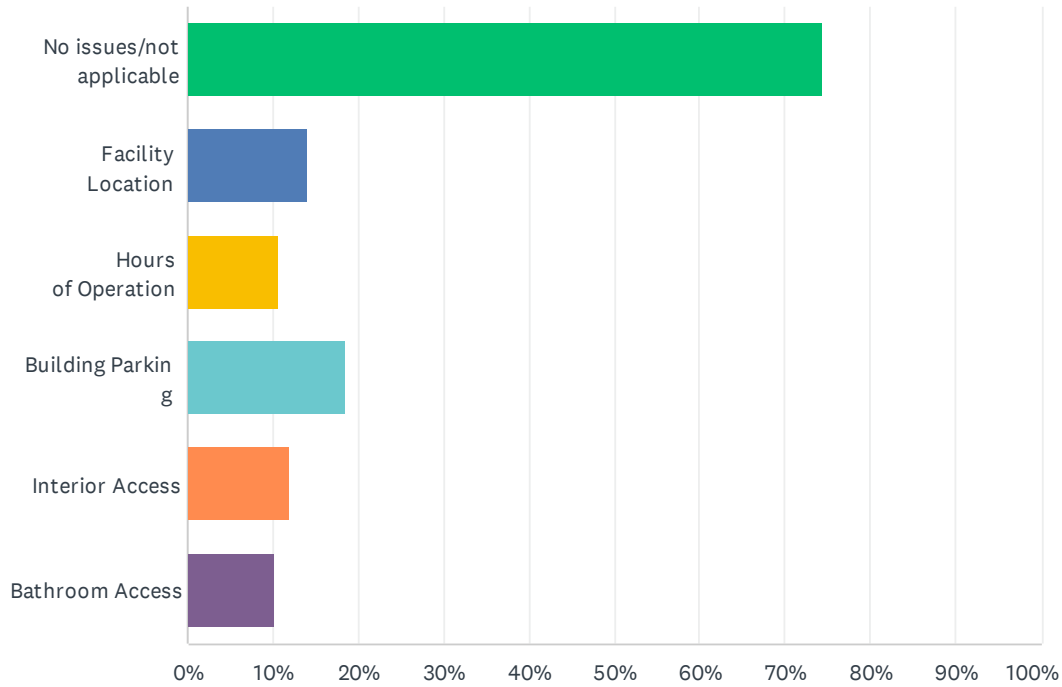

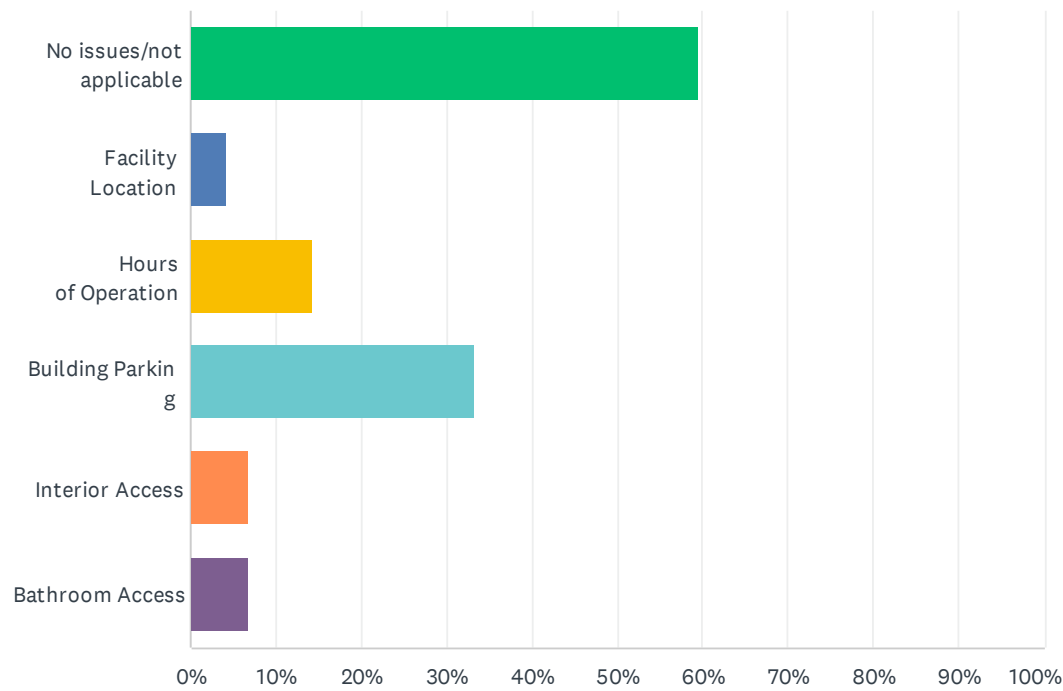

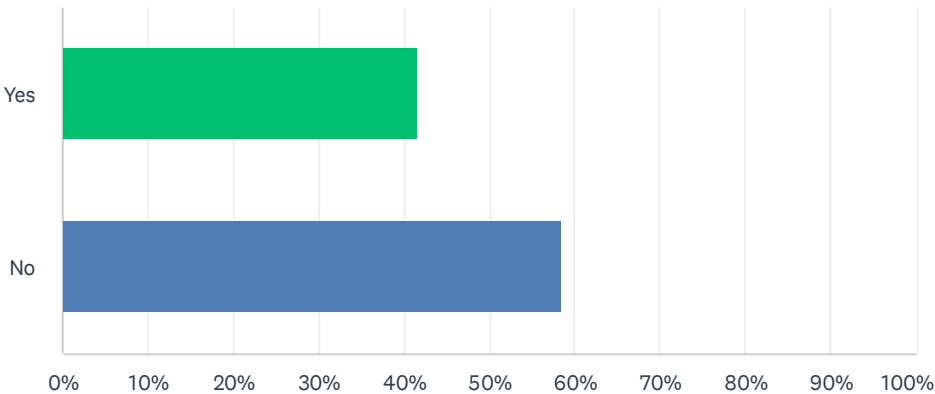

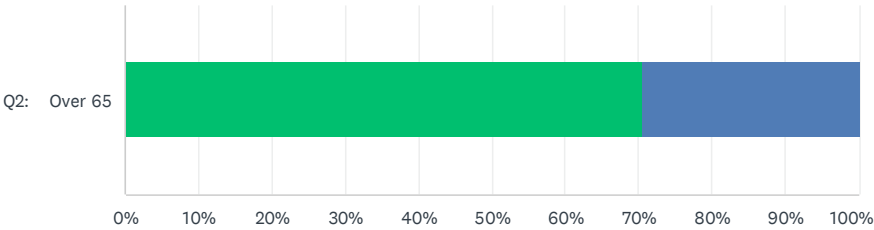

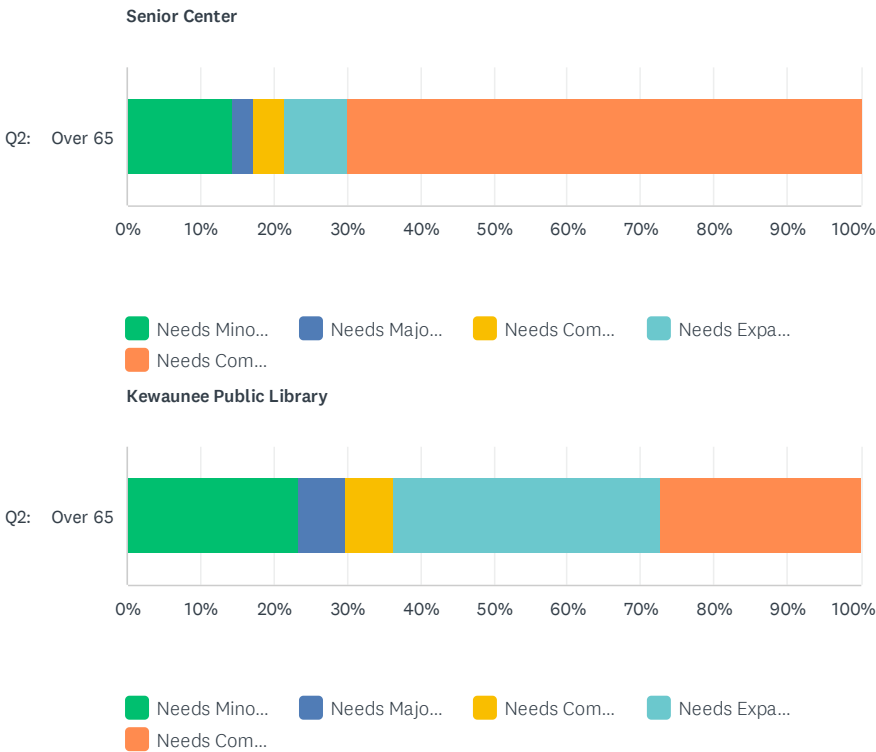

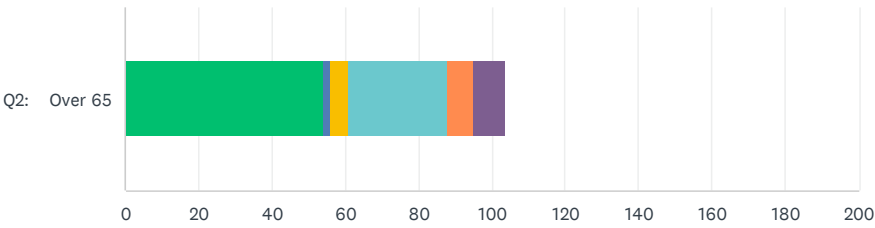
