IMPORTANT REMINDER:

Residents interested in participating in the 2023 Clean-Up Day should bring their debris to Mazza Recycling located at 3230 Shafto Road, Tinton Falls, NJ 07753. **Any questions, please call the Department of Public Works at 732-462-7998. Please do not call Mazza Recycling.**

The Colts Neck Recycling Convenience Center Days & Hours:

Monday, Wednesday & Friday – 8:00 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.; Closed Tuesdays & Thursdays April 1st through November 4th, the Center is open Saturdays 8:00 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Once again Mazza Recycling has informed Colts Neck Township that No Commercial vehicle license plates or Commercial markings allowed as per NJDEP A-901 Regulations.

DO NOT GO TO THE TOWNSHIP PUBLIC WORKS YARD!

This event is open to Colts Neck residents only. Therefore, be sure to have your driver license with you and be prepared to present it upon entering. **NOTE: This is not an event for commercial businesses**.

The following items may be disposed of:

- 1. Batteries (NO HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES).
- 2. Lawn mowers, trimmers, etc. (Gasoline and oil must be removed from power equipment or it will NOT be accepted.).
- 3. Appliances (Washing machines, dryers, etc.).
- 4. Metal Items.
- 5. Household Items carpets, furniture, etc.
- 6. Building Materials/Lumber/Wood Pallets.
- 7. Concrete/Masonry.
- 8. Electronics.
- 9. Empty Propane Tanks with valve open.

For ease in disposal at Mazza Recycling, please pack your vehicle electronics first, then metal, then concrete and then any remaining items.

NOTE: No hazardous material of any kind will be accepted. This includes chemicals, fertilizer, paints, pesticides, herbicides, creosote, oil, and gasoline. An inspector may be on location to ensure compliance with this stipulation.

IMPORTANT NOTE ABOUT TIRES: Tires may **NOT** be brought to Mazza Recycling. You may dispose of up to eight (8) car tires (18" or less without rims) at the Monmouth County Reclamation Center on Asbury Avenue in Tinton Falls. A small fee will be charged. Call 732-683-8686 for more information.

<u>SENIORS</u>: Starting May 8th, the Township will assist seniors (62 or older) and residents with disabilities by collecting their debris curbside and transporting it to Mazza Recycling. All residents must provide proof of age or disability to the Public Works Department located at 231 Route 34, (GPS: Public Works Way) or email to: dpw@coltsneck.org. Qualified residents MUST schedule a pick-up in advance by calling Department of Public Works at 732-462-7998 between April 10th and May 4th. Requests for pick-up after 3:00 pm on May 4th will NOT be accepted. Eligibility for this service will be made on a case-by-case basis. Residents deemed eligible should place their items at the end of their driveway, to the left or right, on the curb line. Please note that Public Works can collect all items listed on the previous page EXCEPT #6 – Building Materials/Lumber/Wood Pallets and #7 – Concrete/Masonry. Should you need to dispose of these items, you must make alternate arrangements.

- 1. Batteries (Except household batteries).
- 2. Metal Items (bicycles, lawn mowers, trimmers, etc. (Be sure gasoline and oil are removed from any motorized items otherwise it will NOT be accepted.).
- 3. Appliances (Washers, dryers, etc.).
- 4. Metal Items.
- 5. Household Items (carpet, furniture, etc.).
- 6. Building Materials/Wood Pallets.
- 7. Concrete/Masonry.
- 8. Electronics.
- 9. Empty Propane Tanks with valve open.

NO, NO, NO!!



- 1. **NO COMMERCIAL BUSINESSES**. This is for Colts Neck residents only.
- 2. No non-residents of Colts Neck.
- 3. No commercial business items.
- 4. No commercial vehicle license plates or commercial markings allowed as per NJDEP A-901 Regulations.
- 5. No trailers over 3 cubic yards.
- 6. No vehicles over 7,200 lbs. (pick-ups and small vans acceptable).
- 7. No vegetative waste (leaves, stumps, branches, etc.).
- 8. No animal waste.
- 9. **NO HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS** (chemicals, pesticides, herbicides, gasoline, oil, creosote, paints, etc.).
- 10. No recyclables (glass, cans, newspapers or cardboard).
- 11. **NO TIRES** Tires may be disposed of at the Monmouth County Reclamation Center. For information call: 732-683-8686.

2023 BRUSH COLLECTION GUIDELINES AND SCHEDULE

- Only brush up to four (4) inches in diameter and no longer than eight (8) feet in length will be collected.
- Brush mixed with foreign materials such as: bamboo, stumps, roots, leaves, grass, lumber or oversized material will not be collected.
- This service is for tree and shrub prunings only. This is NOT a land clearing or tree removal service.
- No more than 20 cubic yards of brush (approximately five feet high, eight feet in width and fourteen feet in length) may be placed per property for each scheduled collection.
- Brush must be placed in front of your dwelling at the curb line or edge of payment and should not extend onto the paved portion of the street further than three (3) feet and should not impede traffic or create a safety hazard.
- Brush placed at the curb line or edge of pavement shall be no closer than ten (10) feet from any storm drain inlet or stream.
- Brush must not be placed beside poles, bushes, mailboxes, etc. If the brush is not accessible by the collection machinery, it will not be picked up.
- Brush may be placed at the curb **no more than fourteen (14) days prior** to the scheduled collection date and no later than the day before the first collection date of the week.
- There will be only one pick up in your area during your schedule week.
- No collection for the months of June, July and August. Brush collection will resume in September & October.

ZONE 3	WEEK OF (1	1/6, 12/4/2023)
ZONE 4	WEEK OF: (1	1/13, 12/11/2023)

NOTE: The Township will be offering a **FINAL LEAF COLLECTION** for **ALL** zones December 8 through December 20 subject to weather conditions. Starting **November 1**ST, residents in need of this final collection **MUST** request the collection by contacting the Department of Public Works at 732-462-7998, by 3:00 pm., December 8, 2023. Please be advised we will not be accepting calls after that date and time for any additional pick up. Leaves must be out by December 8th. If you do not call, you will not receive this final collection and will be required to remove the leaves from the curb.

LEAVES SHOULD BE PLACED AT THE CURB <u>NO SOONER THAN</u> THE <u>TWO WEEKS BEFORE</u>
THE START OF THE COLLECTION WEEK AND <u>NO LATER THAN</u> THE <u>DAY BEFORE</u> THE START
OF THE COLLECTION WEEK.

LEAVES PUT OUT AFTER THIS TIME PERIOD <u>WILL NOT BE COLLECTED</u> AND IT WILL BE THE PROPERTY OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO REMOVE THE LEAVES FROM THE CURB.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- ONLY LEAVES shall be placed along the side of the road for collection. Leaf vacuum machines can only pick up loose leaves.
- Leaves shall not be in bags or mixed with any other debris such as grass, limbs, brush, tree stumps, roots, lumber, branches or twigs. Bagged leaves or piles with leaves mixed with other materials will <u>NOT</u> be collected and will be the property owner's responsibility to remove from the curb.
- Leaves must be placed at the curb line or edge of the pavement in a neat, loose row and shall not extend onto the portion of the street further than three feet.
- Leaf placement shall not impede traffic or create a safety hazard.
- All leaves placed along the side of the road for collection shall be no closer than ten feet from any storm drain, inlet or stream.
- Property owners are responsible for notify their landscapers of the Township's leaf collection schedule and rules.
