U-Visa & T-Visa Information

It is the policy of the Colts Neck Township Police Department to interact with the immigrant community in compliance with *New Jersey Attorney General Directive* **2018-6**.

This department's responsibilities are limited to certifying that an alien, who is or was the victim of a qualifying crime in the Township of Colts Neck, is, has, or will cooperate with the investigation and/or prosecution of such crime.

The following details the policy of the Colts Neck Township Police Department, regarding U & T Visa Applications:

Aliens or their representatives seeking certification for a U Visa or the Monmouth County Prosecutor's Office shall be referred to the detective bureau. The assigned detective will cause an inquiry into the matter to determine if the alien has been:

- 1. A victim of a qualifying crime under the jurisdiction of this department; and
- 2. Has specific knowledge and details of crime; and
- 3. Has been, is being, or is likely to be helpful to law enforcement in the detection, investigation, or prosecution of the qualifying crime.

Aliens or their representatives seeking certification for crimes occurring outside the jurisdiction of this agency shall be referred to the local jurisdiction or the county prosecutor's office in which the crime occurred.

Upon determining that the alien has satisfied the above requirements, the detective shall execute <u>Form I-918</u>, <u>Supplement B, U Nonimmigrant Status Certification</u>.
