- 12 responsible for their own cans and that the Town does not need to provide them. Lauren asked how
- they would be able to keep track of how many cans people have for billing purposes. They discussed
- 14 whether or not they want to purchase cans from Lewiston and being the middle man. Fisher also
- 15 commented that they should make sure they are getting cans that will meet the requirements for
- 16 pickup. Mayor Leak said that he will talk to Mayor Hall again and get it figured out.
- 18 Lauren reported that the Utah Trust does a cyber scan every month and this month's scan came back as
- 19 a high threat. She asked who she would need to talk to. Creech asked if it is the website or the network.
- 20 Lauren did not know. Mayor Leak asked if she could forward the email so they could see what the

- 32 Steve Leichty - Rocky Mountain Power Franchise Agreement - Steve explained that he is here to answer 33 any questions about renewing the franchise agreement that will be expiring this year. Creech asked 34 where the easement is. Steve explained that it is along the roads and is usually only used when there is a 35 new service being put in. Creech clarified that it was just for Cornish roads. Steve said that it was and 36 that they have separate agreements with the County and UDOT. He mentioned that if the Town expands 37 a road and there is a pole or something in the way Rocky Mountain will move it without charge. Mayor 38 Leak mentioned the wellhouse project that they had to pay to move the services. Creech asked what 39 would happen if the Town does not sign the agreement. Steve said that they would have to find other 40 ways to get the right of way to provide services.
- Steve said that there is a sales and use tax that can be collected and be used for payment for the
  easement. He said that they can collect up to 6 percent and about 40 percent of communities in Cache
  valley use it. Forsgren asked if that is something that can be adjusted. Steve said that it is. Mayor Leak
  asked if the Town has it already. Steve said that Cornish does not currently collect that tax.
- Creech asked if they do not do the agreement if Rocky Mountain would have to find another way to get the right of way to do work. Steve said that was correct. Buxton asked what other cities and towns use the tax revenue for. Steve said he thinks it goes into the general fund. Creech who else would be interested in agreements like this one. Steve said that any communications or utility services would use an agreement similar to the one he is presenting.
  - Steve said that he is only here to present the option to the council and that a decision does not need to be made today. He said that he needs to know before November. He suggested having the Town's legal people review it. Mayor Leak said that the council will talk about it and get it back to him. He asked who he would need to give it back to once they decided. Creech asked if Steve could send more information about the tax. Mayor Leak asked Lauren to put this discussion on the agenda for the next meeting. Steve explained that with a well house there are incentives that can help with savings. Mayor Leak asked him to send that information as well. Forsgren talked about the possibility of doing a solar farm on his property. Steve said that there are ways that he could sell the extra power to Rocky Mountain Power.

Annexation Discussion - Creech explained that he has been looking for information on annexation. He was able to get an email from Angie from the county that explains the process of doing an annexation. He went through the email and explained the process. He read some of the questions that he asked Angie. One of the questions he asked is if they needed an attorney. She said that the town should use a legal advisor to make sure that everything is being done by state code. He asked about the cost of the annexation process. Angie said that there are costs for a surveyor and possibly a consultant. She said that the resident annexing into the Town would pay the cost for surveying their property. She also mentioned a \$750 fee from the county. They did not know if that fee was per parcel or for each annexation. Creech asked about the tax implications. Angie gave him resources where he could go to

calculate that. He also asked about taking over county roads. They think that because the County does not have any property out here and because they do not do much to maintain them they most likely would not have a problem giving the roads to Cornish. Creech also asked what it would look like to annex from other municipalities. Angie does not work with those types of annexations but that they do happen. Creech asked about annexing partial lots. Angie answered that there are a lot of complications when that happens.

Creech said that they should look into starting this process. He said that initially it would not cost
anything, and they would be able to see who would be interested in it as well as the value for the
potential residents and the Town. If not, then they can drop it. Fisher asked why they would want to go
through this. He asked if there was anyone who had asked about being annexed into the town. He said
that the last annexation wasn't handled well.

Creech pulled up a map with the current town boundaries. He showed what areas he thinks could be annexed into the town. Fisher asked who has requested to be annexed in. Creech said that Susan Law made the request. Mayor Leak asked what the McKnight's think about it. Creech said that he had not talked to them yet. He said that he is very interested to find out what people think. Mayor Leak asked how many people would be affected. Creech said that it would affect 8 homes, 6 of those homes are connected to the Town water system.

Mayor Leak said that it would make the properties more valuable. Dale Buxton asked why Mayor Leak thinks that property value would go up. Mayor Leak said that one of the big things that would have a big impact would be the ability to hook up to the town water. Dale commented that he does not have a lot of incentives to go through the process. He mentioned that he had talked to someone about annexing into the Town a few years ago and that the noticing and other things that are part of the process could cost up to \$1000. He asked if the Town initiates the annexation if they would take on all the costs. Mayor Leak said that he didn't know and that that would be something the council would need to discuss. Dale asked about the \$750 fee from the County and that if that fee is per parcel, it would be cost prohibitive. Fosrgren said that if it is not per parcel, it would be a great way to annex in a large amount of property for not very much money. Dale said that they should have a clear idea of why they want to take on this process. Creech said that they will most likely not know their why until they have completed the first part of the process, and that at the end of it they could decide that it would be a terrible idea to continue with the annexations. Mayor Leak commented that he likes the idea because it is forward thinking, and it could save time and money in the long run. Forsgren commented that because Dale is on a peninsula the County could force him to annex eventually. Dale asked if there was a possibility of the Town cutting his water off because he is out of Town limits. Mayor Leak said that as long as he is Mayor that would not happen, but you never know what the next mayor could do. Forsgren also said that the State could force them to cut them off as well because they are not in Town limits. Dale said that it would be interesting to see what the cost and benefit would be for each home. Mayor Leak said that they could explore that and share what they learn.

Fisher said that he went and tested the water at the houses around the Wrights and it all came back clean. He said that Bear River had also done a test not long ago and it came back clean.

- 117 Mayor Leak said that they had a problem with the SCADA system and the tank was almost emptied. 118 They got it fixed quickly. Fisher said that they need to figure out how to get the springs back into the
- system to help with the supply.

Creech commented that there was a leak at the Retreat. They didn't think that the water was supposed to be turned on. Lauren said that they had contacted her and wanted the water turned on.

## Old Business:

Mayor's Report: Mayor Leak stated that he got the paperwork finished with the Wangsgard property. He explained that there are wiring instructions for the payments and asked if Lauren could wire it. Fisher said that they should make sure the water hook ups that are being traded for the property stays in Cornish Town limits. Mayor Leak said that all the hookups will be in the Town limits. He said that Ross is not going to get one for his house. He talked to Ross about the drain going to the West Cache Canal and Ross wants to put it in himself. Mayor Leak said he did not look a the plans closely enough to know who would be responsible for doing that.

Mayor Leak said that he has not been able to make any progress with the Koller's property.

Mayor Leak said that he has gotten several texts and calls about the alley looking like a dump. He said that there is not much that the Town can do about it. He said that he asked the person complaining what they suggested. They didn't have any suggestions. Mayor Leak said that because it is zoned differently they could make some changes to clean it up. The problem is enforcing it. Creech said that there are a few things that they could change in the code such as on street parking, RV parking and animals. He again said that the problem is enforcing it. Buxton asked if they could impose fees. Creech said they could. Mayor Leak read part of the text he received from the citizen. Creech commented that there are already rules in the town code and that where they are parking is already in the town right of way because the houses are so close to the road. Creech asked if he had heard from more than the one person. Mayor Leak said he had not heard from anyone else. They talked about how they handled the parking on the street with the snowplow. Mayor Leak said that they will think about it. He said that part

- of their job is to help make the Town a better place, but that it is not reasonable to make new
- ordinances for one person. They talked about the animal problem on the alley.
