Officer advised she check with an advocacy outlet to calm her fears and get her protection. RP did contact someone and a report was filed, and KOPS alert was issued for the subject.

Suspicious Activity - Curfew Violation	2021-07-11	An officer on routine patrol observed 4 juvenile males running on the beach at approximately 0100 hours. Officer made contacts with the juveniles and gathered parent information. Officer issued curfew citations for all parties and ensured they arrived home safely.
Traffic Stop - 4th Degree DWI - Arrest	2021-07-16	Officer was on routine patrol when Officer observed a black Dodge Charger unable to maintain a single lane of traffic. Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle in a safe location and observed the driver to be under the influence of alcohol. Officer conducted field sobriety tests. The driver, Gregory Leon Boll 54 of Victoria- was placed under arrest for DWI. Driver was brought back to the Police Department where a DMT test was conducted. The reported bac was .11. Driver charged with 4th degree DWI and released.
Traffic Stop - Citation - Drugs/Paraphernalia	2021-07-16	Officer conducted a traffic stop for an equipment violation. While speaking with the driver Officer observed an odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle. Officer asked individual to hand over the marijuana and the driver handed over a pouch that included 3 grams of marijuana and paraphernalia. Driver admitted to smoking marijuana an hour before, Officer requested to perform Field Sobriety Tests on the driver. Due to the totality of the circumstances Officer had an individual come pick up driver and

Vandalism	2021-07-17	Officer on routine patrol observed the porta potties at Main Beach had been tipped over. Officer stood them back up and called On Site to come clean them up.
Beach Hours - Verbal Warning	2021-07-22	Officer observed four teenagers at Robinsons Bay Beach. Officer identified the four and confirmed three of them were 18 years of age. They were verbally warned for park hours and released. One juvenile female was warned and told to go straight home, for she lived a few houses away. All left the beach without incident.
