INCIDENT	INCIDENT DATE	INCIDENT DETAILS:
Theft	2019-05-02	Resident reported a theft of two men's watches, valued at over \$13,000.00. Resident suspects a former house guest has taken the watches. Investigation ongoing.
Traffic Stop - DAR/ Possession of Small Amount of Marijuana	2019-05-05	Vehicle was stopped for speed, driver was found to be driving after revocation and marijuana was found in the vehicle. Vehicle was impounded and driver and passenger transported to Speedway to await a ride.
Theft Report	2019-05-10	RP called to report her yellow trek mountain bike was taken from Deephaven Elementary School. RP was advised to check periodically with the PD in case it gets found. Lock was on seat, black bag under seat, water bottle holder and extra padded seat \$900.00.
Traffic Stop - Underage Consumption	2019-05-12	Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple violations. Officer learned the driver was under the age of 18 and could smell an odor of consumed alcohol emitting from the vehicle. Officers had the driver perform SFST's and a PBT sample. The driver provided a .046 BAC PBT sample. The adult passenger was also administered a PBT, resulting in a .064 BAC reading. One was cited for underage consumption and the driver was cited for Not a Drop. Both released to the parents.
Damage to Property Report	2019-05-17	Officer was dispatched to a property damage report at the listed intersection. A stop sign was run over by what the RP described as a "red, white and blue moving truck". Officer took photos and filled out a maintenance request for public works.
Mail Theft	2019-05-20	A resident called to report mail theft while they were out of town and returned home on Sunday to no mail, the post office reported that mail was in the box on Friday. Resident advised about identity theft as well as locking mail boxes.
Identity Theft	2019-05-21	A resident called to report that a Target card application was completed with her information, the card wasn't approved and there was no loss.
Curfew Violation - Written Warning	2019-05-26	Officer located a juvenile male sleeping his vehicle at Thorpe Park. Officer checked the welfare and contacted the juveniles' father. The juvenile was released with a written warning and allowed to drive straight home.
