The following statistics are Part 1 and Part 2 crimes reported for the month of August 2026:

INCIDENT	DATE	DETAILS:
Credit Card Fraud	2026-08-02	Officer was dispatched to a phone call of missing credit cards that were attempted to be used at Walgreens in Hopkins. No money was lost. Could not ID the suspects as Walgreens had poor video.
Theft	2026-08-05	A resident of Woodland approached an officer and reported a past action theft of \$3,000 cash from their home by a cleaning company employee. The homeowner is working with the cleaning company who terminated the employee and reimbursed the cash to the victim. Pending charges
Damage to Property - Theft	2026-08-06	An officer observed the Flock Camera at Minnetonka Boulevard and Cottagewood Road had been stolen. Hennepin County Crime lab was requested to pull visible prints from the pole. Investigation Continues.
Domestic Assault	2026-08-18	Officer responded to a physical domestic at Deephaven Woods Senior Living. The officer arrived and found both individuals were separated and had minor injuries. The officer learned the female half was the aggressor after not wanting the male half to leave. The female attempted grabbed onto the male and attempted to keep him from leaving. Both parties caused injuries to each other. A staff member was able to find video of the male exiting the apartment as the female was trying to hold onto him and he was hitting her with a water bottle. The male was trespassed from the facility. Both parties refused EMS. City Attorney is reviewing case.
Disorderly Conduct	2026-08-21	A Deephaven Officer approached the intersection of Ridgewood Road and Vine Hill Road and observed a vehicle stopped and speaking to the road crew flaggers. Bituminous Roadways was finishing up a road project re-paving the area of Vine Hill Road and Minnetonka Boulevard and employees reported the vehicle had appeared to intentionally drive on fresh pavement while swerving to rip up the roadway. The officer was going to speak to the party about their conduct after they talked with a third flagger but the vehicle kept going on Minnetonka Boulevard from Vine Hill Road, the officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on the vehicle that then drove to 19100 Minnetonka Boulevard which was owned by his parents. The officer took the party into custody, the driver was later released and charges will be submitted.
Traffic Stop - OHM - Flee	2026-08-29	Officer was on patrol and observed an off-highway motorcycle driving on the public roadway. Officer attempted a traffic stop, in which the driver of the off-highway motorcycle fled. Officer lost the driver and was unable to identify who was operating it.

INCIDENT	Reported Date	ACCIDENT DETAILS
PI Accident	2026-08-07	Officer was on a separate incident and requested additional Officers respond to assist. While in route, a Minnetonka Police Officer was involved in a squad involved accident at the intersection of Rutledge Road and Westview Drive. Officer ended the initial contact and responded. Officer gathered information and statements from parties involved. Excelsior Fire and Hennepin EMS responded to the scene and assisted with patient care for the driver of the civilian vehicle. Kustom Karriers was dispatched and towed the civilian vehicle. Matt's Auto responded and towed the Minnetonka Police vehicle to their police department. The driver of the civilian vehicle was transported to the hospital by EMS. A MN Crash report was completed.
PD Accident - Hit and Run	2026-08-16	Officer was patrolling when they came across a downed sign and a mailbox on Minnetonka Boulevard by Thorpe Park, that had been hit by a vehicle. Driver of vehicle that struck the mailbox called in to report the accident. The mailbox owner was contacted. Driver also hit a sign in the Right of Way. Public Works Supervisor was notified and an estimate is attached. State Accident report was filed.
PD Accident - Hit and Run	2026-08-30	Officer was dispatched to a property damage hit and run crash on Lakeview Ave. Caller said their truck was hit overnight. Officer located the vehicle and the driver. Driver spoke to the owner of the truck and decided to settle the damage out of pocket. The driver admitted to hitting the vehicle. Charges sent to City Attorney for review. State Accident report filed.
PD Accident - Hit and Run	2026-08-30	Officer was dispatched to a hit and run property damage crash that occurred the night before in the 19300 block of Lake Ave. Unknown vehicle or driver. State Accident report filed.
