CiB-4 Blooms

Community in Bloom Judges awarded Echo a 4 bloom out of 5 rating. The International version of the America in Bloom Program divides cities into only two categories:



Small & Large. Special recognition was awarded for golf course gardens & Colleen Williams for her efforts to develop & maintain the gardens. The judges report provides

recommendations and comments in six areas: Tidiness, Environmental Action, Heritage Conservation, Urban Forestry, Landscape, Floral Displays; Community involvement is scored in each category. They also commended Lloyd & Lois Piercy for their investment in the community & Kopacz Nursery.

The Highest scores were in Heritage Conservation followed by Floral Displays. The lowest score was in Urban Forestry followed by Tidiness. The Cover letter from the judges is on page 2.
