PUBLIC INPUT POLICY

"Public Input" may be listed as an agenda item for each regular or special City Council meeting.

Persons wishing to address the City Council are asked to observe the following procedures:

- 1. Upon recognition from the presiding officer, you should approach the podium, state your name and present the issue you wish to address.
- 2. Personal attacks will not be allowed. Any personal attacks or other inappropriate remarks will be considered "out of order" and the person shall be precluded from having any further discussion during his/her public input time.
- 3. It is recommended that if a person has an issue involving ordinances or policies, he/she first contact Fillmore City office personnel who may be able to address and resolve the issue or concern.
- 4. Public input time shall be limited to two (2) minutes per person with an aggregate amount of time for all citizens comments not to exceed ten (10) minutes. If an individual feels that the issue will exceed the two (2) minute time limitation, he/she is encouraged to contact the Mayor to include the item on the agenda for the next City Council meeting.
- 5. If during the public input period the City Council determines that additional time is warranted based on the subject matter being discussed, it may, in its sole discretion, waive the time restrictions set forth herein and allow further discussion, or it may recommend that the matter be continued and placed as an agenda item on the next City Council meeting.
- 6. Any requests for funding shall not be discussed during the public input period. Such requests must be an agenda item at a regular or special meeting of the City Council.
