



FESTIVAL ORIGIN RECALLED

On Aug. 29, 1963, a group of civic leaders held the first formal planning session concerning the idea of an annual Banana Festival. The group came from the meeting enthused, encouraged and ready to organize an event which would greatly surpass any project ever undertaken by twin cities residents. The following article which was published in the Aug. 30, 1963 edition of The Fulton Daily Leader relates the discussion of that meeting.

Ambitious plans for an annual Banana Festival to be held in the twin cities were laid last night at a meeting of civic leaders which was held at the chamber of commerce. Twenty-two representatives of all civic clubs in the community were present at the meeting.

Plans were put into motion for an immediate fund raising campaign to finance the festival and for a permanent organization of fund management. A total of \$1,325 was pledged from among those attending.

Date of the festival for this year was tentatively set for middle of November.

A temporary organization was named to set up a non-profit corporation, to be called the Twin Cities Banana Council, Inc. Application will be made for a charter, by-laws written and shares sold, after which there will be a meeting of stockholders to elect officers and form the permanent organization.

Nathan Wade was named temporary chairman last night, Dewey Johnson, temporary secretary and one representative of each civic club, forming the temporary board of directors. This group will meet next Thursday night for approval of bylaws.

Sale of shares in the corporation will begin within the next few days, under the direction of Joe Treas, Mrs. Paul Westpheling and Kenneth Turner. The first donation was one of \$500 from the Civitan Club, matched with an equal amount by YMBC.

The idea of a Banana Week for the twin cities was first promoted by the Civitans about a year ago and it is

hoped that the organization of a corporation and with necessary funds in hand, it will be possible to go ahead with plans for the celebration and to establish it as an annual affair.

Promotion of bananas was chosen as the theme of the festival, due to the fact that a tremendous number of bananas are distributed from Fulton after their arrival from southern ports. Bananas imported from Central America are sent here by rail from New Orleans and iced here before being sent to points all over the United States resulting in the twin cities being labeled "The Banana Capital of the South."

The celebration here is expected to be similar in scope to the Strawberry Festival in Humboldt, the Fish Fry in Paris, the Okra Festival in Bells, etc. Hope has been expressed that the observance may bring national publicity to Fulton-South Fulton.

Tentative plans for the promotion include a parade, beauty pageant, junior pageant, distribution of free bananas, manning of hospitality booths at entrances to the community, window displays, a banana pancake breakfast, a banana cook-off with prizes for the best banana recipe,

a fireworks display, tours of the Ice Plant, and of companies that manufacture banana ice cream, special recognition of visiting dignitaries, distribution of literature explaining why Fulton is the banana capital and various other related projects which will add to the entertainment of the week and bring publicity to the twin cities. Definite plans are to be formulated at a later date.

FESTIVAL HIGHLIGHTS...

1963...Prior to the festival, Carolyn Allen of Fulton, an eighth grader, wrote Chet Huntley of NBC and requested that the network provide coverage of the festival, which resulted in NBC Commentator Edwin Newman to be in attendance, where NBC did tape a program and feature Allen in it...President John F. Kennedy sent a telegram to the twin cities congratulating residents for their efforts to bolster peace and understanding among nations. The telegram was sent Nov. 7, 1963, two weeks prior to the day he was assassinated in Dallas, Texas.

1964...While inclement weather in New Orleans, La. kept Al Hirt, a wellknown musician and scheduled fes-

tival headliner from coming, he was perhaps the only celebrity who did not show up, as 1964 was considered a banner year for festival officials as a host of Latin America government officials and state department representatives attended, including U.S. Ambassador Averell Harriman; Jose Antonio Correa, ambassador from Ecuador: Gonzalo Blanco, Mexican ambassador; Gonzalo Facio, Costa Rican official Ralph Lally, president of the National Banana Association; entertainer Jerry Van Dyke, Aunt Jemima, Kentucky Gov. Ned Breathitt, Artis Ray Harm and Miss Tennessee, Rita Munsey. Miss America 1964 Donna Axum arrived in Union City to attend the first International Banana Festival in 1963, greeted by Jo Westpheling.



1965...Bobby Nichols, PGA Golf Champion of 1964 attended the festival and played a round with local area golfers; Miss Ecuador 1964 Pat Ballesteros visited the Banana Festival.

1966...After a group of local residents made a trip to Ecuador to further expand the festival, a trip chronicled by Jo Westpheling in the Fulton County News, the mother of Miss Ecuador 1965 came to the twin cities with a group of Latin American students to enjoy the festival, making way for the beginning of an integral part of many festivals to come, "The Amigos" visit.

1967...Ernst and Ernst, an account-

ing firm, studied the feasibility of a in cash, courtesy of local retail mer-Latin America Center in the twin cities

1968...Dottie West and Merle Travis entertained festival goers at the Kitty League ball park, but scheduled Strawberry Alarm Clock cancelled their show. Kentucky Gov. Louis Nunn attended the festival and a pie eating contest was a highlight.

1969...Lionel Hampton, Bill Anderson and the Po' Boys, the Berea Square Dancers and Battle of the Bands provided entertainment and U.S. Sen. Frank Albert Stubblefield attended the festival.

1970....The Joffrey II Ballet Company, Barbara Mandrell, Sonny James and the Southern Gentlemen, Furry Lewis, Jerry and Lee Schilling and a Dixie Jazz concert offered a wide variety of entertainment.

1971...The Exiles, a rock group, performed along with the Marimba Band and the Doodletown Pipers, with a Briar Patch Dance hosted for teens

1972....Jim Ed Brown and the Gems entertained, and Peter Nero, well known composer and pianist with noted recordings such as the theme from Love Story and Summer of '42 captured the interest of festival goers at his concert. Hostess Princess was Rose Gattis, who received \$1000

chants.

1973...Lionel Hampton returned for a performance at Fulton High School, and country entertainer Mel Tillis also took the stage.

1974... "Going Bananas", a musical revue directed by Bob McCrary featured a local cast, Boots Randolph was the main performer and a home tour featured the homes of Dr. and Mrs. J.A. Poe. Mrs. Ual Killebrew and Mr. and Mrs. Hunter Whitesell.

1975.....Danny Davis and the Nashville Brass, as well as the Exiles, Marimba Band and an Old Fiddlers' Contest were on the schedule, with another staging of "Going Bananas", a Kiddie Parade, Rocking Chair marathon and Window Fair.

1976...Another local production featuring 50 young adults, "Portrait of '76" was directed by Larry Walker, with the Fulton-South Fulton Art Guild designing and constructing the set and props. Buck Owens was the featured entertainer.

1977....Tom T. Hall was featured performer, with a tractor pull, equipment show and a Summer Salute to Agriculture reported to have drawn 8,000 visitors were included in the Banana Festival events, as well as

a candlelight home tour featuring the residences of Mrs. Gilson Latta, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Weaks, Mr. and Mrs. Richard Gossum, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Beadles, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Binford, Mr. and Mrs. Maxwell McDade, Mr. and Mrs. J.E. Campbell and Dr. and Mrs. Ward Bushart.

1978...Danny Davis returned to the festival after having won a Grammy and performing at the White House, with Cal Smith, winner of the Country Western Song of the Year, "Country Bumpkin" and Record of the Year, also performing. A Salute to Agriculture and a Racking Horse Show drew a large crowd at Kitty League Park, and a Banana Split Eating Contest appealed to local youth.

1979...The American Music Theatre gave festival goers renditions of classic favorites, "Porgy and Bess", "My Fair Lady", and "Annie Get Your Gun", while country music fans enjoyed a show by Razzy Bailey and the Lewis Family provided gospel and bluegrass tunes.

1980....The American Music Theatre returned with a "Banana Brits" show and concerts were presented by J.D. Sumner and the Stamps, the Only Fair Blues Band and the U.S. Navy Country Empires. Homes of the Gaylon Varden family, the Bobby Caldwell family, the Joe Johnson family and the Dan Taylor family were featured on the home tour.

1981....Country music claimed the most audiences with the Country Beat, Country Sound and Constant Country bands entertaining at city park and at the Banana-rama dances. Nationally known singers, the Vogues performed old favorites at Fulton High School.

1982.....Tennessee Gov. Lamar Alexander was on hand for the festival, presenting the Three Star Award for community development to the City of South Fulton, and Kentucky Lt. Gov. Martha Layne Collins was also in attendance for the festival. The Blackwood singers, a celebrity auction, a dance featuring Instant Replay and a

banana bonnet contest were included to help. Similar generous support was for the 1982 line-up. to help. Similar generous support was also offered and accepted from Na-

1983....Ky. Gov. John Y. Brown was the featured speaker at the Latin American Day luncheon, a concert featuring the Windows was held a Fulton High School and attracted an overflow crowd of teenagers and young adults.

1984.....While most festival events went off like a charm. Saturday's big schedule was all wet, following torrential downpours which began early in the morning and continued until the Harris Fork Creek overflowed and flooded portions of South Fulton and Fulton. For the first time, flooding conditions cancelled all Saturday events, with the parade rescheduled for Sunday afternoon. With city park flooded, the pudding was served on Lake Street at the parade's end, in a drizzle. A Quilt Fair, a concert by The Windows and Ky. Gov. Martha Layne Collins as keynote speaker for the annual Friday luncheon took place earlier in the festival week.

1985...Late into the festival year, in August, officials learned that Turner Dairies would no longer make the one ton banana pudding. With a little over a month to go, it looked as though the famous dessert would be a "no show." But, the pudding and local spirits rallied and Regency Creative Foods in Louisville, a maker of pie filling, asked

to help. Similar generous support was also offered and accepted from Nabisco, the cookie maker, and Dole, the banana supplier, and the pudding was whipped up by local volunteers. Jerry Reed was the headliner, a locally produced musical, Music, Music, Music, Music was featured with twin city residents participating and The Great American Celebration was an integral part of the 23rd festival, from an idea developed by Johnny Jones, local business man.

1986...The first Banana Bowl football game between Fulton and South Fulton High Schools was played with SFHS Red Devils winning 26-0. Banjo player Mike Snider and humorist Grady Jim Robinson entertained the festival crowds.

1987...Banana Festival officials accepted a Guinness Book of World Records challenge in April from the Great Atlantic and Pacific Food Co. of Canada Ltd., A&P, which made a 3,000 pound pudding and served it to people attending a company sponsored food fair in Hamilton, Ontario.

With the festival's previous one-ton pudding not the world's largest, Festival President at the time, James O. Butts, announced that local pudding makers would add an extra ton to surpass A&P's pudding by 1000 pounds.

The container for the potential record holding banana pudding, expected to feed 20,000, weighed 640 pounds, was six feet long, three feet deep and three and one half feet wide.


