A message from Mayor Reginald Spinello The City of Glen Cove

Every time it snows in the City of Glen Cove, it takes a team effort between City workers and residents to prep, salt, sand and plow our streets, shovel the sidewalks in front of your house or business and to respect the needs and safety of your neighbors.

Here is a reminder about the Do's and Don'ts of snow removal and storm safety so you are ready for our next weather event.

Do's V

- When weather forecasts call for more than 3 inches of snow or when Mayor Spinello declares a snow emergency, park your car in your driveway, on your front lawn or in the Glen Cove municipal garages and the Coles School parking lot. If you must park on the street, park on the odd numbered side of the street ONLY.
- ✓ If the Mayor does announce a snow emergency, it is unlawful to park or abandon any vehicle along the even-numbered side of any Glen Cove street, road, avenue or highway. Any vehicle in violation of this code will be ticketed and towed with the vehicle owner responsible for all fees and expenses. Chapter 265: Vehicles and Traffic; 265-32.1 Snow emergencies.
- Shovel the sidewalk in front of your home or business within 12 hours of a snow event.

- Register your home and cell phone numbers for emergency notifications from Mayor Spinello. Forms are available on the City's web site www.glencove-li.us.
- Residents with life sustaining medical equipment or critical medical needs are urged to call Glen Cove EMS at (516) 676-0366 and the Department of Public Works at (516) 676-4402 to be put on emergency checklists.
- If you must drive during a heavy snow event, drive with caution as there may be snow drifts, black ice, flooding, falling branches and trees and hazardous road conditions. Fill your gas tank and stock your vehicle with necessities (e.g., windshield scraper, flashlight/batteries, blanket, water, flares, booster cables, first aid kit and a small bag of ice melt and/or sand.)
- Keep your cell phone charged and have important numbers on hand, e.g., PSEG if you lose your power 1-800-490-0075 and call 911 for emergencies only.
- Place home fire extinguishers in a convenient location.
- When shoveling be mindful of your personal health limits.
- Shovel a three-foot area around fire hydrants in front of your home.
- Keep pets indoors and check on neighbors who may need assistance.
- Call the Department of Public Works if you have a snow issue 24 hours after a major storm at (516) 676-4402.

Don'ts X

- ✗ Do not shovel or plow your property's snow into the street. This is a violation of the Glen Cove City code and violators can receive a summons. Chapter 235, Solid Waste Disposal 235-4B
- ✗ Do not park your car on the even numbered side of the street or you will be ticketed and towed. Chapter 265: Vehicles and Traffic; 265-32.1 Snow emergencies.
- Do not operate or bring grills or generators inside. Running them indoors could be a deadly mistake, as both emit carbon monoxide that could poison you in a confined space.
- Do not stand under trees during a storm or if they're coated in ice. Branches weigh far more when they're coated in ice, and they could injure you if they break and fall.
