MINUTES OF THE

CITY COUNCIL MEETING

JUNE 23, 2021

Mayor Tenke called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m., and Elijah Gooden, Kay'Den Grier, Matthew Jackson and Gamar Letellier lead those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENT: Mayor Tenke, Councilpersons Silverman, Totino, Fugazy Scagliola, Perrone, Lupenko Ferrante, and Stevenson-Mathews.

ABSENT: None.

ALSO PRESENT: Acting City Clerk, Maureen Basdavanos, City Attorney Gregory Kalnitsky.

Mayor Tenke called for a moment of silence in remembrance of the passing of three people that were important to the Glen Cove community: Bill Byrne, Rosa Calderon, and Rosemary Dilgard.

Mayor Tenke issued a citation to Kristen Foster in recognition and appreciation of the heroism she displayed while rescuing a swimmer in peril at Pryibil Beach on Thursday, June 17, 2021 at approximately 2:45 p.m.

Mayor Tenke issued a citation to Elijah Gooden, Kay'Den Grier, Matthew Jackson and Gamar Letellier, players and teammates from the Ironman Football League, for their dedication to the sport of football having played every season since 2013 and participating in over 300 practice sessions and games.

Mayor Tenke announced that Resolution 6P declares February 17th as Glen Cove's Harlem Hellfighters Remembrance Day and requested that Reverend Roger Williams make comments and that those in attendance watch a video speech from Congressmen Tom Suozzi honoring the Harlem Hellfighters from the house floor.

Mayor Tenke moved that Resolution 7A be advanced on the agenda and that Resolution 7A to appoint John W. Charon as the replacement for the vacant City Clerk position be considered.

Councilman Perrone seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously, and resolution 7A was advanced on the agenda and considered.

WHEREAS, the City is further desirous of conducting a thorough search for a successor City Clerk:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, John W. Charon is hereby appointed as City Clerk, effective immediately, at an annualized salary of \$30,000 for his service as City Clerk for the remainder of his predecessor's term, from present to the remainder of the year, in addition to his current salary as Director of Personnel.

Mayor Tenke opened a public hearing to amend Section 265-30 of the City of Glen Cove City Code of Ordinances amending the City's Notice of Removal for impounded vehicles to comply with all applicable federal law and gave the public the opportunity to be heard on the matter.

Mayor Tenke opened a public hearing to amend Section 265-46 of the City of Glen Cove City Code of Ordinances to prohibit parking at the Brewster Street and Pulaski Street Garages everyday between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m.

Mayor Tenke stated that both public hearings remain open until the next regular City Council meeting to be held on July 27, 2021 at which time the matter will be voted upon.

WHEREAS, "Harlem Hellfighters" was a nickname for the 369th United States Infantry Regiment, originally the 15th New York National Guard Regiment called the "Rattlers", an African American unit that earned its nickname for its combat actions on the battlefields of France in 1918; and

WHEREAS, despite the distinguished service of African Americans in the Armed Forces of the United States dating back to the American Revolutionary War, they faced considerable racial prejudice and strong resistance regarding their deployment as combat troops as the United States Army mobilized in 1917 to fight World War I; and

WHEREAS, although the May 1917 Selective Service Act specified that able-bodied American men of 21 to 30 years of age, inclusive, were eligible for induction "regardless of race," the War Department initially planned to use African Americans only as manual labor troops, typically as cooks, stevedores, and drivers; and

WHEREAS, increasingly strident demands from operational commanders for replacement fighting units to bolster Allied ranks led to the creation of two racially segregated United States infantry combat divisions, the 92nd and 93rd Divisions, consisting of African American soldiers led by White and some African American officers; and

WHEREAS, the Harlem Hellfighters' combat record leaves no legitimate doubt about the patriotism, combat effectiveness, and fearlessness of African American soldiers. The unit spent 191 days at the front, never lost ground, and was the first Allied unit to reach the Rhine River. The unit suffered 1,500 casualties while fighting in the Second Battle of the Marne from July 15 to 18, 1918, inclusive and in the first month of the Meuse-Argonne Offensive from September 26 to November 11, 1918, inclusive. The 369th's casualties constituted about one-half of the 93rd Division's losses of 3,167 total dead or wounded, despite being just one of four regiments in the division. The 369th was removed from its attachment to the French Army on December 18, 1918; and

WHEREAS, the regiment returned to the United States and demobilized on February 28, 1919, at Camp Upton, New York, and then was returned to the New York National Guard. Soldiers of the 93rd Division received more than 500 French and United States valor medals; and

WHEREAS, the Harlem Hellfighters spent more time in combat than any other American unit; over 40 of these brave men were from the Glen Cove area; three of the African American members of the unit, Sergeant Richard Fowler, Sergeant Jeremiah Reed, and Corporal Ernest Seaman, were awarded the Croix de Guerre, the French medal for valor, as was one of their white officers, Lieutenant Richardson Pratt; the most famous black member, Henry Johnson, was posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor; and

WHEREAS, on February 17, 1919, 3,000 veterans of the 369th Infantry, formerly the 15th New York Regiment, paraded from Fifth Avenue at 23rd Street to 145th and Lenox in the City of New York. One of the few black combat regiments in World War I, they'd earned the prestigious Croix de Guerre from the French army, under which they'd served for six months of "brave and bitter fighting." Their nickname they'd received from their German foes: "Hellfighters," so they became the Harlem Hellfighters;

WHEREAS, in recognition of their bravery and outstanding service during World War I, on May 28, 2021, Congressman Thomas Suozzi (NY03) introduced HR 3642, a bill to award the Congressional Gold Medal to the 369th Infantry Regiment, known as the "Harlem Hellfighers". The Congressional Gold Medal is the highest award bestowed by Congress on an individual or organization. On June 15, 2021, HR 3642 passed the House and was subsequently referred to the Senate for further action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Glen Cove hereby proclaims February 17th as Glen Cove's Harlem Hellfighters Remembrance Day.

WHEREAS, the City of Glen Cove (subrecipient) and Glen Cove Community Development Agency (agent) have entered into a contract with Nassau County CQHI19000022 (the "Contract) for approved activities to be undertaken under the 2019-2020 (45th Year) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); and

WHEREAS, Public Facilities and Improvements (PF&I) line GC45-06E Pryibil Beach Fishing Pier in the amount of \$6,849.00 was added into the Contract and PF&I line GC45-06C Opportunity Area Wayfinding Signage was reduced by \$6,849.00; and
