CITY OF GLEN COVE MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

SEPTEMBER 28, 2021

Mayor Tenke called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m., and Ralph Comitino lead those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENT: Mayor Tenke, Councilpersons Silverman, Totino, Fugazy Scagliola, Lupenko Ferrante, and Stevenson-Mathews.

ABSENT: Councilman Perrone.

ALSO PRESENT: City Clerk Charon and City Attorney Kalnitsky.

Mayor Tenke called for a moment of silence in remembrance of the passing of Peter Gelzinis, Nicole Karousos, Rocco Moccia, Sal Paolillo, Christopher Crosby-Gugig and Alice Savage.

Mayor Tenke asked the City Clerk to read the announcements, and the City Clerk gave notice that the Guns and Hoses charity softball game between the Glen Cove Police and Fire Departments will be held Friday, October 1, 2021 at the John Maccarone Memorial Stadium.

Mayor Tenke opened Public Hearing 2A to hear comments on the proposed amendments to Section 265-46 of the City of Glen Cove City Code of Ordinances to prohibit parking at the Brewster Street and Pulaski Street Garages everyday between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m.

Mayor Tenke made a motion to amend the ordinance considered in Public Hearing 2A to amend the City Code of Ordinances Section 265-49 to limit parking at the Brewster Street and Pulaski Street Garages to a maximum of 48 hours. Councilwoman Fugazy Scagliola seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried, and the proposed ordinance was amended.

Mayor Tenke made a motion to close Public Hearing 2A. Councilman Stevenson-Mathews seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried, and Public Hearing 2A was closed.

Mayor Tenke opened Public Hearing 2B to hear comments on the proposed amendments to Section 265-49 of the City of Glen Cove City Code of Ordinances creating 30 minute parking from the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. on the north side of Herb Hill Road.

Mayor Tenke made a motion to amend the ordinance considered in Public Hearing 2B to create 30 minute parking from the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and 2 hour parking from the hours of 6:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. on the north side of Herb Hill Road. Councilman Stevenson-Mathews seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried, and the proposed ordinance was amended.

Mayor Tenke stated the amendment to the proposed ordinance related to Public Hearing 2B also addressed the matter of overnight parking considered in Public Hearing 2C, and Mayor Tenke made a motion to close Public Hearing 2C. Councilman Totino seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried, and Public Hearing 2C was closed.

Mayor Tenke made a motion to close Public Hearing 2B. Councilman Stevenson-Mathews seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried, and Public Hearing 2B was closed.

Mayor Tenke made a motion to adopt the minutes of the August 24, 2021 meeting. Councilman Totino seconded the motion.

Councilman Stevenson-Mathews made a motion to amend a section of the minutes to read "Councilman Stevenson-Mathews made a motion to amend the proposed Ordinance discussed in Public Hearing 2D with respect to section B, asking that the rate be \$7.00 for individuals over 60 years of age and \$8.00 for all other passengers. The motion was not seconded."

Councilwoman Lupenko Ferrante seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried with Councilwoman Fugazy Scagliola abstaining, and the minutes were amended.

Mayor Tenke made a motion to adopt the minutes of the August 24, 2021 meeting as amended. Councilman Totino seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried with Councilwoman Fugazy Scagliola abstaining, and the minutes of the August 24, 2021 meeting were adopted.
