CITY OF GLEN COVE MINUTES OF THE

CITY COUNCIL MEETING

DECEMBER 14, 2021

Mayor Tenke called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m., and Spiro Tsirkas lead those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENT: Mayor Tenke, Councilpersons Silverman, Fugazy Scagliola, Perrone, Lupenko Ferrante, and Stevenson-Mathews.

ABSENT: Councilman Totino was absent for the calling of the roll and arrived at the start of Public Hearing 2A.

ALSO PRESENT: City Clerk Charon and City Attorney Kalnitsky.

Mayor Tenke called for a moment of silence in remembrance of the passing of Frank Caruso, a prominent local developer, and James Ziegen, a retired Water Department employee.

Mayor Tenke asked the City Clerk to read the announcements, and the City Clerk gave notice that the Milk and Cookies with Santa event was cancelled due to an upsurge in the pandemic and that the outdoors New Year's Eve Concert in Village Square with music by the "Solid 70's" band was to be held on New Year's Eve.

Mayor Tenke opened Public Hearing 2A to consider the local law opting out of allowing cannabis retail dispensaries and on-site consumption sites. During the lengthy comment period, many residents and concerned parties spoke on the matter both for and against opting out.

Mayor Tenke made a motion to close Public Hearing 2A so that a vote could be made on the matter. The motion was seconded by Councilman Perrone. The motion unanimously carried, and Public Hearing 2A was closed.

Mayor Tenke opened Public Hearing 2B to consider the proposed change to the speed limit on West Stuart Drive and East Stuart Drive. As all comments to date had been in favor of reducing the speed limit, Mayor Tenke asked if there were any comments opposing the reduction in the speed limit. As there was no one speaking against the ordinance, Mayor Tenke made a motion to close Public Hearing 2B so that a vote could be made on the matter. The motion was seconded by Councilman Perrone. The motion unanimously carried, and Public Hearing 2B was closed.

Mayor Tenke made a motion to adopt minutes of the November 23, 2021 meeting. Councilman Perrone seconded the motion. Mayor Tenke asked if there were any questions on the minutes, and Councilwoman Silverman made a motion to amend the minutes to indicate the vote count as "six to zero" after all unanimous votes mentioned in the minutes. The motion was seconded by Mayor Tenke. The motion unanimously carried, and the minutes were amended.

Mayor Tenke asked the Clerk to poll the Council on his motion to adopt minutes of the November 23, 2021 meeting as amended and as seconded by Councilman Perrone. The motion unanimously carried, and the minutes of the November 23, 2021 meeting as amended were adopted.

Mayor Tenke made a motion to approve the warrants. Councilman Stevenson-Mathews seconded the motion. Mayor Tenke asked if there were any questions on the warrants, and Councilwoman Silverman made a motion to table voucher 114730. Councilman Totino seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried, and voucher 114730 was tabled.

Mayor Tenke asked the Clerk to poll the Council on his motion to approve the warrants as seconded by Councilman Stevenson-Mathews. The motion unanimously carried, and the warrants were adopted.

6-A Local Law

LOCAL LAW 01 - 2021

A LOCAL LAW TO OPT OUT OF ALLOWING CANNABIS RETAIL DISPENSARIES AND ON-SITE CONSUMPTION SITES AS AUTHORIZED UNDER CANNABIS LAW ARTICLE 4

BE IT ENACTED, by the City Council of the City of Glen Cove, County of Nassau, State of New York as follows:

Section 1: Legislative Intent and Purpose.

It is the intent of this local law to opt out of allowing cannabis retail dispensaries and on-site cannabis consumption sites in the City of Glen Cove that would otherwise be allowed under Cannabis Law Article 4.

Section 2: Authority.

This Local Law is adopted pursuant to Cannabis Law § 131, which expressly authorizes the City Council to adopt a local law requesting the Cannabis Control Board to prohibit the establishment of cannabis retail dispensaries and/or on-site consumption licenses within the jurisdiction of the City and is subject to a permissive referendum, the procedure of which is governed by Municipal Home Rule Law § 24.

Section 3: Local Opt-Out.

The City Council of the City of Glen Cove, County of Nassau, State of New York hereby opts out of allowing cannabis retail dispensaries and on-site cannabis consumption sites from being established and operated within the City's jurisdiction.

Section 4: Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of the Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5: Permissive Referendum / Referendum on Petition.

This local law is subject to a referendum on petition in accordance with Cannabis Law § 131 and the procedure outlined in Municipal Home Rule Law § 24.

Section 6: Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

6-B Ordinance

BE IT ORDAINED, that Section 265-30 of the City of Glen Cove City Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to change the speed limit on Stuart Drive West and Stuart Drive East from 30 miles per hour to 25 miles per hour.

6-C Resolution

WHEREAS, the City of Glen Cove is committed to promoting, creating and sustaining our community for all ages;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that consistent with the City of Glen Cove's membership in the AARP Network of Age-Friendly communities and designation as an Age-Friendly Center of Excellence in Nassau County, the City of Glen Cove will strive, wherever practical and feasible, to incorporate the principles of the AARP/WHO Age-Friendly Domains of Livability into City planning, including policies, procedures and procurements.
