This exception for site plan approval shall also apply within any other zoning district if such proposed change is located within an established shopping center containing at least five (5) retail establishments with an existing parking lot of more than fifteen (15) vehicle spaces.
- (4) Any application for a special use permit or exception.

SECTION 2. Section 280-65, "*B-1 Central Commercial District*," of Chapter 280, "Zoning," of the Code of the City of Glen Cove is hereby amended as follows:

§ 280-65 **B-1 Central Commercial District.**

uses shall be located in fully enclosed structures:
