Resolution 9B

WHEREAS, the Auxiliary Police are often called upon to serve as replacements for vacant school crossing posts; and

WHEREAS, the Crossing Guards that cover the school crossings are paid at a daily rate due to the nature of the of the split schedule of the posts while employees in the Auxiliary Police are paid an hourly rate which does not account for this split schedule; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, effective immediately, employees in the Auxiliary Police shall receive twice the normal rate of pay for the hours that they are assigned to cover a crossing post.
