CITY COUNCIL MEETING

FEBRUARY 13, 2024

Mayor Panzenbeck called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and asked John Parrone to lead those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENT: Mayor Panzenbeck, Councilpersons Zozzaro, Silverman, Farnan, Fugazy Scagliola, Ktistakis and Maccarone

PUBLIC HEARING:

A To discuss Local Law 01-2024, amending the zoning district designation of the land located on the north side of Mill Hill Road extending north therefrom along the west side of Brewster Street to the south side of R-6 zone on the west side of Brewster Street, which land includes properties known on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 31, Block F, Lots 387, 389, 400, 401, 404, 1066, 1068, 1070, and 1071, from B-1 Central Commercial District to B-2 Peripheral Commercial District.

Resolution 6A

BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with Article 8 of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, the consideration of proposed Local Law 01-2024 to change the zoning designation of the land north of Mill Hill Road extending therefrom along the west side of Brewster Street up to the south side of the R-6 zone on the west side of Brewster Street, from B-1 Central Business District to B-2 Peripheral Business District is classified as an Unlisted Action that will have no significant effect upon the environment, and therefore no EIS is required for this action.

Councilman Farnan seconded the motion.

Local Law 6B

PROPOSED LOCAL LAW 01-2024 AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF GLEN COVE

A local law amending the Official Zoning Map, City of Glen Cove, to change the designation of the land located on the north side of Mill Hill Road extending north therefrom along the west side of Brewster Street up t the south side of the R-6 zone on the west side of Brewster Street.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GLEN COVE, NEW YORK AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Official Zoning Map for the City of Glen Cove is hereby amended to change the zoning designation of the land located on the north side of Mill Hill Road extending north therefrom along the west side of Brewster Street to the south side of the R-6 zone on the west side of Brewster Street, which land includes properties known on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 31, Block F, Lots 387, 389, 400, 401, 404, 1066, 1068, 1070, and 1071, from B-1 Central Commercial District to B-2 Peripheral Commercial District.

Section 2. This law shall take effect upon filing with the New York State Department of State.

- 3. That the MUNICIPALITY agrees that it will fund the entire cost of said household hazardous waste program and will be reimbursed by the State for the State share of such costs.
- 4. That four (4) Certified Copies of this Resolution be prepared and sent to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation together with a complete application.
- 5. That this resolution shall take effect immediately.

Resolution 6T
