BE IT ORDAINED, that the City Council hereby amends Sec. 265-44. Schedule XII: No Stopping, as it relates to Harbor Hill Road.

Resolution 8A

BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with NV5 New York - Engineers, Architects, Landscape Architects and Surveyors, to provide pavement design services and contract documents for the 2026 Road, Drainage, and Sidewalk Improvements at Various Locations, under the City's Engineering on-call agreement, for an amount not to exceed \$126,934.00

Resolution 8B

BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to retroactively enter into an emergency agreement with Sherco Services, LLC to adjust the tide gates on the East Island Bridge in advance of a northeastern storm, for a lump sum cost of \$4,875.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, Andrew R. Kaplan is hereby appointed as a part-time Emergency Medical Technician (Advanced) with EMS at \$27.00 per hour with an effective date of October 21, 2025.
