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
- Connection to 110 volt power 24-7
- · Mounted on cement pad
- · Purchased by Haven Township
- Neighborhood fund support of 10% required
- · Host location will provide electric
- Smart Monitoring program provided by township for 3 years, after which AEDs will revert to be neighborhood supported.
- AED training required each year to keep AED in neighborhood. Haven Township will provide and host based on the anniversary of installation.
- Area alert notification list will verified on regular basis as a tested event.

Myth:

Only trained personnel are allowed to use AEDs

Fact:

AEDs are lifesaving devices with visual and voice prompts that are designed for use by laypersons



The location of Out-of-Hospital Cardiac Arrests (OHCA) most often occurs in homes/residences (73.4%), followed by public settings (16.3%), and nursing homes (10.3%).

If performed immediately, CPR / AED can double or triple the chance of survival from an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest.
