With early voting for the November 4 bond election beginning this Monday, October 20, here is factual information about the ballot measure and voting options. The ballot includes Proposition A, a yes/no (for/against) vote on a \$1,000,000 General Obligation Bond. The bond would fund the purchase of adjacent property to the city's water plant and some infrastructure updates. There would be no increase to taxes or water rates as a result of the bond.
