2022 Lewiston 4th of July Parade Grand Marshals Willard "Soup" & Elaine Jessop



Willard and Elaine were married 65 years ago and spent their first year in Lewiston while Willard attended USU and finished his B.S. degree in education. He went into the army in 1958 as a 2nd Lieutenant. He finished his career of 13 years in the artillery and 17 years as a chaplain. The last 7 years he served as the state chaplain and retired with the rank of full colonel.

He taught school for 34 years including 30 years at Sky View High School. He taught History, Psychology, and started the Adult Roles Class. He also coached football, basketball, and track.

During that time Elaine worked at Theurer's grocery store and volunteered with the Lewiston Arts Council and Library Board. She really enjoyed her service, meeting and knowing everyone in town, and thanks in part to her efforts we have landmarks such as "Welcome to Lewiston" signs and a library at street level.

Willard & Elaine have 4 children, 17 grandchildren, and 32 great grandchildren.

After graduating from North Cache in 1951 he went to college on an athletic scholarship for football and track. He served a mission in Norway from 1953-1956 for his church. The Jessops raised Appaloosa horses and restored old log cabins. They love Lewiston.

Willard started the Veteran's Day program at Sky View honoring the five boys that gave their lives in Vietnam & Iraq and all veterans that have served their country.
