As Valentine's day became more popular, by the mid-18th century it was routine for friends and lovers to exchange small tokens and notes on Valentine's Day. In the 19th century, the Industrial Revolution helped make printed Valentine's Day cards the hot new thing. The explosion of love continued in the 19th century with the creation of the first heart-shaped box of chocolates—a quintessential symbol of Valentine's Day—at the hands of Richard Cadbury. To make things even sweeter, the New England Confectionery Company (Necco) started to produce the earliest version of Conversation Hearts, which are still popular to this day. Finally, in 1913, Hallmark Cards of Kansas City, Missouri, began mass-producing valentines.




