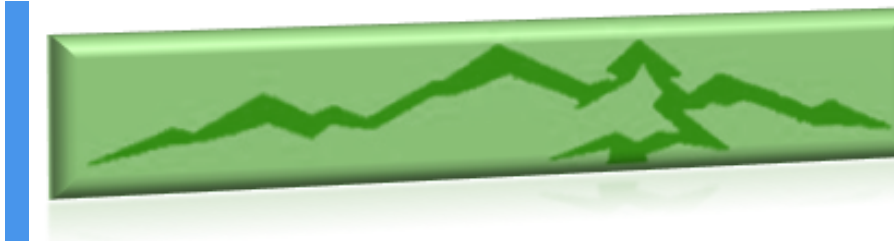

A Message from the Water Department

Using water efficiently doesn't only involve watering your lawn. It can be done indoors, too.

Fill them first. Run the dishwasher and washing machine only when they are full. This small step could save as much as 1,000 gallons of water each month in a typical home. Soak pots and pans instead of letting the faucet run.

Just add air. Installing aerators on faucets in your home is easy, inexpensive, effective, and won't sacrifice performance. This simple step can instantly reduce water flowing through the faucet by 30% or more.

Tinker with your toilet. Save water by repairing leaky faucets and toilets. A leaky toilet can waste massive amounts of water, especially if there is a silent leak that you may not even notice. These leaks can waste thousands of gallons over the course of a month.
