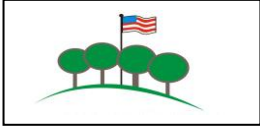

Outdoor Fires

Having an outdoor fire in the evening is always a fun family event. A portable fire pit with a mesh enclosure to capture hot embers is obviously the safest to use.

If you have an open fire pit, please remember that your fires should be no larger than a fire that you would cook over and should never be left unattended. Grass fires can start easily and get out of hand very quickly. Have a hose or a fire extinguisher nearby for safety.

Lake Michigan Lake Levels

The forecasted lake levels for April 26th are above what they were in March. Lakes Superior and Michigan-Huron are 3 and 4 inches above last month's levels respectively, and Lakes St. Clair, Erie, and Ontario are 7, 7, and 8 inches higher. All the lakes are below the levels they were at around this time last year, down 11 inches in Superior and Ontario, to only 1 inch on Erie. Even though they are lower than last year, all the lakes are projected to be at or above the long-term average water levels for the month of April. Lake Superior is sitting right at the average level, while Lakes Michigan-Huron and Ontario are above by 3 and 2 inches respectively. Lake St. Clair is expected to be 11 inches above average, and Lake Erie sits 14 inches above average. By next month, both Lakes Superior and Michigan-Huron are expected to increase by 3 inches, Lake Ontario by 2 inches, and Lake St. Clair by 1 inch, and Lake Ontario by 2 inches. World's Religion Book Study

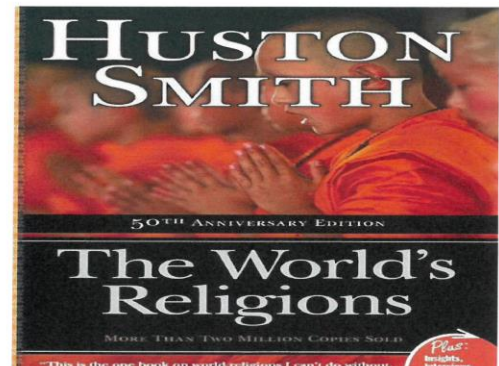
Sister Bay/Liberty Grove Library

ADRCDC

The Aging and Disability Resource Center of Door County is excited to offer a new opportunity to serve Door County residents who may need guidance and support with their applications for Medicare. The ADRC coordinates a group of SHIP Counselors. SHIP stands for State Health Insurance Program, which is a national program that trains individuals to understand Medicare with the mission of helping others understand Medicare in an unbiased way. We have always helped those who need more support with their applications, but we are excited that with the help of the SHIP volunteers, we'll be available to expand to new locations to help individuals who need a little extra support.

Starting in June 2024, the ADRC has partnered with the Sister Bay/Liberty Grove Library site to meet individuals from the Northern parts of the County closer to home! SHIP volunteers will help individuals enter their initial Part A and B applications for Medicare, which go through the Social Security Administration. Our goal is to answer questions about the application and help submit the application. This opportunity will save individuals a trip to Green Bay (which is the closest Social Security office) or a potential month long wait for an appointment with Social Security. Volunteers will be at the Sister Bay /Liberty Grove Library the 4th Wednesday of each month, 10:30-12:30. There is no cost for this service.

For those who'd like to know more about getting an appointment for help, or have other questions about Medicare, please contact the ADRC for screening and scheduling. Please note, the library will not be scheduling these appointments. Appointments are preferred, but walk-ins will be welcome if space allows. Appointments for help with applications have always been made at ADRC office or by phone, and this will continue as well. Contact the ADRC at 920-746-2372 for more details.

If you are able to apply for yourself, but just don't know how, Medicare Part A and B applications are taken by the Social Security Administration. You do not have to apply for retirement benefits at the same time. To reach Social Security by phone, call 1-888-862-4811 to request an appointment (which are done by phone or in-person in Green Bay). If comfortable online, apply through www.ssa.gov.

**THE VILLAGE OF SISTER BAY, IN COOPERATION WITH THE TOWN OF LIBERTY GROVE,
WILL BE SPONSORING A PRESCRIPTION DRUG DROP-OFF EVENT &
A SHREDDING/APPLIANCE/ELECTRONICS RECYCLING EVENT**

ON SATURDAY, MAY 11, 2024 *AT The Sister Bay Sports Complex 9 - Noon*****

In an effort to protect our water, land and air, officials from the Village of Sister Bay and the Town of Liberty Grove are encouraging everyone to recycle and participate in a Prescription Drug Drop-Off and an Appliance/Electronics Recycling Event on Saturday, May 11, 2024. All Village of Sister Bay and Town of Liberty Grove residents, property owners, business owners or operators are also encouraged to participate in a Shredding Event that same day. (Be advised that the appliance/electronics recycling services as well as drug drop-off event will be open to the public, but due to overwhelming response in the past, persons from other municipalities will NOT be allowed to participate in the Shredding Program.)

There will not be a charge to recycle most small household appliances or items such as bicycles, lawn mowers, snow blowers, stoves and washing machines, but fees ranging from \$5.00 to \$60.00 per item could be charged to recycle anything with a compressor or a screen such as LCD and CRT monitors, televisions, refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, and air conditioning units. Please note that this list is not all-inclusive.

There will be no charge for the VILLAGE OF SISTER BAY OR TOWN OF LIBERTY GROVE RESIDENTS, BUSINESS OWNERS AND PROPERTY OWNERS to have documents securely shredded. All shredded materials will be recycled.

Any documents to be shredded as well as any of the previously mentioned items should be brought to the parking lot at the Sister Bay Sports Complex, 2155 Autumn Court, between 9:00 A.M. and noon on May 11, 2024.

Please note that there will be a limit of (5) Banker Boxes filled with materials to be shredded per household or business.

If you wish to drop off items to be securely shredded, please be prepared to present "proof of residence" at the entrance to the Sports Complex.

Before large items can be placed on the recycling truck, all recycling fees must be paid.

In response to a request from several concerned citizens a representative of the Door County Sheriff's Department will also be on site to accept and safely dispose of unused or outdated prescriptions and over-the-counter medications. There will not be a charge for this service. Please note that liquids, creams, syringes, lotions, Chemotherapy drugs, aerosols and inhalers, needles and mercury thermometers will not be accepted.
