

From our Town Chairman:

Happy Spring to everyone and happy late Mother's Day and early Father's Day to all.

We are coming into fireworks season. I must remind everyone that shooting fireworks in Liberty Grove requires a permit that is secured 14 days prior to the day you wish to display them. Permits can be found on line. Although it is not required by permit, the Town will be notifying your immediate neighbors that you will be having fireworks. Children, pets, even adults can be startled by the noise if they are not aware of what is generating it.

It is also the start of boating season. The Town has several launching areas, all requiring a launch permit or fee. It is \$5.00 if you are just paying for a single launch. You can also stop by the office from 8:30am until 1:00pm to buy a seasonal pass which will allow as many launches as you want for \$50.00. The launch fee applies to kayaks and canoes as well. The launch area on Garrett Bay Road is for non-motorized launches only. Kayaks may not be stored on the shore at this location as many launches take place in a single day. There is parking just across from the launch so I suggest parking and carrying your kayak or canoe across the road and then launch.

And finally, when driving through towns watch for pedestrian crossings. We are at the start of vacation season and many people crossing the streets, some of them not really paying attention to traffic.

## Lake Michigan Lake Levels

The predicted May 31<sup>st</sup> lake levels for Lakes Superior, Michigan-Huron, and St. Clair, are 3 to 4 inches above their levels of a month ago, while the levels of Lakes Erie and Ontario are within an inch of what they were a month ago. The forecasted May 31<sup>st</sup> levels of Lakes Superior, Michigan-Huron, and Ontario are 11, 2, and 14 inches, respectively, below what they were a year ago. Lake St. Clair is 2 inches above its level of a year ago, while Lake Erie currently matches its level of a year ago. Lake Ontario remains 3 inches below its long-term May monthly average, while Lakes Superior, Michigan-Huron, St. Clair, and Erie are 1, 5, 13, and 11 inches, respectively, above their long-term monthly averages. During June, Lakes Superior and Michigan-Huron are expected to rise 2 to 3 inches, while Lakes St. Clair and Erie are projected to fall 1 to 2 inches. Lake Ontario, however, is expected to hover around its current level. For more information, please see our Daily Levels web page.

## Fireworks

When shooting fireworks over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday please be aware that a permit is required through the Town office. It does require the signature of the Town Chairman and the Fire Chief.

**Please plan to get your permit early, issuance of a permit the day before is not possible. The deadline to request a permit is June 20th.**

It will require proof of liability insurance. That can be faxed to our office at 920-854-7366. Permit applications, are available on the Town's website.

## Outdoor Fires

Having an outdoor fire in the evening is always a fun family event. A portable fire pit with a mesh enclosure to capture hot embers is obviously the safest to use.

If you have an open fire pit, please remember that your fires should be no larger than a fire that you would cook over and should never be left unattended. Grass fires can start easily and get out of hand very quickly. Have a hose or a fire extinguisher nearby for safety.

Decorating the blue pickup truck at the **Klenke Garage** is a collaborative affair among the Liberty Grove Historical Society, Ellison Bay Service Club, and Door County North. Marcy Farber's design inspires many who stop to admire this iconic landmark. Living plants will be added later this spring.

A former cheese factory, the building sat vacant following Gust Klenke's death on January 29, 1982. In 2003, LGHS stabilized the deteriorating site. Members Gary and Marcy Farber moved a relative's old blue truck to the site around 2008 and filled the bed with seasonal decorations, keeping the addition looking "picture perfect." In November 2018 the Town of Liberty Grove took over the property with a county exemption from the DNR. Work is in progress to preserve the character of Klenke's Garage (*Living in God's Country*, p. 73).
