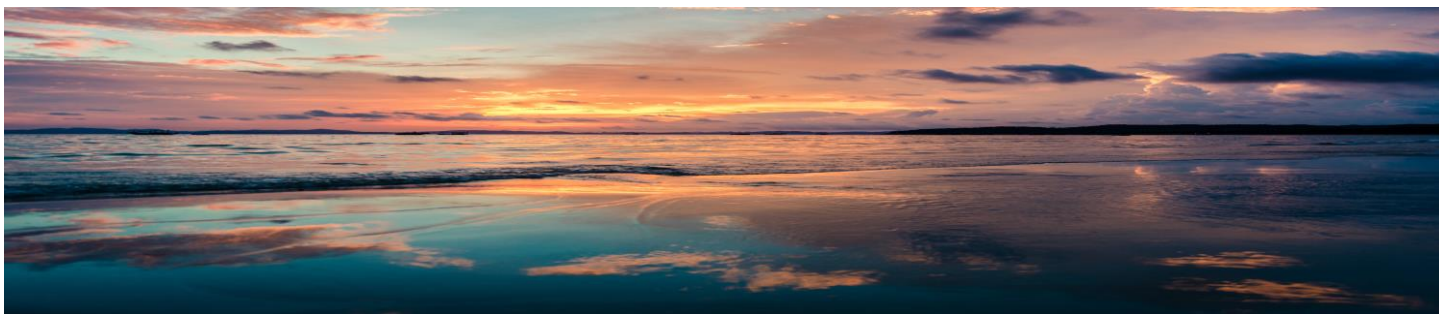
From our Town Chairman:

Lake Michigan Lake Levels

Forecasted water levels for August 30th on all lakes are below their levels from last month by up to 4 inches. Also, compared to levels of last year, the predicted August 30th levels are below last year's levels. Lake Superior is 7 inches below last year's level, Lake Michigan-Huron is 2 inches below its level from last year, and Lakes Ontario, St. Clair, and Erie are 4 to 6 inches below their levels from last year. The forecasted August 30th water levels are above their long-term average August levels on Lakes Michigan-Huron, St. Clair, and Erie. Lake Superior's forecasted level is 2 inches below its average August level, while Lake Ontario is near its August average level. By September 30th, water levels are projected to decline by 3 to 6 inches on Lakes Michigan-Huron, St. Clair, Erie, and Ontario, while Lake Superior is projected to be near its current level one month from now. The University of WI Oshkosh has been offering discounted well water quality testing through this program since 2019. The goal of this program is to provide education about the importance of testing your well water as well as build a database of groundwater quality data in Door County.

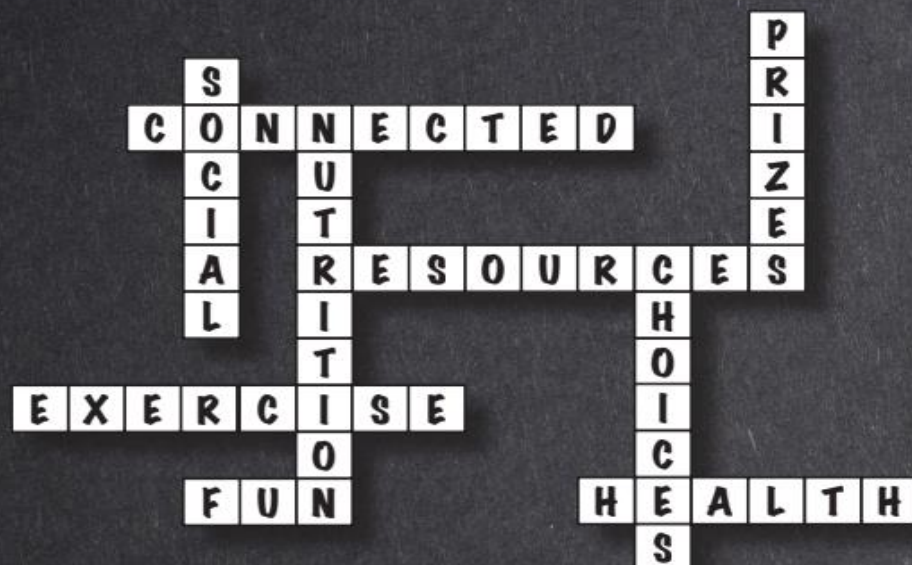
