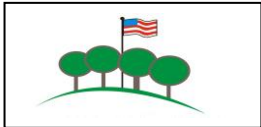

In the coming months, the Town will commence with chip sealing a few roads. There will be a thin layer of liquid tar and an application of gravel placed on top. This process lengthens the life of an asphalt road by a good 7 or 8 years and at about \$150,000.00 per mile, for asphalt we try to lengthen the life as much as we can. The chips used this year will be black not white, a better wearing product, that will meld better into the asphalt. Please remember while driving on a road that has been chip sealed, drive slowly so that the chips aren't thrown to the bottom of your vehicle. The more the road is driven on, the chips will stay down on the road and soon become part of the solid surface.

Boating Season

The boating season is upon us. The Town has several launching areas, all requiring a launch permit or fee. It is \$10.00 if you are just paying for a single launch. You can also stop at the Town office Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm to buy a seasonal pass which will allow unlimited launching for \$75.00. The launch fee applies to kayaks and canoes as well as jet skis. The launch on Garrett Bay Road is for non-motorized launch only. Kayaks may NOT be stored at this location as many launches take place daily. All watercraft requires a launch fee or seasonal pass.

Lake Michigan Lake Levels

Forecasted water levels for June 26th are 1 to 3 inches higher than last month and 2 to 7 inches higher than last year for Lakes Superior, Michigan-Huron, and St. Clair. The projected June 26th water levels for Lakes Erie and Ontario are both near their levels from last month, while Lake Erie is 1 inch below its level from last year and Lake Ontario is 13 inches higher compared to last year. Additionally, compared to their long-term average June levels Lakes Michigan-Huron, St. Clair, Erie, and Ontario are 2, 7, 4, and 14 inches above average, respectively, while Lake Superior is near its long-term average June level. All lakes are below record high June water levels by 15 to 32 inches and above record low June water levels by 24 to 48 inches, depending on the lake. By July 26th, Lake Superior is forecast to rise 2 inches, Lake Michigan-Huron is forecast to be near its current level, and Lakes St. Clair, Erie, and Ontario are projected to decline by 2 to 3 inches.

Process for building a home or placing an accessory building on your property

Many people call the office asking what the process is for adding structures to their property. Generally speaking, the County deals with the correct placement of structures on properties including well and septic. The Town deals with the actual construction of the dwellings and accessory structures. The Town is under County Zoning, so the first step is to go to the County Land Services department at 421 Nebraska St, Sturgeon Bay. The phone number is 920-746-2323. Once all County permits are approved, you would then come to the Town office to secure a building permit. Our building inspector has office hours on Thursday mornings from 8:30am to 10:00am. Appointments for other times are possible. Call Dave Enigl at 920-493-2294 to schedule a appointment outside of his regular Thursday office hours.
