Fifteen years ago, a deer in Brookville was a rarity. Today, the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) estimates that Long Island now has 25,000–30,000 deer. And it seems a lot of them are in our Village.

So it's not surprising that one of the most common calls we get has to do with deer and other wildlife.

Many calls are from dismayed residents complaining that deer have decimated their ornamental shrubs,

flowers, vegetable gardens and fruit trees. Unfortunately, all too many calls have to do with deceased wildlife that have fallen prey to suburban living.
