From the Village Hall

Garbage, Rubbish and Recyclables From Outside of Municipality: It shall be unlawful for any persons to place, deposit or cause to be deposited for collection, any garbage, rubbish or recyclable materials from outside the boundary limits of Reedsville into the Village unless authorized by an agreement with the Village.

Improper Use of Garbage, Rubbish or Recycling Receptacles: It shall be unlawful for any persons to place, deposit or cause to be deposited in or on any receptacle, or compost area not belonging to or assigned by the owner without the permission of the owner or designated assignee unless such receptacle or areas is designed expressly or implicitly for use by the general public.

Compost: Yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or leaving it at the Village compost site. Items NOT to be put in the compost are: stumps, roots, shrubs with intact root balls, animal waste, pine cones and sod.

Defecation on Private or Public Property: It shall be unlawful for any person owning or in control of a dog or cat to allow or permit such animal to defecate on any private or public property owned by another person. Violation of this shall be punishable by a forfeiture of anywhere from \$20.00 to \$200.00

Trick or Treat Hours: The Village of Reedsville will hold Trick or Treat on Sunday, October 28th from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM.

MINIMIZING YOUR RISK FOR BREAST CANCER

Approximately one in eight women will develop breast cancer during their lifetime. Here are a few key pieces of information to increase your understanding of breast cancer and help you prevent it.

Known risk factors for breast cancer include:

- Increasing age
- Family history of breast cancer
- Personal history of breast cancer
- Cumulative exposure to estrogen
- Having dense breasts
- Being overweight after menopause
- Not being physically active
- Drinking alcohol
- Not having children or having your first child after 30
- Receiving hormone replacement therapy after menopause



Mammograms can help reduce your risk for breast cancer. Aurora Health Care recommends women follow the American Cancer Society's (ACS) guidelines for breast cancer screenings:

- At age 25, women should be regularly asked questions related to their family history of breast cancer to determine whether they qualify for consultation with a genetics counselor.
- At age 30, women should be assessed as to whether they are considered *average risk*, *intermediate risk*, or *high risk* for developing breast cancer.
- Women at *high risk* should be considered for referral to a breast health specialist for consultation.
- Women at *intermediate risk* should have annual mammograms beginning at age 40.
- Women at *average risk* may be offered a mammogram at age 40. Annual mammograms should start by age 45.
- At age 55, women can transition to every other year mammograms, but could continue annual screening if they choose to do so.

Continue the discussion

Women should talk with their health care professional about their personal risk for breast cancer, and also talk with their mother, daughters, sisters and friends about the importance of having regular mammograms. Helping to educate each other on the facts of breast cancer and importance of early detection can help save a life.



The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on July 12, 2018, at 6:30 PM by Village President Jesse Walt. Present were: Joe Cummings, Jerry Reis, Patty Schreiber and Jack Siebert: Absent. Chad Rataichek. Also present were: Stacey Barth, Brad Busse, Justin Meyer, Craig Schuh, John Schuh, and Joe Tisler.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

Public Input: none.

A discussion was held regarding viewing the Public Officials E & O video. It was decided that the Village Board Members will view the video individually and sign a statement that they saw and understood it.

A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Schreiber to approve the minutes of the June 14, 2018 meeting as presented. Motion carried 4-0

A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$104,780.39. Motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Schreiber to approve Change Order #1 from Kip Gulseth Construction in the amount of \$20,781.36. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Schreiber to approve the Temporary Class B License Application from Holy Family Parish. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to approve the Soda License Application from Holy Family Parish. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to approve the Operator License Applications from Cassandra Alberts, Susan Miller and Andrew Krueger. Motion carried 3-0. (Schreiber abstained). A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to

approve the request to extend the noise ordinance hour to 12:30 on August 3rd & 4th, 2018 for WEBFEST. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to approve the Street Closure Request from Steve Webster to close 3rd Street from Manitowoc Street to Mill Street on August 3rd & 4th, 2018 from 3:00 pm until midnight. Motion carried 4-0.

The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Barth. The Police Dept. monthly written report was presented by Tisler. The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Meyer. C Schuh gave an update on the AT&T proposal & Memorandum of Understanding, Water tower painting project and the USDA loan application. He asked the Board to be go and view Village Streets as the projects need to be finalized at the next regular scheduled Village Board meeting for both the USDA and the LRIP. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to approve Change Order #1 on the Water tower project. Total cost for Water Tower Painting Project will be \$244,700.00. Motion carried 4-0. Discussion on sewer rates was postponed until the next regular scheduled Village Board meeting.
