Consumer Confidence Report (CCR): In May, a copy of the 2018 CCR was sent to all Reedsville Utility customers. If you did not receive it or want additional copies, the Report can be picked up at the Reedsville Municipal Building Lobby or found on the **Village Website:** www.reedsville.org under the Utility Department tab

Yard Waste: such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or taking it to the Village compost site.

Littering Street Prohibited: No person shall place, throw, deposit, dump, scatter, leave or permit to remain any rubbish, paper, stone, wire, manure, snow, ice, dirt, grass, leaves, construction or yard waste, dirt or filthy substance upon the street, gutter, sidewalk, alley or public ground in the village. Each owner or occupant of any building, dwelling house, store, shop, tenement or structure of any kind and description fronting or abutting on any street, sidewalk, gutter, alley or public ground shall clean the same by sweeping, scraping or shoveling such rubbish, dirt or filth from the sidewalk by or before twelve o'clock (12:00) noon of each day, and shall cooperate with the Public Works Dept. in keeping the streets, alleys, gutters and public grounds in a clean, tidy and orderly manner.

Operator Licenses: Some Operator Licenses expire at midnight on June 30th. Please look at your license to see when it expires. If you need to renew your license, a fill-in application can be found on the Reedsville Website at www.reedsville.org under the Forms & Permits tab or picked up at the Reedsville Municipal Building Lobby. **You must submit a copy of your driver's license with the application.** Cost of the license is \$25.00 for renewals and \$32.00 for new applicants. This is a 2 year license

Pool Owners: You must fill out the **Swimming Pool Discount Application** to qualify for the swimming pool discount. No other form of submittal will be accepted. A fill-in application can be found on the Reedsville Website at www.reedsville.org under the Forms & Permits tab or picked up at the Reedsville Municipal Building Lobby.

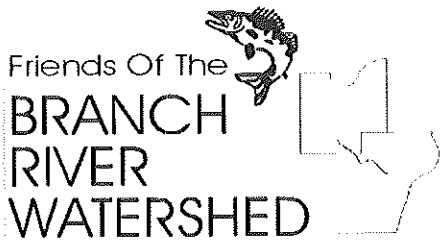

The Fire Dept. did not submit a monthly written report. Verbal update was presented by Walt.

The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Meyer. C Schuh gave an update on the AT&T Monopole Project and the Phosphorus Compliance Report. Rataichek has access to a tractor for a PTO for emergency pumping and harvester mixing. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Reis to approve the proposal from Vacuum, Pump and Compressor, Inc for a submersible pump in the amount of \$9,266.00. Motion carried 4-0.
