- 1. I would like to inform you of two upcoming public events, and ask that the Copake CAC has the Board's approval to cosponsor these events.
 - Nature's Best Hope: Earth Day at the Grange: Saturday April 22nd from 3:30 -5

Grassroots "call to action" to regenerate biodiversity and ecosystem function by planting natives and creating new ecosystem networks. A 45-minute video presentation will be followed by a 30-minute Q&A session with Copake CAC member Brian Boom and Columbia Land Conservancy President Troy Weldy.

Homegrown National Park: Saturday April 29th at 3 pm

This will be a very similar event, co-sponsored by the Ancram and Hillsdale CACs, Friends of Taconic State Park, the Ancram Resilient Farm and Garden Group, and the Roe Jan Library. In addition to approval to cosponsor this event, the Ancram CAC has asked us if we would be able to share the cost of wildflower seeds which will be distributed to attendees. \$80

2. Participation in the Punch Brook-Roe Jan Kill Watershed Characterization Advisory Committee
