Historic Map Project Summary

The Historic Preservation Committee (HPC) will create a professionally designed printed Historic Map brochure to communicate the Town of Copake's bicentennial Historic Markers Project. The map shall appeal to wide audiences in both Copake and across Columbia County to raise awareness about Copake history. The HPC estimates 50-75 owner participants. The brochure will include a town map that features 7 National Register properties along with other several notable properties. The final deliverable will be 3,000 printed color map brochures before Memorial Day weekend 2024.

Target Audience

Target Town of Copake residents and visitors from across Columbia County. Map brochures will be placed in Copake businesses and at public places e.g. (libraries and museums) and distributed county-wide by HPC members. Columbia County Tourism will distribute 300 brochures. The brochure will give credit to funders: Rheinstrom Hill Community Foundation, Columbia County Tourism.

Creative Requirements

Draw inspiration from the town's tagline: Land of Rural Charm

Draw inspiration from historic maps and photos to create a brochure that is visually appealing.

Design should place emphasis on images and less on copy.

Incorporate photos of featured historic properties as well as historic landscapes.

Project Goals

- 1. Create a beautiful map brochure that generates town excitement and civic pride!
- 2. Raise public awareness about Copake history and as a heritage destination.
- 3. Centerfold map will be visually appealing, and easy to read and comprehend.

If you choose to display the building marker, it will NOT place any burden or restrictions, whatsoever, upon you the owner or your property, nor will it affect your taxes or ability to make alterations. The Historic Preservation Committee will endeavor to provide installation assistance upon request.

OWNER PARTICIPATION FORM 2024 Bicentennial Historic Markers

PROJECT DETAILS

Selection Criteria

- Structures must have been built prior to 1924.
- Structures, especially the façade, must bear a recognizable similarity to how it appeared when constructed.
- Structures and their grounds must be reasonably well maintained.

Historic Marker Description

- The 5" x 8" commemorative marker is fabricated from an exterior-grade plastic with black background, engraved white letters and numbers, with 2 screw holes for mounting.
- The centered date is customized for each building to show the year constructed.
- The marker comes with two powder-coated stainless steel wood screws for mounting.



Installation Information

- Property owners shall install the marker by April 1st, 2024 or as soon thereafter as possible.
- It is recommended that the marker is installed to the right of the entrance or other prominent position at eye level, so that it is visible to passers-by.
- If an owner requests installation assistance, HPC will endeavor to provide this.

Other FAQs

- This program does NOT on its own imply the recognition of buildings as state historic sites.
- Property owners' participation in the marker project is voluntary.
- Marker placement does NOT place any burden or restriction upon the owner of the structure.
