## **Reduce Your Greenhouse Gas Emissions**

Every action, however small, is valuable. Here are some simple actions that residents and businesses can take to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

- Get a free home energy audit from <u>New York State Energy Research and Development Agency</u> (NYSERDA). An audit can show ways to save both energy and money through better insulation and more efficient heating and lighting.
- Compost and reduce food waste. Did you know that all Columbia County Transfer Stations now accept food waste? (Copake was a test case for this program!) You can recycle fruit and vegetable scraps, egg shells, and coffee grounds at your local <u>County Transfer Station</u>.
- Switch your lighting fixtures over to <u>Energy Efficient LED Bulbs</u>. They're more efficient and, in the long run, cheaper.
- Attend a free Repair Cafe. Repair Cafes are gatherings of volunteers who are handy at fixing a great variety of items. Rather than throw away that broken lamp, bicycle, appliance, tool, or gadget, bring it to a Repair Cafe! The Roe Jan Library will be hosting a Repair Cafe on September 28, 2024 at the Copake Memorial Park Building.
