

**DALE TOWN BOARD MEETING
JULY 13, 2026
DALE MUNICIPAL BUILDING**

Chairperson Wunderlich called the meeting to order at 7:00p.m., with Supervisor and Fire Chief Chad Degal, Supervisor Hopfensperger, Treasurer Sheri Wilkins, Clerk Jenny Hunt, and residents present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Outagamie County Deputy Bellerud was present. The Board informed Deputy Bellerud of a report that an individual had been staying overnight in Daufen Park in a van. The Sheriff's Department will monitor the situation.

Pat McGuire, a representative from the Alzena Subdivision, was present to discuss concerns regarding speeding within the subdivision. Mr. McGuire reported several incidents of near miss accidents in two areas with significant curves. He requested that the Town consider installing additional signage to alert drivers to slow down and warn of curves ahead. Chairperson Wunderlich will order and install signage.

Several residents from the Stone Crest Subdivision were in attendance to express concerns regarding an aggressive dog in their neighborhood. Residents reported that there have been four incidents involving the dog biting other dogs and/or people. They expressed concern for the safety of the neighborhood and stated that some residents have limited their outdoor activities for themselves and their children due to concerns about the dog. Town Attorney Steckbauer will review the matter and contact the dog owners regarding the reported incidents and concerns.

Fire Chief Degal reported nineteen calls for the month of June; sixteen EMS calls, one car accident, one controlled burn and one car fire.

Nine building permits were issued in the month of June; no new homes.

The planning commission met July 6th. Four representatives from Outagamie County Planning and Zoning were present to discuss the County's zoning code rewrite process. They answered questions from the Commission and provided an overview of the proposed changes and the process involved in updating the zoning code. They also explained the procedures available to municipalities for opting in to or opting out of County zoning.

Roads Report:

- Northeast Asphalt will begin the School Road grind and reclaim project later this week.
- The first round of ditch mowing is complete and pothole patching continues throughout Town.
- Discussion took place regarding brush within Town road right of ways that needs to be cut back. Funding will be included in next year's budget to address brush cutting.

Supervisor Degal made a motion to approve the minutes of the June meeting, seconded by Supervisor Hopfensperger, motion carried.

The Partisan Primary Election will be held on August 11, 2026. Polls will be open from 7:00a.m. – 8:00p.m.

Chairperson Wunderlich made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report subject to audit, seconded by Supervisor Hopfensperger, motion carried. Treasurer Wilkins reported that the Town received the 2% dues check. She also reported that Nationwide will no longer be the provider for the Town's deferred compensation

program and that the program will be transitioned to a new provider. Treasurer Wilkins will provide additional information as it becomes available.

Supervisor Hopfensperger reported that there may be grant funding available through the State to assist municipalities with the removal of dead ash trees. The Town will look into potential grant opportunities and eligibility requirements.

Supervisor Degal made a motion to pay bills #21785 - 21822 seconded by Supervisor Hopfensperger, motion carried.

Supervisor Degal made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Supervisor Hopfensperger, motion carried.
