Dog Licenses

All dogs in the town are required to be licensed under county ordinance by state law. A dog license is \$5 for spayed or neutered. \$10 for all others. Make the check payable to Town of Merrimac. **Include your rabies vaccinations certificate and a self-addressed return envelope**. Mail to the Town of Merrimac at PO Box 115, Merrimac, 53561. Dog license fees are collected every tax collection period and are considered late after April 1 and a \$5 late fee is assessed.

Property Taxes

Your first installment (or to pay in full) by January 31st of each year and are sent to the Town. After January 31st, mail them to Sauk County. The second installment is due July 31st to the Sauk County Treasurer. Please pay attention to the payment stubs and mail your payment to the right location to assure timely processing. Taxes will be collected Monday through Friday from 10am until 2pm (unless otherwise noted on the town website). We accept most major credit cards online and in the office for an additional fee. A postmark or online payment equals a timely payment! Once payments are processed, you can obtain a receipt online https://townofmerrimac.net/taxes-property-info/ (Have a copy of your tax bill ready!) or by including a self-addressed stamped envelope.

Sauk Prairie Recreation Department Reimbursement

If you participate in a Sauk Prairie Recreation Department activity and are assessed the additional \$20.00 non-participating community fee, the Town will reimburse you that amount. Simply mail (Mail to the Town of Merrimac at PO Box 115, Merrimac, 53561) or email (townmerr@tds.net) a copy of your paid receipt. There is no limit on the number of programs you submit for reimbursement.

ATTENTION CYCLISTS! State Trail Passes sold here!

Every trail pass sold locally helps support the long-term maintenance of the Great Sauk State Trail and *can be used statewide*. A state trail pass is required for all people age 16 or older for biking, cross-country skiing, horseback riding or in-line skating on certain trails. Mail a separate check for \$25 per pass made payable to the Town of Merrimac at PO Box 115, Merrimac, 53561. A daily pass is \$5. An application can be printed out at https://townofmerrimac.net/licences-permits/.

Driveway and highway culverts.

If the culvert runs under your driveway not only do you own that culvert, it is your responsibility to keep it clear and in operating condition. If there is a culvert on your property that is in the right-of-way, we ask that you maintain this area as well. It is very similar to the responsibility of any city or village property owner has to keep an adjacent storm drain clear. In extreme circumstances you should call the town hall at (608) 493-2588, but if it is an emergency situation (immediate damage to persons or property), please contact Sheriff Dispatch at (608) 356-4895.

No Parking!

Parking on the paved surface of the road is not permitted per state statute. Vehicles can be parked in the right-of-way (the shoulder) on a short-term basis, but long-term storage of vehicles is prohibited by town ordinance and cannot exceed 72 hours.

NEW LOCATION- YARD WASTE COLLECTION DAYS!

We will collect yard waste two days a year at the **Town of Merrimac's collection site** at S7198 Goette Rd. Normal yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, branches and other brush will be accepted. Your load will be inspected and any other materials will require us to turn you away if we are going to continue offering this service in the future. Watch our website for more information.
