PUBLIC POSTING NOTICES

Updated Statues 985.02 (2)(a): public notices will be posted in the town hall entrance and on our website. (Example-Meeting agenda, minutes, meeting date changes, annual budget and other notices). No longer will you see posting in the 3 posting boxes located throughout the township.

TAX BILL IMPROVEMENTS

Improvements removed from land must be gone completely and inspected by the township appraiser before January 1st of the tax year to be removed from rolls. Otherwise the improvement will be taxed until the following January 1st and then removed from the rolls.

TOWN HALL RENTAL

You can rent YOUR town hall for your events. Chairs, tables, coffeemaker, refrigerator supplied in a nice kitchen area with a large serving counter. Hall has a capacity of 70 and is wheelchair accessible. Rental fee is \$50.00 for town residents plus security deposit. Reassessment was completed in 2022. If you have any questions, contact Justin Schumacher directly 920-766-9166, not your town board members.



Railroad Crossings

Early in 2022, the Wisconsin Railroad Commission informed us that they were evaluating 3 railroad crossings for possible closures in our township: on Brandon, Sheldon and Sunny Knoll roads. After their evaluations, we were notified they would be closing Sunny Knoll Road railroad crossing. Your town board challenged this ruling, and with the help of Fond du Lac County Highway Commission, and State Representatives, we were given a list of safety issues that needed to be corrected to keep the road open.

Take a drive down Sunny Knoll Road and see the improvements that were made to make the crossing safe. Special thanks to Ryan Arndt for his professional assistance. This unexpected project cost about \$20,000 of town money, but we have secured the non-closure of all Railroad crossings in our township.







UPDATES FROM THE BRANDON PUBLIC LIBRARY

The library has become more than a place to pick up books, and this is especially the case at the Brandon Public Library. Besides books, there are books on tape, DVDs, music CDs, and magazines available as well. We can get anything you need. Our Library is a part of the Winnefox Library System. So, if we don't have what you're looking for in-house, we can "borrow" from any of the other 29 libraries in the Winnefox System with a 5-day delivery, or they can even acquire from outside the system (state or nation-wide). You can stop in any time to use our fax machine, color printer/copier/scanner, public computers and find Wi-Fi available 24/7. In addition to all these resources, we offer many programs throughout the year. With the support from the Friends of the Brandon Public Library, a non-profit group of volunteers that raise money to assist in the library's programs and services, the library offers monthly craft nights, additional WIFI HotSpots - connect to the internet wherever US Cellular works, additional Roku Devices with streaming services - using high-speed home Internet service (or a HotSpot borrowed for free from the library), you can enjoy Netflix,

We are currently waiting to hear the guidelines from a federal grant received before the project goes out for bid. We might be seeing construction this summer! RECYCLING

Dumpsters will remain open for your convenience 24-7 with no attendant until we can hire a new one. At this time Township is looking to hire a new attendant for 1 Monday night a month and 1 Saturday morning a

month to man our dumpster and help town residents to unload recycling. Wage would be \$17 an hour. If interested contact chairman Jeff Amend at 920-428-5390 We have also gotten a lot of unwanted matter in the dumpsters by leaving the doors open, please remember that only recyclables may be placed in dumpsters, all bags must be emptied and take the plastic bag with you and put in your garbage do not leave in the dumpster. Also please break down any boxes as flat as possible to save room in the dumpsters. Recycling costs have again risen this year, we get about \$650 a year in DNR grants for our recycling but town recycling costs are in excess of 12,000 a year. Please make sure you watch what is put into the recycling so we are not charged extra for unwanted material.





TOWN ROAD WORK

In following our 5-year road maintenance plan, the township will be repairing Radio Rd from Hwy 44 South to updated blacktop this year. Cracking filling will also be done on the town roads as needed.



TAX COLLECTION

We **encourage** you to pay by mail to avoid waiting in line. Payment amounts are included on the payment stubs located at the bottom of our tax bill. Enclose the appropriate payment stubs with your payment. Mail payments to the location listed on the payment stub (note December/January address is DIFFERENT than the July payment address). Please do not enclose the original tax bill.

Payments will be accepted in the form of a check, cashier's check or money order. Certify that an escrow check meets or exceeds the tax bill amount and endorse the escrow check. Overpayments will be refunded within 2 weeks of payment.

WARNING: If payment is not made by the due dates, the installment option is lost and the total tax is delinquent and subject to interest and penalty. See the reverse side of your property tax bill for a complete explanation.

Self Addressed stamped envelope is needed if you want a receipt.
