**6.10.010 Purpose.**

The purpose of this chapter is to regulate the collection, dumping and disposal of garbage, rubbish, refuse and recyclable materials by persons or other entities within the Town of Oregon. Because of the possible danger to the health, safety and welfare of the public and due to a deep concern for the environment, such collection, dumping or disposal within the Town of Oregon shall only be permitted under the terms and conditions set forth below. [Ord. 41 § 1, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.1.]

**6.10.020 Definitions.**

“Bi-metal container” means a container for carbonated or fermented malt beverages that is made primarily of a combination of steel and aluminum.

“Collector” means the person or entity specifically authorized by the Town Board to collect garbage, rubbish and recyclable materials and to dispose of the same.

“Container board” means heavy-duty Kraft paper packaging material with a corrugated medium between two (2) flat paper liners used in the manufacture of shipping containers and related products, but excluding paper board such as used in cereal or laundry detergent boxes or holders for beverage cans and bottles.

“Dumping” or “disposal” includes, but is not limited to, unloading, throwing away, discarding, emptying, abandoning, discharging, burning or burying waste, garbage, refuse, yard waste, rubbish, or sludge on, into or under any property or lands, whether publicly or privately owned, within the Town of Oregon.

“Foam polystyrene packaging” means packaging made primarily from foam polystyrene that satisfies one (1) of the following criteria:

1. Is designed for serving food or beverages;
2. Consists of loose particles intended to fill space and cushion packaged articles in shipping containers;
3. Consists of rigid materials shaped to hold and cushion packaged articles in shipping containers.

“Garbage” means all waste which rots or decomposes.

“Hazardous waste” or “hazardous substance” means an item which requires special handling to avoid illness or injury to persons or damage to property or the environment, as defined in Wis. Admin. Code Ch. NR 181, as amended from time to time pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 144.62 (1989-1990), or other acts

pursuant to authority vested in the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to describe and list materials that are hazardous, and further including those solid substances found in household waste.

“HDPE plastic” means containers constructed of high density polyethylene, labeled by the SPI Code No. 2.

“Heavy objects” include, but are not limited to, major appliances, tires (up to four (4) constitute one (1) large item), mattresses, box springs, and auto or machinery parts over ten (10) pounds in weight or two (2) feet in length.

“LDPE plastic” means containers constructed of low density polyethylene, labeled by the SPI Code No. 4.

“Lead-acid batteries” shall mean automotive and related batteries that are comprised of lead plates with an acid electrolyte and does not include nickel-cadmium batteries, dry cell (flashlight) batteries or batteries used in calculators, watches, hearing aids or similar devices.

“Magazines” means magazines, catalogs, and other material printed on glossy paper.

“Major appliance” means a residential or commercial air conditioner, clothes dryer, clothes washer, dishwasher, freezer, refrigerator, microwave oven, oven, stove, water heater, furnace, boiler, dehumidifier, or any other item commonly referred to as “white goods.”

“Metal container” means tin-coated steel cans, bi-metal cans and aluminum cans used for food and other nonhazardous materials, but excluding aerosol cans and cans that held paint, paint-related products, pesticides or other toxic or hazardous substances.

“Multifamily dwelling” means a dwelling containing four (4) or more residential units, including condominiums, as well as dwelling units occupied seasonally.

“Newspaper” means printed matter excluding shiny surface paper and bound publications such as books, magazines, catalogs, phone books or similar publications.

“Noncollectable items” include, but are not limited to, concrete, construction materials, animal droppings, stumps, stones or cement blocks, televisions, fuel tanks of any type and drums larger than twenty (20) gallons.

“Nonrecyclable material” means all material for which the Town of Oregon or its representative collector cannot establish a present reasonable value for its collection as a recyclable.

“Office paper” means high grade printing and writing papers from small businesses and other commercial enterprises. Printed white ledger and computer printout are examples of office paper generally accepted as high grade. This term excludes industrial process waste.

“Other paper” means all paper except newspaper, container board, magazines and office paper, but including grades of fiber materials with available markets for recycling.

“Other resins or multiple resins” means plastic materials labeled by the SPI Code No. 7.

“PETE plastic containers” means containers constructed of polyethylene terephthalate, labeled by the SPI Code No. 1.

“PP plastic” means containers constructed of polypropylene, labeled by the SPI Code No. 5.

“PS plastic” means containers constructed of polystyrene, labeled by the SPI Code No. 6.

“PVC plastic” means containers constructed of polyvinyl chloride, labeled by the SPI Code No. 3.

“Recyclable material” means identified material needing preparation standards, and including the following: newspaper, container board, unbroken brown, green and clear glass containers, metal containers, blow-molded HDPE and PETE containers, waste tires, waste oil, lead-acid batteries, magazines, yard waste, office paper and major appliances. “Recyclable materials” further means identified materials meeting preparation standards where economical markets or short-term storage is available, and shall include the following: other paper, HDPE containers that are not blow-molded, PS containers, PVC containers, PP containers, LDPE containers, other resins or multiple resins, bi-metal containers and other materials determined to have economical markets available.

“Refuse” means discarded material including, but not limited to, trash, rubbish, paper, wood, metal, glass, plastic, rubber, cloth, ashes, litter and street rubbish, industrial waste, dead animals, gravel pit and

quarry spoils, toxic and hazardous waste, heavy objects, noncollectable items and material and debris resulting from construction or demolition.

“Residential unit” means an independent household capable of individual habitation by a family unit. A single-family dwelling shall be considered to be one (1) residential unit. Multifamily dwellings shall be considered to have multiple residential units, with a number of residential units equal to the number of family units to be housed therein. Residential units shall not include commercial housing businesses, such as motels, boarding houses or resorts.

“Rubbish” means all waste which does not easily rot or decompose, nor is considered recyclable. Rubbish specifically excludes yard waste, heavy objects and noncollectable items.

“Sludge” means sewage treatment residue in any form.

“Small business” means a business producing a maximum of four (4) thirty (30) gallon bags of garbage or the equivalent of four (4) thirty (30) gallon bags of garbage per week.

“Tires” for collection purposes shall mean rubber tires, including automobile and light truck tires, whose size is less than 1100 x 24.5.

“Waste” means garbage, refuse, rubbish and all other discarded or salvageable material, including waste materials resulting from industrial, commercial and agricultural operations and from domestic and public service activities.

“Waste oil” means any contaminated or no longer suitable for use petroleum-derived or synthetic oil including, but not limited to, engine and other mechanical lubricants, hydraulic and transmission fluid, metal working fluid and insulating fluid or coolant. In no event shall waste oil include gasoline.

“Yard waste” consists of three (3) categories defined as follows:

1. “Yard debris” is nonwoody plant material, including but not limited to garden waste, weeds, fruits, vegetables, flowers, grass clippings, sod and shrubbery clippings of less than six (6) inches in length.

2. “Leaves” are defined as foliage of deciduous trees.

3. “Brush” is woody plant material not greater than four (4) inches in diameter and not greater than ten (10) feet in length. [Ord. 45 §§ 1 – 5, 1994; Ord. 41 § 2, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.2.]

#### **6.10.030 Curbside collection.**

The Town of Oregon reserves the right to refuse the services of any potential collector based on price, past performance or lack of prior experience. Acceptable collectors must be willing to provide a phone number to residents to call for clarification of curbside collection rules. Acceptable collectors must also be able and willing to demonstrate, to the Town Board of the Town of Oregon, their adequate understanding of this chapter.

Curbside collection may be arranged for by an individual resident or a group of residents (subdivision or street). Residential units receiving curbside collection will be subject to all the provisions of this chapter including those regarding the separation of recyclable materials or prohibition of noncollectable items. Residential units receiving curbside collection will be charged for each bag or can (not to exceed thirty (30) gallons) of nonrecyclable materials. The intent is to provide an incentive for residents receiving curbside collection to recycle.

Businesses, commercial enterprises, remodeling and new construction projects, and multifamily dwellings are responsible for the contracting of their own garbage, rubbish and recyclable material collection. Disposal of such waste is specifically banned from the Town of Oregon Recycling Center without the express written permission of the Town Board of the Town of Oregon.

Structures containing more than one (1) and less than three (3) residential units must maintain distinct and separate collection points for each unit which allows the collector to recognize violations or problems in complying with this chapter by individual residential unit. The collector has the right and responsibility to refuse pickup from those entities violating this chapter. The collector will provide a printed explanation of why pickup was refused on a particular item by leaving a self-adhesive sticker containing an adequate explanation stuck to the item. The sticker will also contain a phone number at the collector’s offices

where the resident may call for clarification of this chapter or curbside collection rules. [Ord. 45 § 6, 1994; Ord. 41 § 3, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.3.]

#### **6.10.040 Town of Oregon Recycling Center (TORC).**

The Town of Oregon will operate a recycling center for the purpose of collecting recyclables, nonrecyclables, garbage, rubbish and yard waste for those residents who do not receive curbside collection. Residents who receive curbside collection may voluntarily utilize this facility although this action will not abrogate their financial responsibility to their collector.

Any delivery to the TORC will be enclosed as in a trunk, tarped truck or in sealed containers so as to provide for adequate prevention of litter on roads or in the general vicinity of the TORC. Uncovered loads will be refused at the TORC.

The Town of Oregon will staff the TORC and maintain public hours which, at a minimum, will be two (2) Saturdays each month for eight (8) hours each day it is open. Hours or days of operation may be extended at the Town Board's discretion. The Town of Oregon also reserves the right to determine separate schedules for receiving certain materials. Under no circumstances will entities other than employees or agents of the Town of Oregon be permitted in the TORC outside of the posted hours of operation without the expressed written permission of the Town Board.

The Town of Oregon Recycling Center will provide, at a minimum, the following facilities:

- a. Collection bins for the separation and collection of newspapers, clear glass bottles and jars, brown glass bottles and jars, PETE and HDPE containers, office paper, container board, metal cans and magazines. If technology allows and cost does not prohibit, the Town of Oregon may opt for the intermingling of recyclable materials.
- b. A compactor for the collection of nonrecyclable garbage or rubbish for ultimate delivery to a designated Dane County landfill or other disposal site.
- c. A compost pile for the disposal of leaves or yard debris.
- d. A collection container for waste oil.
- e. A burnpad for brush, clean wood, and sawdust. Dumping of any other yard waste, nonrecyclable paper products, metal, plastic, rubber, glass, chemicals, oil, recyclable material or any other material specifically banned from the burnpad will be in violation of this chapter.
- f. A drop point for scrap metal such as metal paint cans, lawn furniture, small appliances or other metal objects which can be easily lifted. Arrangement for disposal of large deliveries of metal or heavy objects should be made with an individual contractor and cannot be delivered to the TORC.
- g. A collection point for tires.
- h. A collection point for lead-acid batteries.

The Town of Oregon Recycling Center will charge a fee for each container of garbage or rubbish (not to exceed thirty (30) gallons) placed into the compactor. The Town of Oregon will provide a system to charge residents for such usage which will at least equal the operation cost of the TORC. Monies gained from the sale of recyclables or other materials will be used to defray the total operating costs of the TORC. [Ord. 45 § 7, 1994; Ord. 41 § 4, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.4.]

#### **6.10.050 Separation of recyclable materials.**

The Town Board of the Town of Oregon mandates that commencing upon the effective date of the ordinance codified in this chapter, provided hereinafter, all entities within the Town of Oregon shall separate recyclable materials from garbage, rubbish, yard waste, heavy objects and noncollectable items.

a. Disposition of Recyclables. Residents who receive curbside pickup will use a method for separating recyclable material from other items in conformity with the rules of the collector. Residents using the TORC will separate all recyclables into the appropriate bins provided at the TORC. Residents also have the option of delivering recyclable materials to the recycling center of their choice.

b. Disposition of Yard Waste – Brush, Leaves and Yard Debris. Town of Oregon residents will neither receive curbside pickup of yard waste, nor will these items be accepted on the compactor at the TORC.

Residents may either: (1) pay a private contractor for the removal of these materials; (2) transport the materials to a Dane County compost site; (3) transport leaves and yard debris to the TORC composting site; (4) transport brush to the TORC burn pad; or (5) compost the materials on their personal compost pile.

c. Disposition of Heavy and Noncollectable items. Heavy or noncollectable items will not be picked up in curbside service nor will they be accepted at the TORC. Town residents may contact either the Town Hall or their collector for advice in handling these items. When possible, Town residents are urged to arrange pickup of old appliances by the seller of new appliances. [Ord. 45 § 8 – 10, 1994; Ord. 41 § 5, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.5.]

#### **6.10.060 Preparation of recyclable materials.**

Recyclable materials shall be prepared in the following manner, whether the materials are for curbside collection or delivery to the TORC:

a. Newspapers, office paper and magazines shall be dry and bundled in eight (8) to ten (10) inch bundles, boxed or placed in paper sacks.

b. Glass containers shall be empty, unbroken, rinsed and free of metal caps and rings and other contaminants such as window glass, drinking glass, ceramics, Pyrex, light bulbs, mirrors, china and similar material.

c. Metal cans shall be rinsed and have labels removed. Metal food cans should have ends removed and be flattened. Soft drink cans should be crushed.

d. Container board shall be dry, flattened, free of food debris and other contaminated materials and bundled into eight (8) to ten (10) inch bundles.

e. Plastic containers shall be rinsed and have metal and plastic rings and tops removed.

f. Lead-acid batteries shall have all caps firmly attached and be free from leaks.

g. Waste oil shall be from motor vehicles, free of contaminants, and in tightly sealed, nonleaking containers.

h. Additional preparation standards may be provided by notice to generators of waste and collectors/haulers, or by amendment to this section when other materials become recyclable depending on available economic markets. [Ord. 45 § 11, 1994; Ord. 41 § 6, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.6.]

#### **6.10.070 Requirements for multifamily dwellings.**

a. Owners of multifamily dwellings shall provide adequate, separate containers for handling and collection of recyclable materials enabling tenants to ensure that recyclable materials meet preparation standards. Owners shall provide containers for the complex or sub-units thereof marked for the collection of recyclable material to be shared in common by occupants of the multifamily dwellings. Such containers need not include provisions for major appliances, lead-acid batteries or used oil.

b. Owners of multifamily dwellings shall provide sufficient containers to accommodate the collection of the volume of recyclable materials generated by the occupants of the multifamily dwellings. The number of containers shall be sufficient to enable the handling, transportation and processing requirements of the collector or private hauler.

c. Owners of multifamily dwellings shall clearly mark and designate containers to be used for recyclable materials as required by Town rules and regulations. Such containers shall be maintained in a clean, safe and watertight condition. [Ord. 41 § 7, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.7.]

#### **6.10.080 Notification required.**

a. Owners of rental property shall notify all tenants on move-in, and on a regular basis thereafter at least semi-annually, of Town and Dane County recycling requirements.

b. Owners of commercial, retail, industrial, and governmental facilities will notify all users, including employees, agents and customers, on a regular basis at least semi-annually, of Town and Dane County recycling requirements. [Ord. 41 § 8, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.7.]

**6.10.090 Collection by unauthorized entities.**

Any recyclable materials placed at curbside for collection or brought to the TORC are the property of the Town of Oregon or the Town's collector or an authorized private collector unless specifically refused by the collector or the TORC. It is unlawful for any person other than those authorized by the Town Board of the Town of Oregon to collect or pick up or cause to be collected or picked up any recyclable materials. Any and each such collection in violation hereof from any recyclable material container shall constitute a separate and distinct offense punishable as hereinafter provided. [Ord. 41 § 9, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.9.]

**6.10.100 Disposal or dumping permit.**

Except as expressly permitted in this section, no individual or entity shall dump or dispose of waste, garbage, or rubbish within the Town of Oregon unless a permit to engage in such dumping or disposal is first obtained from the Town of Oregon under the conditions prescribed herein.

Exceptions to this requirement are:

- a. Sites used for dumping or disposal of yard waste or garbage from a residential unit or small business providing that such yard waste is placed in suitable composting containers or composted in such a way as not to cause a public or private nuisance.
- b. The use of sanitary privies and what are commonly known as seepage beds or septic tanks, which conform to applicable ordinances of the Town of Oregon, or the discharge of waste products into any existing public sewage system located within the Town of Oregon.
- c. A farm on which only animal waste resulting from the operation of the farm is disposed of.
- d. Any dumping operation under the direction and control of the Town of Oregon.

Persons or entities who are permitted by the Town of Oregon to engage in dumping or disposal operations shall do so in a manner which does not constitute a public or private nuisance and in a way so that dust, dirt, and debris will not be carried by the wind across the boundary of the land parcel on which said operation is taking place. A suitable covering of gravel or dirt shall be placed within a reasonable time so as to make the dumping site compatible with the surrounding property and not to depreciate property values within the immediate area.

A public hearing will be held on any application for a permit to engage in dumping or disposal operations. The application shall be on file with the Town Clerk at least thirty (30) days before the public hearing and include the name and address of the applicant, an explanation of the nature and purpose of the dumping or disposal and a detailed description of the dumping or disposal plan.

A notice of the public hearing shall be given as a Class 3 notice as described in Wis. Stat. § 985.07 (1989-1990). The cost of such publication shall be deposited by the applicant in advance.

The Town Board reserves the right to require the applicant to post a bond, the condition of which will be that this chapter shall be observed, that the dumping or disposal plan shall be carried out and any penalties imposed shall be paid. If any part of this chapter is violated and after a reasonable time the violation is not corrected, the Town of Oregon reserves the right to correct the violation and to charge the expense to the bond. The applicant, in making the application for a dumping or disposal permit, grants to the Town of Oregon the right to go onto the land to carry out the plan, if the applicant fails to do so in a reasonable time, at the owner's or occupant's expense.

Revocation of a dumping or disposal notice may be accomplished upon a published Class 1 notice by the Town of Oregon. [Ord. 45 § 12, 1994; Ord. 41 § 10, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.10.]

**6.10.110 State law.**

Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to limit or restrict the application of any state law or administrative regulation of any state agency regulating the subject of this chapter. [Ord. 41 § 11, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.11.]

**6.10.120 Severability and conflict.**

Should any section, clause or provision of this chapter be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this chapter as a whole or any part thereof other than the part so declared to be invalid. [Ord. 41 § 12, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.12.]

**6.10.130 Fines for violation.**

Any person violating this chapter shall be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each offense. Fines may be levied in addition to payment for reparation of damages created to or cleanup required of public or private property. Agents or employees of the Town of Oregon may opt to issue a warning on first offenses in lieu of a fine depending on the severity of the violation and the violator's willingness to immediately correct violation. Imprisonment in the county jail can be ordered only for failure to pay fines or reparation expenses and shall be limited to one (1) day of confinement for each \$25.00 of fine or ordered reparation expense.

Any individual, corporation or municipality who places waste, garbage, refuse, yard waste, rubbish, heavy objects, noncollectable items or sludge on either public or private property anywhere within the Town of Oregon limits in a manner not in compliance with this chapter shall be subject to the fines set forth in this section. [Ord. 41 § 13, 1991. Prior code § 6.2.13.]

**6.15.010 Use of site.**

No person shall use or deposit any solid waste or refuse at the solid waste disposal site, hereinafter referred to as the “facility,” operated by the Town of Oregon in the Town of Oregon, Dane County, Wisconsin, unless said person is a resident of the Town of Oregon. [Ord. 17 § 1, 1975. Prior code § 6.3.1.]

**6.15.020 Identification of user.**

Any user of the facility shall, upon demand by the site attendant, present identification in the form of a valid Wisconsin driver’s license showing that said user is a bona fide resident of the Town of Oregon, Dane County, Wisconsin. [Ord. 17 § 2, 1975. Prior code § 6.3.2.]

**6.15.030 Sticker identification system.**

The Town Board may require that each Town of Oregon resident who intends to use the facility obtain from the Town Board, at such times as shall be reasonably prescribed by the Town Board, a sticker which the resident shall then attach to the windshield of each vehicle in which he intends to transport solid waste or other refuse to the facility. Any vehicle used to transport solid waste or other refuse to the facility shall have a sticker attached to its windshield. [Ord. 17 § 3, 1975. Prior code § 6.3.3.]

**6.15.040 Hours of operation.**

The facility shall be available for use as aforesaid by Town of Oregon residents at such hours as prescribed by the Town Board. No person shall use the facility except during said hours. [Ord. 17 § 4, 1975. Prior code § 6.3.4.]

**6.15.050 Sign to be posted.**

A sign shall be posted at the facility gate stating the terms and conditions of use of the facility as herein prescribed. [Ord. 17 § 5, 1975. Prior code § 6.3.5.]

**6.15.060 Penalty.**

Any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$200.00 together with the costs of prosecution. [Ord. 17 § 6, 1975. Prior code § 6.3.6.]

**6.15.070 Severability.**

The provisions of this chapter shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the Town Board would have passed the other provisions of the ordinance codified in this chapter irrespective of whether or not one (1) or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provision of this chapter or the

application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this chapter and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby. [Ord. 17, 1975. Prior code § 6.3.7.]

The cost of the unit can be offset by qualifying for state and federal grants and through ad revenues generated by the ad panels and laminate wraps available for the unit.

The compactor includes receptacles for collecting plastic bottles, newspapers, glass and other recyclables to make recycling easier. Choosing compaction versus collection via the Solar Powered Compactor improves recycling rates, helps keep recyclables clean, preserves valuable resources, and

reduces CO2 emissions, fostering compliance with increasingly stringent regulations and enhancing LEED and sustainability initiatives.

## Universal Waste Collection

In the past, proper handling of household hazardous waste has required residents to transport it to specific drop-off sites prepared to safely handle such materials as batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, and sharps. Waste Management offers Oregon residents and businesses specialized disposal solutions for this special, difficult to handle waste.



### *Waste Management Tracker® Programs*

Waste Management created our line of waste trackers to provide a convenient solution for recycling of wastes that are normally not included in a curbside service. This offering is not currently available from other solid waste competitors and complies with regulations in those states that prohibit land filling of these wastes.

- **MedWaste Tracker®.** Waste Management offers a safe, convenient solution for residents who inject medications from home. It is the kind of system recommended by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for safe needle disposal—a total system, providing for containment, collection, and destruction of used needles. MedWaste Tracker® allows residents to safely contain the sharps and lancets used in their personal healthcare programs. When the Tracker is full, customers simply mail them back to Waste Management for environmentally correct treatment and disposal. The kit comes complete with everything they need—including box, postage, and label.
- **LampTracker®.** This program provides residents and businesses with specially designed boxes, including an option that reduces the risk of mercury vapor exposure when handling broken bulbs. Customers ship the full boxes directly to Waste Management for safe disposal and recycling of the reusable elements. Types of bulbs recycled include fluorescent tubes, U-bents, CFLs, HIDs, and UV bulbs. Recycling of compact fluorescent lamps. Holds up to 13 13-watt CFLs. Includes our patented Mercury VaporLok® bags which prevent leakage of mercury vapor if bulbs break during storage or transport. Prepaid postage to our recycling facilities for tracking and recycling.
- **BatteryTracker® and BallastTracker®.** These programs facilitate recycling of alkaline, NiCD, NiMH, silver oxide, mercury, or non-spillable lead acid batteries and non-PCB lighting ballasts. Recycling of consumer batteries from homes. Holds up to 4 pounds of dry cell batteries. Includes prepaid postage to our recycling centers for certified tracking and recycling.
- **MercuryTracker®.** Our MercuryTracker® enables recycling of electrical and medical equipment and devices such as thermostats and thermometers.
- **e-Waste Kits.** Three sizes of e-waste boxes are available for recycling of home electronics including cell phones, PDAs, keyboards, mice, stereos, radios, speakers, CRTs, CDs, DVDs, electronic toys, TVs and more. The largest kit will hold up to 70 pounds. Includes prepaid shipping and recycling.
- **Bottle Can and Paper Recycling Kits.** Offers single stream recycling for residents that don't have a curbside offering. There is no need to separate recyclables and includes a return shipping label to a recycling facility.

## Equipment

At Waste Management, we watch our equipment closely and replace it whenever it fails to meet our high operational and aesthetic standards. Our drivers continuously survey compactors, bins, containers, and other equipment and immediately call in repair or replacement orders when they identify damaged or defaced equipment.



When a maintenance issue is reported for one of our owned compactors, we dispatch a maintenance technician to analyze the performance of the unit and repair it on site as quickly as possible. Depending on the market, the maintenance is performed by a Waste Management technician or a qualified contractor. All maintenance services, from preventive service to adjustments to major overhauls, can be coordinated through Waste Management for any piece of compaction and baling equipment.

## Fleet

With almost 21,000 vehicles, Waste Management has taken significant steps to ensure that our fleet addresses environmental and safety issues.

- All new residential and commercial trucks are equipped with back-up cameras for improved visibility and safety.
- The hydraulic systems and components on Waste Management trucks have been redesigned and refined to reduce the potential for leaks and spills.
- Waste Management is working to develop standardized, low-speed hydraulic systems for fuel and noise reductions.
- Our fleet of more than 800 heavy duty natural gas trucks is the largest natural gas fleet in the US.
- Waste Management is among the leaders in the industry with respect to the investigation of hybrid truck and alternative fuel technologies. We are working with state and federal agencies in the development and testing of emission-efficient vehicles and components.
- Waste Management has worked with fluid and oil suppliers to determine the longest lasting fluids and lubricants. We have tested and incorporated the use of synthetic fluids and have developed processes and maintenance practices for extending fluid drain intervals to reduce lubricant purchases and disposal volume.
- Spill kits are required on all trucks to facilitate site clean-up.
- The best available engine air cleaner technology is utilized in vehicles and equipment, ensuring that engines run cleaner and longer.
- On-board fire suppression systems are utilized on the majority of landfill equipment to significantly reduce the potential for major fire damage or fire impacts.
- Waste Management is participating in voluntary diesel retrofit projects which are under development in New York, Wisconsin, and Pennsylvania. All are aimed at determining the best available emission control technology.

## Preventive Maintenance Program



Waste Management is committed to maintenance excellence. Our preventive maintenance (PM) program establishes a standard to minimize vehicle failures by monitoring the current condition of the equipment and correcting defects before they develop into safety concerns or costly repairs. The program establishes a systematic procedure to inspect, lubricate, and maintain all vehicles owned and/or operated by Waste Management. These procedures reduce breakdowns and accidents within our fleet, and provide us with trouble-free, safe and efficient operations. Our company goal and objective is to provide the Town of Oregon with the safest, cleanest, and most reliable equipment in operation. The following is a summary of our PM program.

### Scope

This PM program applies to all of Waste Management's collection vehicles. As changes occur, Technical Service Bulletins may be issued to amend this process. Our inspection program encompasses the mandatory Department of Transportation (DOT) inspection criteria set forth in section 396 of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR). This serves as the inspection process for Waste Management's equipment. Any vehicle found that does not meet these minimum standards will not be operated until those defects that violated these standards have been properly corrected. We perform quality control audits and self-inspections for compliance of our maintenance programs. This enables us to identify areas of improvement and correct deficiencies.

### Preventive Maintenance Intervals

The Preventive Maintenance Program for collection operations is based on vehicle utilization by hours and/or days. Prescribed service intervals must meet the minimum requirements set by Waste Management. If severe operating conditions exist, the Market Area Fleet Manager may request, in writing, to the appropriate Fleet Director an increase in the frequency of preventive maintenance service intervals for a specific site. The Vice President of Fleet Services and Logistics is the only approving authority for any changes extending preventative maintenance inspection (PMI) intervals. Any changes to the frequency of PMI service intervals must be documented and included in the vehicle or equipment's maintenance file. For specialty collection equipment, it is very difficult to establish company-wide PMI frequency schedules. If you have specialty or an odd piece of equipment that requires periodic inspections, follow the manufactures recommended PMI and service schedules accordingly.

The PM program will adhere to the following cycle. Each vehicle will receive three (3) PM 150s consecutively, and then receive a PM 600. The annual basic cycle will appear as below:

- (PM 150) - (PM 150) - (PM 150) - (PM 600) - (PM 150) - (PM 150) - (PM150) - (PM 600 & 1200)
- (PM 150) - (PM 150) - (PM 150) - (PM 600) - (PM 150) - (PM 150) - (PM150) - (PM 600 & 1200 & 2400)

The acceptable variance for PMI compliance is 015 hours or 5 days (whichever occurs first) for collection PM 150, and 5% (hours) or 10 days for all other inspection intervals. For example, a PM 600 has a variance of 30 Hours or 10 days. California sites subject to Biennial Inspection of Terminals (BIT) cannot exceed 90 days between PMI intervals. The federal annual inspection must never expire. If allowed to expire, the vehicle will not be used until the inspection and appropriate documentation is complete.

### *Fluid Sampling and Filter Change Intervals*

All heavy vehicles with diesel engines receive an oil change, along with new filters and sampling every 600 hours. All other components (transmissions, Hydraulics, and Axles) are sampled every 1200 hours. Fluid samples are taken according to the preventive maintenance-sampling schedule in the appropriate TSBs. Records of analysis will be retained in the unit's history file or by electronic means in the Castrol web-based information system (LABCHECK at [www.castrolusa.com](http://www.castrolusa.com)). Samples must be sent to Waste Management's approved sampling services supplier on a timely basis (the next business day).

### *Mandated Annual Inspection*

The 150 and 600-hour PMI sheets include inspection elements required to meet state, provincial or federal annual Inspection in accordance with section 396 to subpart B of 49 CFR. The items on the 150 and 600-hour sheets that are gray shaded must meet minimum inspection criteria as outlined in appendix G of subpart B, 49 CFR, before the inspection can be certified as a federal annual inspection. Each commercial motor vehicle subject to DOT shall have this inspection performed annually and documentation of the last inspection shall be with the vehicle. Some states require documentation of this mandated inspection at increased intervals (six months). Therefore, it is extremely important that the Fleet Manager is familiar, and complies, with State/Provincial regulations

## **Inspector Training, Certification, and Qualification**

Each technician performing inspections shall be trained and qualified to properly complete a Waste Management preventive maintenance inspection in accordance with the inspection methods contained within this manual. Each technician performing mandated federal annual inspections shall meet the qualifications as stated in Para. 19, section 396, subpart B, 49 CFR. Evidence and documentation of the qualifications of an inspector shall be retained for the period during which that individual is performing inspections and one year thereafter.

Waste Management has in this market area over 400 vehicles from which to draw from in case of a catastrophic event. Local repairs are performed in house by a skill Waste Management technician. In case of breakdowns, the driver will call into the shop for a road call repair. If the truck is not repairable, it will be towed to the shop and spare will be given to the driver. Thirty minutes would be typical down time for either of these situations.

## Quality Control

At Waste Management, we have made a company-wide commitment to quality in every facet of our operations. We understand the trust placed in us by the communities we serve, and everything we do to become a better, stronger company is aimed at ensuring we provide cities like yours with the highest quality environmental services possible.

In every collection operation, we employ rigorous standards for managing and measuring each detail of customer service. We've asked customers how we can improve, and we've made changes and standardized procedures according to their feedback. Focusing on improvement in every step of the process has taken our quality of service to new heights.



## Programs

Waste Management's on-going programs and measurement systems contribute to the high quality service for which we are known. Our quality programs include:

- **Service Machine®.** This program is designed to ensure that every Waste Management hauling company provides high levels of service. Service Machine® requires each hauling company to meet specific standards of operational proficiency. The district is accountable to report each week on how well they have performed in the key service performance metrics on a web-enabled Scorecard program. Results are communicated from the senior leadership team throughout the organization on Weekly Activity Reports.
- **Mission to Zero (M2Z).** The goal of this safety program is to make Waste Management the safest company in our industry. This is equally important to both Waste Management and our customers. M2Z means zero tolerance for unsafe actions, decisions, conditions, equipment, and attitudes. At the core of our commitment to improving safety is an extensive three-phase certification program that engages all Waste Management operating managers and employees in the quest for safe and responsible operational excellence.

## Employees

Waste Management looks to hire only employees who perform at the high quality levels we require. The recruitment process includes internal and external screenings, comprehensive interviews, reference and background checks, education and employment verification, and drug testing. We thoroughly interview candidates and make every effort to ensure we hire only those qualified to provide high service levels.

## Training

Once we have hired the highest-quality personnel, we provide training to ensure they perform at their peak. Dozens of training programs are available through the Waste Management Learning Center (WMLC). Programs vary depending on the role of the employee and whether the employee works in the field or from an office. Topics are organized into eight areas:

- Customer Care
- Ethics and Compliance
- Finance
- Human Resources
- Health and Safety
- Information Technology
- Legal
- Operations



## Safety



Dedication to safety is at the top Waste Management's list of core values. Our comprehensive safety program ensures that our employees and the communities we service remain protected at all times. We focus on safety throughout our operations. From our employee screening process on, we ensure that our staff receives the information necessary to remain safe in all aspects of their jobs.

The safety programs and equipment Waste Management provides our employees and furnishes on the route trucks will enhance the safety of the citizens in [Municipality]:

- Extensive new employee background investigation checks
- Three-day orientation training for all new hires
- 90 day on the job training and evaluation program
- A District Driver Trainer at each transportation location
- Random Alcohol and Drug Testing
- Monthly Driver Safety Meetings
- Operations Supervisor conducts monthly on the job observations
- Hazardous Waste Identification
- Environmental Storm Water and Spill Response Training

Waste Management facilities must meet or exceed industry and government safety standards. We have implemented a comprehensive program to meet the requirements of Employee Right-To-Know, Community Right-to-Know, and Emergency Response regulations of U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), OSHA, and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

***No other waste company in the nation has an OSHA TRIR rating better than Waste Management. OSHA has recognized Waste Management for our progress and ongoing effort to eliminate unsafe work behaviors.***

## Employee Screening

We begin by ensuring that we hire the highest quality drivers—we do not hire applicants with poor driving records, and we review motor vehicle reports for employees every six months. For the life of each driver's employment with Waste Management and for three years after, we maintain a Driver Qualification File (DQF). Candidates for employment at Waste Management landfills, hauling operations, and recycling facilities must successfully complete a comprehensive background check and drug test before being hired. Employees who will perform safety sensitive functions or driving waste collection vehicles must complete medical exams.

## Employee Training

After we have approved new employees for hire, we properly trained them to operate safely. Waste Management's two-phase safety training program includes classroom and on-the-job training, route observation, safety data gathering, and driver training. Phase one provides classroom training that shows workers how to safely perform day-to-day tasks while working the route. These courses standardize the company's safety practices and illustrate exemplary everyday operations—such as how to safely operate trucks, compactors, and other equipment and how to pick up garbage safely. We hold training courses at Waste Management locations across the country.

Phase two of our training program offers classroom as well as on-the-job training for drivers and helpers. They learn how to safely operate their vehicles, mount and dismount equipment, and move and lift containers. They also learn how to work in hot and cold weather.

We are also able to draw from our corporate offices to offer the latest in safety and environmental training. Waste Management, Inc. conducts regular health and safety programs for its employees throughout the country. These programs provide guidance to the operating locations in meeting the compliance requirements safety standards of OSHA, the EPA and the DOT. We frequently conduct in-depth training programs on local issues or on issues of regional concern including: hazard communication, employee right-to-know, asbestos management, industry specific defensive driving, quality customer service, integrity of ethics, code of conduct, control of hazardous energy (Lock Out/Tag Out), confined spaces, and emergency response.

## Incident Reviews

When safety incidents occur, Waste Management responds quickly and thoroughly to lower the risk of repeat occurrence. We create, distribute, and safety advisory notices to the company intranet site when serious safety incidents occur. These reader-friendly write-ups are posted by managers who sign off and indicate the date that the newsletter was posted. We also hold meetings at the sites to ensure the information is conveyed to the drivers.

A safety advisory includes a description of the safety problem that was encountered and the steps that must be taken to prevent the problem from recurring across the company. Each safety alert includes a statement reminding readers that corrective actions are not optional and full compliance is required.

## Reporting

Waste Management requires employees to report any unsafe conditions in the workplace. We have developed and implemented reporting procedures and policies for safety incidents that are integrated throughout our business. One example is Waste Management's customer service program, Service Machine®, discussed earlier in the Quality Management section of this proposal.

We require our employees to report and track all injuries and accidents in the Accident & Injury Management System (AIMS). AIMS is used by sites to track incidents, which include any unplanned work-related event resulting in, or which could result in: personal injury, vehicle damage, property damage, loss of assets, fires, explosions, spills, releases, or adverse publicity, regardless of severity. AIMS reporting allows Waste Management to fulfill its regulatory requirements, provides data for making informed management decisions, and is important in helping Waste Management provide a safe work environment for all employees. Waste Management requires that all incidents be entered into the AIMS system within 48 hours of occurrence and to our insurance carrier within 24 hours of the first report of the incident.

We issue a new safety report each week and archive all safety reports on the company intranet website. Details of any accidents in the past week are provided, often with photos. Information includes the location of the accident, the driver's years of service, and any follow up action being taken. These reports serve to inform employees of safety incidents and failures while reminding all readers to carefully observe safety rules and avoid committing the mistakes that can cause accidents.

## Safety Manual

Waste Management has prepared a Health, Safety and Transportation Manual that contains guidelines for safe operations of solid waste facilities. A self-audit checklist has been prepared to guide Safety and Department Managers through these requirements. Waste Management's Division Safety Managers monitor the performance of their divisions. Division Safety Managers or other regional safety personnel schedule and carry out safety audits.

## Accident Response

Waste Management has a Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasure (SPCC) Plan designed to train our drivers to handle non-hazardous spills while on route. Each vehicle is equipped with a spill kit that has various absorbent materials that contain spills while a crew is dispatched for immediate clean up. Waste Management has on site, at its facility, a mobile spill clean up trailer that is dispatched with trained personnel should a more thorough clean up be needed. We train our drivers to pick up spillage during collection and provide them with brooms and shovels on each vehicle.

## Hydraulic Spill

Hydraulic spills caused by a mechanical failure on the truck would initially be handled by the driver following the procedure below:

- Our drivers are trained to contain spills to prevent them from spreading or entering a watercourse. Drivers would use the spill kit provided or available material, such as dirt, to create a barrier and absorb the spill.
- The driver would radio the Waste Management dispatch office and trained supervisory and maintenance personnel would respond with additional clean up materials.
- Spill and clean up material would be placed in our mobile clean up unit and disposed of properly, leaving the site as clean as possible.

## Trash Spillage

To remedy trash spills caused by driver error or weak bags that burst, Waste Management drivers clean the area using the broom and shovel provided, leaving the area as clean as possible.

## Disaster Management

Municipalities and their service providers must be prepared to respond appropriately and quickly in the event of a disaster to protect the community. Waste Management has proven disaster recovery processes in place to deal with potential service interruptions. We partner with state and local resources to assist in hauling debris and bringing community life back to normal after disastrous events.

### Localized Disaster Response

As a front-line provider of refuse and debris removal services during disasters, Waste Management understands the requirements of maintaining and restoring local services during emergencies. In the event of an emergency, Waste Management staff, usually led by the market area vice president, draws upon personnel and equipment from neighboring Waste Management districts to execute an emergency support plan. External support to these operations continues until normal services can be re-established.

Regional teams frequently respond to earthquake, fire, flood, ice, and power outage situations, and Waste Management has been a vital partner during cleanup after a number of major hurricanes in recent years. Many local teams continue their response and continuity training year-round, including table-top exercises.

### Business Continuity Plan Documentation

Waste Management's business continuity plan is fully documented. Major documents include:

- Group disaster plans for each of the four regions: Western, Southern, Eastern, and Midwestern
- Market area plans (26 throughout North America) with contact lists, communication plans, and customer prioritization
- Two-tiered hurricane plan covering the southern region, including plans to relocate critical functions to a remote site in order to provide continued support to the field
- Two-tiered pandemic flu plan, addressing risks and business impacts in the event of a pandemic, and a plan for providing continued operations while mitigating risk of continued spread of the virus. This plan includes providing for the needs of medical customers and other critical infrastructure/key resources
- Crisis communication plan providing for the need to communicate internally and externally during and after a disaster

### Examples of Community Recovery

Waste Management's has a state-of-the-art Disaster Response Unit (DRU). The DRU is a 48-foot trailer converted into a mobile communications center that can be up and running in less than two hours. The DRU includes computers, satellite communications, wireless Internet connectivity, and a power generator that can provide power to a medium-size facility. Also included in the unit are four beds, a restroom, and a refrigeration unit.

Waste Management has direct experience handling many emergency situations. In May 2010, we helped assist in the clean up activities resulting from the leak at the oil well in the Gulf of Mexico. Waste Management is currently providing the manpower, equipment, and services to facilitate the ongoing shoreline cleanup effort.

# Certification of Insurance

Waste Management will obtain and maintain all insurance required herein and, upon request, will furnish certificates of insurance evidencing:

- Commercial General Liability including Contractual Liability coverage: \$1,000,000 per occurrence limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage
- Automobile Liability covering all owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles. Coverage to include pollution release during transportation: \$1,000,000 combined single limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage.
- Excess Automobile Liability covering all owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles. Coverage to include pollution release during transportation: \$5,000,000 combined single limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage excess of \$1,000,000
- Workers Compensation: Statutory for all states of operation
- Employers Liability \$3,000,000 each accident

All contracts of insurance shall provide 30 days' prior written notice of cancellation or non-renewal. In the event that Waste Management cannot maintain contracts of insurance in the above amounts due to coverages becoming commercially unavailable, we may be relieved of the above obligations upon 30 days' written notice to the customer of revised insurance coverages.

## Customer Care Approach

Operations and Customer Service Representatives are trained in Waste Management processes through a variety of avenues. A dedicated, full-time professional Customer Service Trainer is on staff to deliver training programs. The Trainer and the Supervisors routinely monitor operations in our Call Center focused on Quality Assurance. All new CSRs undergo a six-week training course that includes classroom training, observation and one-on-one mentoring. The classroom training topics include, but are not limited to:

Customer contacts including requests for service, change of status, change of service, status of service, complaints and compliments are recorded in the MAS Ticket System. Each ticket is created in an open status and requires closure upon completion of requested action and/or resolution. The timeframe for ticket closure is dependent upon the type of ticket opened. Local management and their teams are responsible for providing requested service and/or issue resolution and monitor tickets live in MAS.

- If an issue requires immediate attention and/or escalation, an email is also sent to the attention of the Operation Management Team.
- If a repeat issue occurs within two months, a ticket is also opened to alert the Management Team that a reoccurring problem exists.

Ticket creation, closure and tracking as well as service recovery falls under Service Machine Standards and are reported weekly and tracked Corporate-wide. Local management is responsible and accountable for these statistics.

## Narrative Statement

### Residential Waste and Recycling Collection

#### Automated Curbside Service

Trash collection will occur on a weekly schedule, whereas recycling collection will be every other week as shown in the proposal. Re: Solid Waste Advisory Referendum

Dear Fred:

As requested, I have prepared a resolution that, if the Town Board approves it, would authorize placing an advisory referendum on the November 2022 ballot relating to solid waste roadside collection.

As you will see, I made some policy choices that may not be what you were seeking, which I could easily change:

1. The most important one is that this referendum would be limited to residentially zoned property. If, on the other hand, the idea was to extend this solid waste pickup to all properties in the town, including farms and businesses, then I would need to change the language.
2. I have expressly noted that the Town Board would still have the opportunity to decide what to do regardless of the resident electors' vote on the advisory referendum.
3. I understood you to indicate that the method of payment would be that the Town would annually add a flat amount to property tax bills via a special charge. While I could discuss this in further detail, there is a fairly simple procedure under Wis. Stats. § 66.0627 for special charges to be placed on property tax bills. The fact that the charges would be


limited to residential property actually improves the likelihood that this could be done, since if it was charged to all properties, some who disagreed with the policy might claim that this was a property tax in disguise. I am not saying that is a good argument, but it is a policy concern.

4. I have not discussed anything relating to levy limits. While I do not know the status of levy limits in the Town, I do know that nearly every community is bumping up against levy limits every year, and nearly all communities think that going to a binding referendum to increase local levy limits is politically extremely unpopular. Accordingly, I could add something that stated that the only way for the Town to implement this program has to be special charges in light of the fact that there is no room under levy limits to add this program as a general property tax item.

By copy of this to Jennifer, if this resolution is passed, we probably should discuss the mechanics of adding this referendum to the November ballot. There are specific procedures for referenda, with which you may already be familiar due to the common practice of school districts seeking relief from local levy limits. If you have not dealt with this before, I would be happy to lay out the procedures for you.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING HOLDING AN ADVISORY REFERENDUM  
RELATING TO A ROADSIDE SOLID WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM**

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Oregon currently handles solid waste through residents' delivery to the Town of Oregon recycling center (TORC); and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board of the Town of Oregon is interested in learning the interest of its citizens in the possible implementation of roadside solid waste pickup, which would eliminate the necessity of residents delivering solid waste to the TORC; and

**WHEREAS**, if implemented, this solid waste pickup system would be limited to properties zoned residential and would be funded by an annual special charge added to the property tax bill of residential properties rather than by an increase in the Town's property tax levy; and

**WHEREAS**, the holding of an advisory referendum will enable the Oregon Town Board to gauge the interest of the Town's resident electors in adopting a roadside solid waste program; however, the ultimate decision on whether to implement such a program remains within the Oregon Town Board; and

**WHEREAS**, by scheduling the referendum at the November, 2022 election, the probability of a higher turnout by Oregon Town electors is increased;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Town Board of the Town of Oregon as follows:

There shall be placed on the November, 2022 ballot the following referendum question:

1. Should the Town of Oregon implement residential roadside pickup of solid waste and recyclables, to be funded by a flat residential special charge added to property tax bills?

*A "yes" answer means you support the Town of Oregon's creation of a residential roadside solid waste program. Funding would come from a special charge levied annually against the residential properties of the Town of Oregon rather than through property taxation. Good morning Jennifer,

The short answer is basically not at all, unfortunately. While one would like to logically think that the grant is tied to how your program operates today, it's actually tied to your program operation in 1999. Back at that time there was a proposal to modify the grant distribution method, however the governor at the time employed line item veto such that grant amounts are frozen to 1999. In other words, if Town of Oregon received 0.021 percent of the grant 'pie' in 1999, Town of Oregon will receive 0.021 percent of the grant pie today. Whether your costs or tonnage go up or down or you make a significant program change (like going to curbside from drop-off) are not factors in the grant distribution. One exception to this is that you cannot receive a grant greater than your expenses (of course). But I can see that your program expenses are ~\$150,000 and you are receiving a grant of \$17,000-\$18,000. So even if your program expenses were to double, your grant will stay in this \$17,000-\$18,000 range. You would report the new/different expenses on your annual recycling grant application and annual report, but practically your grant amount would not change.

But some good news... there is a grant program for communities who want to implement curbside recycling with carts and that's The Recycling Partnership. Several WI communities have benefited from this funding, including larger cities like Kenosha and Sheboygan to smaller communities like Village of Denmark (population of ~2300) and rural Adams County. The reason I know these communities applied is that a support letter from the state recycling authority is required and I've happily wrote these communities (and others) the necessary support letter. You can learn more information about this opportunity at: <https://recyclingpartnership.org/recycling-cart-grant/>  
As you'll read in the RFP, Vincent Leray is the contact if you have question on this grant. I know Vincent and he's great to work with!

Back to Wisconsin's recycling grant, I just want to reiterate that the grant distribution is determined by the legislature. We at DNR do not have the ability to change this. Past legislative proposals that have looked at addressing this always create 'winners and losers,' with some Responsible Units getting more grant funding and others less. So it's a bit of a legislative 'hot potato.' I will mention that a recent legislative concept was looking at tying recycling grant funding to recycling tonnage... i.e. more tonnage, more funding. While I have no idea if that will be proposed, switching from drop-off to curbside does tend to increase the amount of recyclables collected, so that could be a good thing should such a funding mechanism were to be introduced.

I hope this answers your question and gives you at least one additional resource to consider. Please feel free to reach out with any additional questions.

You requested that I share my thoughts about the proposed project to review long-term needs for waste disposal and recycling for Town of Oregon residents. I want to make it clear at the outset that I am not trying to make a case for closing the TORC. It has served the Town of Oregon well for many years. Our community is changing and growing, though. This is the perfect time to assess how well we are addressing Residents' current needs for disposal services and to make plans for improvements that will be needed in the future.

I hope that the Board will consider the following issues:

1. **Cost**—what does it cost the Town to operate the TORC each year? Are these costs reasonable? If there are budget shortfalls, how does the Town address them? How long can the TORC continue to operate economically under the current budget structure?
2. **Who uses the service?** How many Residents use the TORC and what services do they use? How many Residents contract with Pelletteri or Waste Management for curbside pick-up? How many people use both curbside pick-up and the TORC? How many Residents use the TORC only for services that do not require payment (recycling, and disposal of metal, oil, and brush). Can the Town of Oregon continue to provide these services at no charge?
3. **Staffing.** We hear from some Board Members that it is almost impossible to find people to work at the TORC. If so, what will we do when current staff members may need or want to resign from their jobs?
4. **Hours of service.** The TORC is open from 7:30 to 4:30 on Saturdays all year long, and from 2 to 6 p.m. from May 1 through October 31. Do these hours best meet needs of Residents? Should Saturday hours be shortened, at least during the summer? It might be easier to hire new staff if workers had the option of working shorter shifts, especially on Saturday. How should the TORC handle scheduling when a legal holiday falls on Saturday or Wednesday?

## 5. Health and Safety

- a. In wet weather, poor drainage results in standing water around the compactors and ash tubs, in particular the area around the Recycling Compactor.
  - b. There is no in-door plumbing or running water at the site.
  - c. Traffic—Staff and Residents need to watch traffic very carefully as we walk around the compactors and bins. When the TORC is busy, cars line up as people wait to use the trash and recycling compactors. People become impatient and try to back out of the line, causing further congestion and risk of collisions. We have posted speed limits, but sometimes drivers ignore them.
  - d. The facility needs to be repaved. The blacktop is breaking up and potholes and lumps of paving material pose tripping hazards for Staff and Residents.
  - e. Staff could be better prepared for accidents or health emergencies at TORC. Should we have a defibrillator and first aid training?
  - f. Bee hazard. To date, we have not found a good way to discourage the bees that swarm around the trash and recycling compactors during late summer and fall. One resident mentioned that we should have epi pens on hand.
  - g. Although they may not be required by law, railings are needed at the steps leading up to the oil disposal container. The steel platforms we use to step up to the recycling and trash compactors are hard for some Residents to manage, especially when they are carrying items to empty into the compactors. The platforms at the recycling compactor are wobbly and need shimming.
  - h. Some Residents need help depositing their items into the bins. For everyone's safety, we should have a formal policy about what to do in these cases.
  - i. Smoke from the burn pile can be a problem. The Staff no longer burn brush on days when the TORC is open, but embers sometimes smolder and re-ignite, filling the facility with smoke.
6. **Equipment.** Staff need a reliable tractor with an end loader to push and compact brush, compact trash in open bins, and lift heavy objects into bins. The TORC telephone line is currently not working, so Residents cannot reach us by phone. We are attempting to get the line back in service. In the meantime, Staff members use their cell phones.

Similar towns in Dane County. There are 33 towns in Dane County 23 have curbside and 10 have drop-off sites. At least three (Bristol, Mazomanie, Vermont) drop-off site charge a yearly fee of \$200-\$150 for access to the site. The quoted curbside charge is \$192-\$228 yearly.

Hi All,

I received your name as being interested in talking about the Town of Oregon Recycling Center (TORC). If you are no longer interested or want information sent to a different email account, please let me know.

Fred Clark is the Town Board Supervisor that oversees the TORC. He is hoping to setup a meeting soon. This is being discussed because the cost to operate the TORC is increasing and there are several capital improvements needed at the TORC site. The board recognized the financial strain during budget time and decided to look into the option of having trash and recyclables collected curbside with other materials still being collected at TORC. The curbside cost estimates are below. The residents would see a special yearly charge on their tax bill for this amount.

### Pellitteri (February 8, 2022)

Based on either a 5 or 10-year agreement of similar size municipalities the cost per home is around \$14-\$17 a month.

### Waste Management (March 1, 2022)

The cost for weekly trash and every other week recycling collection is \$19.60 for residence per month based on a 5-year contract.

The town board raised the per bag fee to \$3 in 2022. A residence disposing of one bag per week is \$156 year compared to curbside pickup of both trash and recyclables is \$168-\$235 per year (\$14 to \$19.60 monthly as quoted above).

The TORC operates under the attached town ordinance that will need to be amended. (Currently recyclables are not separated due to the industry change to single stream recycling.)

There was also board discussion if a referendum question or survey would be used to get resident feedback. A referendum question on curbside collection would only be advisory. Here are the deadline dates to get a referendum question on the ballot:

Deadline May 30th to be on the ballot for Primary Election August 9th

Deadline Aug 30<sup>th</sup> to be on the ballot for General Election November 8<sup>th</sup>

RE: Formation of Committee

Dear Committee Members:

We are encouraged by the formation of your committee, but concerned at the same time. Encouraged by the fact that we need more information and education on recycling, while concerned with talk of eliminating our recycling center.

We would encourage the committee to create a detailed description of the kinds of materials that can be recycled, including photos or drawings, then print and mail this information to every homeowner.

We need to increase efforts to safely recycle or dispose of old flashlight batteries and plastic bags. Some of the super markets currently provide recycle bins for plastic bags, but not all of them, and as a result a great deal of plastic bags are disposed of either in the TORC dumpster or recycle bins, along with used flashlight batteries.

The only retailer we know of that recycles used flashlight batteries at N/C is Home Depot, but even Home Depot lacks a convenient means to do this. As you walk through the main entrance, the Verona Road store sometimes has a bin to put them in, but not always. Now with the new Costco store opening up on CTH M between Oregon and Verona, maybe there will be an opportunity there as well. It would be best if TORC acted as a collection location, then transferred the bags and used flashlight batteries to retailers. Additionally, Battery Plus will accept used batteries from individuals at a charge of \$1.50 per lb., but any bulk collection efforts would need to be discussed at Battery Plus corporate in Hartland, Wisconsin: 800-677-8278.

As for continuing TORC, yes, we need to continue it for the following reasons and more:

- 1) Safe disposal of waste and recyclable items.
- 2) Safer for property owners to take their waste and recycle items to TORC than it is to have them picked up by one of the recycling companies, or worse yet, bury or



burn them on their own lots. Large trucks also pose a hazard on the road, and damage to our town roads. **QUESTIONS:** *Is the blacktop on our town roads strong enough for such large and heavy trucks? Would we have more road repairs because of such operations, especially on the edges of our roads?*

- 3) TORC is a great place to get to know neighbors, and discuss common concerns.
- 4) Employment for local residents.

Let's keep TORC as a model recycling center in Dane County and Wisconsin for these and many other reasons.
