Covid-19 Updates for Vilas County

Vilas County Public Health has been monitoring the rise in Covid-19 cases throughout the county and across the state. The current situation may present questions or concerns for members of the community.

How many cases of Covid-19 are there in Vilas County?

Currently, Vilas County has had 2,473 confirmed or probable since January 1, 2020. As of today, we have 28 active confirmed cases; and our level of community transmission is substantial.

Has the hospitalization and death rates increased in Vilas County as well?

As of 8/4/2021, 86.5% of hospital beds, 88.9% of ICU beds, and 16.7% of ventilators are in use in Northcentral WI. This represents all illnesses, not just COVID-19 related.

We currently have 45 deaths in Vilas County since January 21, 2020. Deaths per 100,000 people (state) is 193.9. Case fatality percentage is 1.8% (Source: https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/covid-19/county.htm#cumulative%20deaths)

What is the Delta variant and how has it affected the spread of Covid-19?

The Delta variant is significantly more contagious than other variants. It is now widespread in Wisconsin and throughout the country and accounts for the recent rise in new cases.

Should I get tested for Covid-19?

Anyone experiencing symptoms of fever, new onset or worsening cough, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath, chills, headache, muscle aches, fatigue, loss of taste and/or smell, nausea, abdominal pain, vomiting or diarrhea should get tested.

If I have been vaccinated, is there any reason to get tested for Covid-19?

Among vaccinated persons, there is a very small risk - **0.1%** - that exposure to Covid-19 may result in a new infection. Most people who experience infection after being fully vaccinated report mild or no symptoms. Because no vaccine is 100% effective, some breakthrough infections are expected. Therefore, the CDC recommends fully vaccinated people who have a known exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 be tested 3-5 days after exposure and wear a mask in public indoor settings for 14 days or until they receive a negative test result.

If I have been vaccinated, and do not have a known exposure, do I still need to take precautions?

It is very important to prevent community spread of the Delta variant which can give rise to new and potentially more serious variants. Although the risk of transmission among vaccinated persons may be small, the CDC and Wisconsin Department of Health Services recommend that everyone, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask in public indoor settings.

If I haven't been vaccinated yet, does it still make sense to do so?

Unvaccinated persons account for greater than **99%** of new COVID-19 infections, hospitalizations, and deaths. Therefore, getting vaccinated is the most effective way to minimize the risk from covid-19.

Should children 12 and older get vaccinated?

COVID-19 in kids can range from mild to severe illness. Over 400 pediatric deaths have been reported since the beginning of the pandemic and COVID-19 is now listed as a <u>top</u> <u>10 cause of death</u> for adolescents in the United States. Parents should seek advice from their pediatrician regarding Covid-19 vaccination for children 12 and older.
