ANNUAL TOWN MEETING APRIL 13, 2010

Chairman Eugene Mertz called the 2010 Annual Meeting of the Town of Rantoul to order at 7:30 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Twenty-three residents and guests were in attendance, along with Board Members Eugene Mertz, David Jannette, Greg Eickert, Mary Schwartz and Connie Loose. Chairman Mertz verified that meeting notices were published and posted.

The agenda was reviewed. Motion by David Jannette, second by Wes Hedrich to accept the agenda as printed and posted; motion carried by voice vote. A copy follows.

The minutes from the 2009 Annual Meeting and 2009 Special Budget Meeting were next on the agenda. Motion by David Jannette, second by Gregg Eickert to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to approve the minutes as printed in the 2009 Annual Audit Report booklet; motion carried by voice vote.

The 2009 Annual Financial Report was discussed. Motion by Gregg Eickert, second by Daniel Jannette to approve the 2009 Annual Financial Report; motion carried by voice vote.

David Dhein, assessor, sent in the following report:

The 2002 level of assessment according to the Department of Revenue was 99.37%. In 2003 the overall level of assessment went to 94.27%. This means that we were still in compliance. When you fall below 90%, the four-year cycle starts, where the Department of Revenue will require a reassessment. In 2004 we did drop below 90% to 84.51% of market value. For 2007 we were at 79.48%. 2008 was the fourth year out of compliance. In 2009 we had a reassessment of the Town. The assessed values for the Town are now at 102.11%. In 2009 we had \$364,200.00 of new construction.

Motion by Mark Wunrow, second by Jeff Wunrow to designate Collins State Bank, Calumet County Bank Brillion and State Bank of Chilton as our public depositories; motion carried by voice vote.

Mark Wunrow gave a Road Report. Various roads will be wedged and sealed as the budget permits. About 1 ½ miles of Irish Road will be redone. Part of this project is under the TRIP program.

Motion by Dennis Hintz, second by Mark Wunrow that the Board has short-term (loan to be repaid by the end of the year) borrowing power not to exceed \$50,000.00; motion carried by voice vote.

Motion by Jeff Wunrow, second by Neale Wenzel that the Board has long-term borrowing power not to exceed \$150,000.00; motion carried by voice vote.

Motion by Daniel Jannette, second by Mark Wunrow to set the 2011 Annual Meeting for Tuesday, April 12, 2011, at 7:30 p.m.; motion carried by voice vote.

A proposed change to the Annual Financial Report form was discussed. Motion by Jeff Wunrow, second by Joe Halbach to condense the Annual Financial Report to a one page two-sided form; motion carried by voice vote

Danielle Santry, County Groundwater specialist, talked about the water testing grant that is available to the Town. Letters will be sent out in July to inform the Town residents of the testing. The testing will take place in August 2010.

Rob Schoen, Potter Fire Department chief, was present to discuss selling the van and a water truck and replacing them with a used pumper truck. Motion by Daniel Jannette, second by Dave Klessig to give the Potter Fire Department the authority to look for/purchase a used pumper truck, with the Town Board's approval, not to exceed \$75,000 of Town's money; motion carried by voice vote.

Dr. Ken Buelow, Holsum Dairy, was present to answer questions concerning the proposed new dairy on Harke Road. He stated that the dairy is on hold at this time due to the lack of land close by on which to hose manure.

Danielle Santry explained the County Farm Preservation Plan & Working Lands Initiative.

Withdrawing from County Zoning was discussed. The Town will have until November 2010 to decide to remain or withdraw from County zoning. Establishing Town Zoning was discussed. More information and a possible hearing will be held on this matter.

Motion by Mark Wunrow, second by Joe Halbach to adjourn; motion carried by voice vote.

Discussion was held on the various budget items including the loan of \$135,000.00 covering the balloon payment on the Potter Fire Department fire truck purchased in November 2005 and the fire truck purchased in June 2010.

Chairman Mertz verified that meeting notices were posted and published. Mary Schwartz confirmed that notices were posted for 15 days and published in the Chilton Times-Journal.

Motion by Mark Wunrow, second by Neale Wenzel to increase the salaries of the elected board members by \$300.00 per year setting the compensation for town officers at the following rates for the term of office beginning April 2011:

***Please note: Due to an error in the calculation of the yearly loan payment to Collins State Bank for the fire trucks, the actual town tax levy for 2010 to be collected in 2011 will be \$245,158.46. This error was discovered Nov. 17, 2010, when loan papers were signed. The original town tax levy was calculated based on information given to the clerk by the bank in the latter part of October, which proved to be incorrect. Exceeding the levy limit set by the state by collecting the \$249,190.00 tax levy would result in the reduction of State Aid (shared revenue) paid by the state to the town in 2012 and beyond. Therefore, the town tax levy for 2010 to be collected in 2011 will be \$245,158.46 to comply with the state levy limits.

BUILDING PERMITS

The TOWN OF RANTOUL has adopted the Wisconsin Uniform Dwelling Code which requires inspection of all new construction of one-and-two family dwellings and alterations over \$25,000.00 value to one-and-two family dwellings built since June 1, 1980. Building permits for construction covered by the WI UDC shall be obtained from Birschbach Inspection Services. The Town of Rantoul is in the process of adopting Town Zoning. More information concerning zoning and permits will be forthcoming.

TOWN MEETINGS

Regular monthly Town Meetings are held on the first Monday of each month at the Town Garage unless otherwise noted. (Meetings during the winter months may be held at the Potter Village Hall. Please check postings.) November through April meetings will begin at 7:00 p.m. May through October meetings will begin at 7:30 p.m. Special meetings to be held will have published notices in the Chilton Times Journal. Meeting notices and agendas will be posted at the Potter Village Hall, Gruetts, the Town Garage and Potter Post Office (when needed). Agendas and meeting change notices can also be found on the Town's website – www.townofrantoul.com.

DOGS

Please have your dog vaccinated before applying for a license. A late fee of \$5.00 shall be assessed to the owner of each dog 5 months of age or older, who fails to obtain a license by April 1st. Licenses are issued by the Town Treasurer, Connie Loose. Please have your proof of vaccination with you when applying for this license.

NOTE: If a person neglects to pay a dog fee on his dog, his claim for dog damages will not be paid. Fines may also be assessed.
