Unfinished Business

1. Work Order Status
 - A. Town Park Public Works continues to monitor and tighten chimes as needed.
 - B. Town Park re-sanding of the 5-12 year-old playground area on hold. Plan to wait until new playground equipment is installed.
 - C. 158th Triangle parking had pilings installed week of March 29th, 2021 and rope installation in progress.
 - D. Town Park *No Dogs Allowed* signage completed.
 - E. Items to be added: Kris Johanson suggested adding a work order for removal of a broken sign pole that poses a safety hazard in the 164th Cul de sac. Temporary measure of a reflector placed until removal.
2. Town Park
 - a. Pole lights

Missy Clarke has not received a response from fabricator. She will attempt to reach another vendor and request quote.
 - b. Sensory Dome and Zip Line

Missy Clarke met with installer for new sensory dome and zipline and was advised that removal of jungle gym, monkey bars, and seesaw would need to occur in order to comply with safe fall zones for new equipment. A safety check was also performed by Florida League of Cities which determined that the swing set was not in compliance due to proximity to other objects and the lack of tamper-proof hardware. In addition, the current sand is not compliant and recommendations to replace the sand with mulch or rubber surface were suggested. Additionally, the landscape fabric was identified as a tripping hazard (artificial turf was suggested), and the pink climber and monkey bars are starting to corrode and have also been identified as safety hazards. Debi Robinson suggested a swing set replacement that would conform to insurance safety guidelines, possibly considering a smaller unit. Missy to contact Game Time for swing set recommendations that would meet safety measures and to request playground design. Engineer to be contacted to determine what faults exist with current equipment, then consider plans for removal and possible replacement. New mulch or rubber surface to be completed after equipment installed. Budget for swing set may be requested in 2022 budget. Budget for rubber mulch to be determined: Park and Recreation Department versus Public works.
3. Friendship Park Gazebo-current quote from vendor requested by Missy Clarke totaled \$68, 000 for a 16ft by 20 ft gazebo with Trex decking. It was determined that gazebo size should actually be 16 ft by 16 ft. Missy Clarke offered to get another quote from gazebo.com. Debi Robinson suggested product with wood insert. Mayor Will agrees with suggestion by Bob Kahn for custom pergola with architect to sign off to meet wind load requirements. A suggestion made for sail shades, but majority vote to table gazebo/pergola in Friendship Park due to cost, obstacles with wind load requirements, and functionality, and discussion moved on to mulch versus shell to cover dirt areas in Friendship Park. Kris Johanson to get copy of Friendship Park drawing to determine placement of shell vs. mulch, and will defer further discussion to meeting next month.
4. Holiday lights-Kris Johanson reached out to Clark- will have report for next meeting.

5. Town Park signage- Missy Clarke left messages for prior vendor, looking to duplicate current signage, unanimous vote to table town park signage.
6. Town Park sail shade bench- Adriana to take care of bench donation by Jen Greacen today.
7. Garden Club project- Toni Scarr President of Garden Club, still looking at plant varieties for 911 Memorial Garden, hoping to have suggestions by meeting next month, still looking at red plants/flowers per artist suggestion, current suggestions are for a rose garden that will survive with low maintenance or red flower.
