Having been duly advertised as required by law, the **Regular Meeting** of the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Redington Beach, Florida, was held on **Wednesday, January 7th, 2026 at 6:30 pm**, in Redington Beach Town Hall at 105 164th Avenue, Redington Beach, Florida.

Mayor Will called the **Regular Meeting** to order and led the pledge of allegiance.

Approval of Agenda: A motion by Commissioner Kornijtschuk and seconded by Commissioner Cariello to approve the agenda. No public comment. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Forum:

Greg Unger 15829 Redington Drive, suggested hiring a part-time code enforcement officer and use the extra funds on road improvements and drainage improvements.

John Rodgers, 16331 Redington Drive, reported that he has a rat problem, due in large part to the “zombie” house next door. He reported seeing rats entering and exiting the structure through a broken window. He expressed frustration with the code enforcement process. Vice-Mayor Thompson noted that the vacant code enforcement position will be filled soon and the new person will pick up the existing cases.

Camile Menendez, 16208 1st St E, expressed concerns about safety. She noted that the abandoned houses in the area present significant health and safety concerns, specifically regarding pools with stagnant water and structures containing mold.

Additionally, there are concerns regarding the safety of the demolition process. Specifically, how will the removal of mold-infested structures be managed to ensure that neighboring residents are not adversely affected.

Leslie Wilkins, 505 161st Avenue, reported that the Planning Board is meeting on Wednesday, January 21st, 2026. One issue they will discuss is raising the building height to 35 feet to allow for higher garage floors.

Public Safety

- Commissioner Murray reported that there was less crime in the city in 2025 than there was in 2024. He also reported about an intruder who entered a residence on 4th St E and used the facilities before the homeowner returned. He was caught by the PCSO and will face charges. Mayor Will reminded all to report anything that seems out of the ordinary to law enforcement.

Building/Code

- Vice Mayor Thompson reported that there are over 100 active permits, with an additional 60 in the queue.

Public Works/Parks

- Commissioner Cariello reported that all is quiet in public works. The Park Board is planning a Mardi Gras party on 2/7/26.
- Ben Kirk representing the Park Board reported that the NYE sunset toast had about 40-50 people. The event was good and low cost.

A motion by Commissioner Kornijtschuk and seconded by Commissioner Cariello to approve Ordinance 2026-01. Mayor Will noted that this is a correction to the permit fee schedule which was adopted by resolution at a previous meeting. No board discussion. No public comment. Motion carried with a roll call vote.

B. Town Hall Roof Replacement – Mayor Will explained that the town hall roof needs to be replaced. Staff gathered estimates from 3 companies to replace the roof with shingles and 3 companies to replace it with metal. Commissioner Kornijtschuk reported that the funds are already budgeted for the roof. He also noted that he prefers Burke Roofing for a metal roof and Drew Roofing for a shingle roof. Commissioner Murray questioned whether the expense of a metal roof is worth the higher price. Vice Mayor Thompson agreed with Commissioner Murray that a metal roof isn't worth the additional expense. He also noted that he has used Old Time roofing and found their work to be acceptable. Commissioner Cariello noted that he, too, has used Old Time roofing with satisfaction and prefers a shingle roof.

Leslie Wilkins, 505 161st Ave asked if the property insurance would be affected if the Town got a metal roof versus a shingle roof. Commissioner Kornijtschuk noted that if the difference is significant it would be worth exploring.

Steve Smith 16217 Redington Drive, noted that perhaps the town could request a 10 year warranty on workmanship from Old Time, similar to the higher estimate of Drew Roofing.

Greg Unger, 15829 Redington Drive, stated that his new shingle roof survived the winds of Hurricane Milton and doesn't think a metal roof is worth the additional expense.

Motion by Commissioner Murray to contact Old Time Roofing, request a 10 year warranty on workmanship, and if not, to use Drew Roofing for a shingle roof. Second by Commissioner Cariello. Motion carried unanimously.

Re: 15802 3rd St E., Code Enforcement Lien Offer

A code enforcement violation was determined by the Special Magistrate on June 20, 2025. The Magistrate imposed a deadline to bring the violation into compliance of July 25, 2025, with an established fine of \$40.00 per day. As of January 12, 2026, the date the property owner submitted a settlement offer, 171 days have elapsed.

As of that date, the total accrued fine was **\$6,840.00**. The property owner reported that he is currently under contract to sell the home, and has offered **\$3,000.00** to resolve the matter.

As the local governing body, you have the authority to either accept, reply, or refuse this offer. Documentation regarding the violation and the order from the Special Magistrate is attached for your review.

Sec. 12-113. - Maintenance requirements.

(a) Properties subject to this article shall be kept free of weeds, overgrown brush, dead vegetation, trash, junk, debris, building materials, any accumulation of newspapers, circulars, flyers, notices, except those required by federal, state, or local law, discarded personal items included, but not limited to, furniture, clothing, large and small appliances, printed material or any other items that give the appearance that the property is abandoned.

(b) Visible front and side yards shall be landscaped and maintained to the neighborhood standard at the time registration was required.

(c) Landscape shall include, but is not limited to, grass, ground covers, bushes, shrubs, hedges or similar plantings, decorative rock, bark or artificial turf/sod designed specifically for residential installation. Landscape shall not include weeds, gravel, broken concrete, asphalt or similar material.

(d) Maintenance shall include, but is not limited to, watering, irrigation, cutting, and mowing of required landscape and removal of all trimmings and palm fronds.

Sec. 12-114. – Security requirements.

(a) Properties subject to this section shall be maintained in a secure manner so as not to be accessible to unauthorized persons.

(Ord. No. 09-01, § 1, 4-7-09)

How to Comply:

1. **Mow and Maintain Vegetation** – Regularly cut grass, weeds and other vegetation in front and rear yards to ensure they do not exceed **12 inches** in height.
2. **Debris Removal** – Remove any trash/debris, dead vegetation and accumulation of notices/newspapers.
3. **Vehicle Maintenance** – Make sure all vehicles visible on property are in mechanical operating condition and have a valid license plate.
4. **Security** – Secure/lock any and all windows, doors and other openings that could allow access to unauthorized persons.

Days to Comply: 14 days

Please be mindful of the above Code provisions and maintain your property in compliance with those provisions as failure to do so may result in a Notice of Violation and Notice of Hearing where a Magistrate may impose fines and a lien.

**FINDINGS OF FACT,
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
AND ORDER IMPOSING LIEN**

This cause came for public hearing before the Special Magistrate on 06/20/2025 at which the Respondent was not present. Upon confirming that notice was proper and having heard testimony under oath from Code Officer Marquis Fitzgerald and Respondent, received evidence, and heard argument, this Special Magistrate issues this Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order Imposing Lien as follows:

Findings of Fact

- 1. That Ryan Mullican, Respondent, is the owner(s) of interest in property located at 15802 3rd Street E, Redington Drive, Redington Beach, Florida (Subject Property).**
- 2. That notifications regarding violations of the Town of Redington Beach Code of Ordinances, in the form of a Courtesy Warning Notice, and Notice of Violation and Notice of Hearing were received by the undersigned as evidence in this hearing. Said notifications were properly provided to Respondent.**

3. That the Subject Property is legally described as:

LONE PALM BEACH 2nd ADD BLK 16, LOT 11

PARCEL NO. 04-31-15-52560-016-0110

4. That Section 12-2(6) of the Redington Beach Code of Ordinances states, in pertinent part:

Motor vehicles (including motorcycles) parked, kept or stored in the street, right-of-way, or on private land which is not in mechanical operating condition for immediate locomotion under its own power, or which are not currently licensed and registered as required by state law.

5. That Section 12-113 of the Redington Beach Code of Ordinances states, in pertinent part:

- (a). Properties subject to this article shall be kept free of weeds, overgrown brush, dead vegetation, trash, junk, debris, building materials, any accumulation of newspapers, circulars, flyers, notices, except those required by federal, state, or local law, discarded personal items included, but not limited to, furniture, clothing, large and small appliances, printed material or any other items that give the appearance that the property is abandoned.
- (b) Visible front and side yards shall be landscaped and maintained to the neighborhood standard at the time registration was required.
- (c) Landscape shall include, but is not limited to, grass, ground covers, bushes, shrubs, hedges or similar plantings, decorative rock, bark or artificial turf/sod designed specifically for residential installation. Landscape shall not include weeds, gravel, broken concrete, asphalt or similar material.
- (d) Maintenance shall include, but is not limited to, watering, irrigation, cutting, and mowing of required landscape and removal of all trimmings and palm fronds.

6. That Section 12-114(a) of the Redington Beach Code of Ordinances states, in pertinent part:

Properties subject to this section shall be maintained in a secure manner so as not to be accessible to unauthorized persons.

7. That Subject Property has overgrowth of weeds and vegetation, junk, trash, debris, accumulation of notices/newspapers, and an inoperable and unregistered motor vehicle.
8. That the dwelling located on the Subject Property is unsecured with an exterior French door ajar.

Conclusions of Law

1. That the overgrowth of grass and weeds , accumulation of notices/newspapers, and accumulations of junk, trash, and debris violates Section 12-113, Town of Redington Beach Code of Ordinances.
2. That the inoperable and unregistered motor vehicle violates Section 12-2(6), Town of Redington Beach Code of Ordinances.
3. That the unsecured dwelling on the Subject Property violates Section 12-114(a), Town of Redington Beach Code of Ordinances.

Order on the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law And Order Imposing Lien

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and pursuant to the authority granted in Chapter 162, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 2, Article III, Town of Redington Beach Code of Ordinances, it is hereby ordered that the Respondent correct said violation(s) by **7/25/2025 (Deadline Date)** or a daily fine will be imposed for each day the violation(s) continues past the Deadline Date. Upon considering the gravity of the violation(s), any actions taken by the Respondent to correct the violation(s), and any previous violations committed by the Respondent, I determine the daily fine to be **\$40.00 a day**. It is Respondent's responsibility to notify the Town's Code Compliance Department that the violations have been corrected.

The Special Magistrate authorizes the Town Clerk to record this order in the Official Records of Pinellas County as a lien against all real and personal property owned by the Respondent, provided that the same shall not constitute a lien against homestead property of the Respondent. The filing of a Non-Compliance Affidavit/Report with the Town Clerk's Office (and copy provided to Respondent) after the Deadline Date shall constitute notice that violation

was not corrected by the Deadline Date and a daily fine has begun to accrue. After three (3) months from the recording of this lien which remains unpaid, the undersigned Special Magistrate authorizes the Town Attorney to foreclose on the lien or to sue to recover a money judgment for the amount of the lien plus accrued interest.

Respondent has a right to appeal this order. Those rights are waived if not timely exercised.
