

TOWN OF RICE LAKE - ORDINANCE #22-101
REGULATIONS FOR STOPPING, STANDING, OR PARKING OF VEHICLES


The Town Board of the Town of Rice Lake, Barron County, Wisconsin, has the specific authority under s. 349.13, Wis. stats., to adopt this ordinance.

This ordinance, adopted by a majority of the Town Board on a roll call vote with a quorum present and voting and proper notice having been given, provides for the regulation of the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on town highways in the town as follows:


- A. Prohibitions, limitations and restrictions; when applicable.
1. The stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on the following town highways in the Town of Rice Lake is subject to the following restrictions and limitations:
 - a. 21st Street from 21 1/16 St. to 21 1/8 St. – no parking allowed on either side of street at all times
 - b. 22- 22¼ Street from 18¾ Ave. to public boat landing – no parking allowed on west side of street at all times
 - c. 23 3/16 Avenue from 20½ St. to 2051 23 3/16 Ave. – no parking on south side of street when posted during winter months. When posted, parking is prohibited at all times.
 2. The town chairperson, or his or her designee, (“Town Official”) shall place appropriate traffic signs on the above-described highways on or before the effective date of this ordinance.
 3. No persons may operate any vehicle on the above-noted town highways in violation of the above-noted stopping, standing, or parking restrictions and limitations.
 4. Unless otherwise provided by ordinance, rule or regulation, or posted by official traffic signs or markers, all other prohibitions, limitations, and restrictions in this article shall apply 24 hours a day, every day of the year.
- B. Penalties. Each day of violation of this ordinance constitutes a separate offense.
1. Forfeiture. Any person who violates this ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs of prosecution shall be imprisoned in the county jail until the forfeiture and costs are paid, but not exceeding 30 days.
 2. Removal of vehicle. Whenever the Town Official finds a vehicle parked, stopped or left standing upon a street in violation of any prohibition, limitation or restriction of this ordinance, such Town Official is authorized to move the vehicle or to require the operator or owner to move the vehicle to a position where parking is permitted or to either private or public parking or storage premises. The removal may be performed by or under the direction of the Town Official or may be contracted for by local authorities. The operator or owner of the vehicle removed shall pay the reasonable charges for moving or towing or any storage involved. The removal of the vehicle shall not prevent prosecution for violation of a prohibition, limitation or restriction of this ordinance.
- C. Repeal. All other ordinances or part of ordinances of the Town of Rice Lake, Barron County inconsistent or conflicting with this ordinance, to the extent of the inconsistency only, are hereby repealed.
- D. Severability. The provision of the ordinance shall be deemed severable. If any provision of this ordinance or the application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other person's circumstances shall not be deemed affected.

E. Effective date. This ordinance shall become effective upon its publication and/or posting in the manner provided for by law.






