Chapter 345

VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

[HISTORY: Adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Scott 3-11-2008. Amendments noted where applicable.]

GENERAL REFERENCES

Snowmobiles — See Ch. 275.

§ 345-1. State traffic laws adopted.

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this chapter, the statutory provisions in Chs. 340 to 350, Wis. Stats., describing and defining regulations with respect to vehicles and traffic, exclusive of any regulations for which the statutory penalty is a fine or term of imprisonment, are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this chapter. Any future amendments, revisions or modifications of the statutory regulations in Chs. 340 to 350 incorporated herein are intended to be made part of this chapter in order to secure, to the extent legally practicable, uniform statewide regulation of vehicle traffic on the highways, streets and alleys of the State of Wisconsin.

§ 345-2. All-night parking.

No person shall park any vehicle on a public street or highway in the Town of Scott between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

§ 345-3. Truck parking.

No person owning, driving or in charge of any motor vehicle, commercial vehicle or trailer in excess of 17 feet in length shall park the same on any street or highway in the Town of Scott for more than two hours of any day.

§ 345-4. Heavy traffic.

- A. Class B highways designated. All streets and alleys within the Town of Scott, except those streets enumerated in Subsection B, are hereby designated Class B highways and are subject to the weight limitations imposed by § 348.16, Wis. Stats.
- B. Heavy traffic routes designated. The following streets and parts of streets are designated as heavy traffic routes:
 - (1) Bay Settlement Road.
 - (2) Church Road: SH 57 to Hemlock Road.

§ 345-5. No-parking areas.

No vehicle shall be parked at any time on the following highways:

Name of Street Side Location

Bay Settlement Road East From Judy Lane to 2800 Bay Settlement Road

Bay Settlement Road West From Judy Lane to Church Road

Sandra Rose Lane East From Algoma Road to Rose Garden Way

§ 345-6. No parking during snow emergencies.

In the event that a snow emergency is declared by the Highway Commissioner or Town Chairperson, no parking will be allowed on any street.

§ 345-7. Enforcement; violations and penalties.

- A. Enforcement procedure. This chapter shall be enforced according to § 66.0114, Ch. 799 and §§ 345.20 to 345.53, Wis. Stats.
- B. Deposit. Any person arrested for a violation of this chapter may make a deposit of money as directed by the arresting officer at the office of the Clerk of the Joint Municipal Court or by mailing the deposit to such place. The Clerk of the Joint Municipal Court receiving the deposit shall notify the arrested person, orally or in writing, that:
 - (1) If he or she fails to appear in court at the time fixed in the citation, he or she will be deemed to have tendered a plea of no contest and submitted to a forfeiture plus costs not to exceed the amount of the deposit; or
 - (2) If he or she fails to appear in court at the time fixed in the citation, and if the court does not accept the deposit as a forfeiture, he or she will be summoned into court to answer the complaint.
- C. Vehicles and trailers found in violation of § 345-2, 345-3 or 345-5 will be towed at the owner's expense.
- D. Violations and penalties. Any person violating the provisions of this chapter or any rule, regulation, or order made hereunder shall be subject to a penalty of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500. Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense.¹
