## TOWN OF SPIDER LAKE, SAWYER COUNTY SNOWMOBILE ROUTE and ACCESS ORDINANCE 2013- 05

- 1. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish snowmobile routes in the town and to regulate the operation of snowmobiles in the town under s350.18 and s 60.22 Wis. Stats
- 2. Residents of the Town of Spider Lake, their guests and registered guests of lodging establishments in the town are authorized to operate snowmobiles on town roads within the town that are not designated as snowmobile routes for the sole purpose of accessing the snowmobile route or snowmobile trail nearest the resident's residence or registered guest's place of lodging by way of the shortest available route from the residence or lodging establishment to the nearest snowmobile route or trail.
- 3. The following named roads in the Town of Spider Lake shall be designated as snowmobile routes, between those areas posted as such with snowmobile route signs:
  - a. Forest Road 203 (from Trail 21 to FR 650)
  - b. Forest Road 622 (1/8 mile in Section 15)
  - c. Heinemann Road (from Hwy 77 to Trail 5)
  - d. Lake Helane Road (from Trail 22 to Trail 77)
  - e. Morgan Road (1/4 mile between snowmobile route signs)
  - f. Neumaier Road (from the driveway of Reel Livin' Resort, south one mile to the snowmobile trail turn)
  - g. Rock Lake Road (from Trail 77 to Bayfield County Line)
  - h. Seeley Fire Tower Road (from Trail 8 to Bayfield County Line)
  - i. Lugner Road (from Hwy 77, 1/8 mile north)
  - i. Telemark Road (from Rock Lake Road to Bayfield County Line)
- 4. The speed limit shall be 25 miles per hour while operating on all Town of Spider Lake roads.
- 5. Snowmobile operators shall slow the vehicle to 10mph or less when operating within 150 feet of a dwelling.
- 6. Snowmobile operators shall operate on the extreme right side of the roadway and travel with the flow of traffic.
- 7. Snowmobiles are to be operated in single file.
- 8. Snowmobile operators shall yield the right-of-way to all other vehicular traffic and pedestrians.
- 9. Headlights shall be turned on and in working order at all times while operating on the roadway or shoulder.

- 10. Snowmobile operators violating any of the above conditions are subject to the underlying violation of illegally operating on the roadway.
- 11. Snowmobile operators travel at their own risk and the Town of Spider Lake will not be liable for any damages or injuries to snowmobiles or operators occurring in the Town of Spider Lake.
- 12. This ordinance may be enforced by any law enforcement officer authorized to enforce the laws of the State of Wisconsin.
- 13. The penalties for violating the provisions of this ordinance is the same as listed in s.350.11 Wis. Statutes, and are adopted by reference. Should any section, clause or provision of this ordinance be declared by the Courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than that part so declared to be invalid.
- 14. This ordinance shall be effective on passage and publication as provided by law and shall repeal and replace all snowmobile route and access ordinances heretofore enacted by the Town of Spider Lake. The town clerk shall properly publish this ordinance as required under s. 60.80, Wis. stats., and mail a copy to the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and to the Sawyer County Sheriff's Office.
