February is National Heart month! Eating the right foods can help keep your heart healthy. Learn which foods are best for your ticker from Jimmy Kontos, MD, interventional cardiologist at Grand Strand Medical Center in Myrtle Beach. Sharecare

#### 5 Top Foods for Your Heart - Plus One to Avoid

SALMON AND OTHER FATTY FISH: The omega-3 fatty acids (specifically the EPA and DHA) found in fatty fish help to reduce the type of chronic inflammation that leads to heart disease and many other diseases, including cancer and rheumatoid arthritis. Not into fish? Try plant sources such as walnuts and chia or hemp seeds. Steer clear of over-the-counter fish oil supplements, Kontos warns: They're not concentrated enough to have an impact.

BERRIES -- especially blueberries and raspberries -- are important because they increase insulin sensitivity, help increase nitric oxide, decrease LDL cholesterol and decrease the ability of blood to clot." It's unclear exactly what it is about berries that create all these benefits, but they boast fiber, anthocyanins, flavanols and vitamins.

You probably know OATS are good for your ticker -- but you may be eating the wrong kind. "Oatmeal does help lower insulin levels and it's high in fiber, so it fills you up, which is beneficial for losing weight," Kontos says. But for a healthy heart, "it's gotta be steel-cut OATMEAL, with no additives," he explains. "A pouch of peaches and cream instant oats isn't going to give you the beneficial effects."

FLAX SEEDS These mighty seeds have become synonymous with a healthy diet, and for good reason. Rich in lignans and ALA (alpha-linolenic acid) omega-3, flax seeds boast anti-inflammatory benefits and help lower blood pressure.

AVOCADOS: As if you needed another reason to love your guac, here's one more: avocados are good for your heart. That's because they're rich in monounsaturated fats, which help fight inflammation.

CUT THE SUGAR: What's the one dietary change you can make for a healthier heart? Skip added sugars, says Kontos. Processed sugars, the kind that sweeten drinks and packaged foods, "are the root of the problem, because they lead to chronic inflammation," he says.
