July is National Ice Cream Month

In 1984, President Ronald Reagan designated July as National Ice Cream Month and the third Sunday of the month as National Ice Cream Day. He recognized ice cream as a fun and nutritious food that is enjoyed by over 90 percent of the nation's population. In the **proclamation**, President Reagan called for all people of the United States to observe these events with "appropriate ceremonies and activities."

The International Ice Cream Association (IICA) encourages retailers and consumers to celebrate July as National Ice Cream Month.

Today, National Ice Cream Month is celebrated each July and National Ice Cream Day is celebrated on the third Sunday in July, even though the presidential proclamation only mentioned the month and date in 1984.

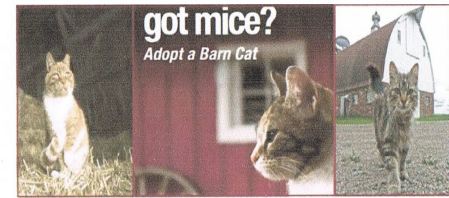

Types of Cats Qualifying for the Barn Cat Program

- * Friendly cats who have litter-box issues, thus making them unsuitable for house life
- * Friendly cats who are too independent and /or high energy which makes their house behavior unsuitable
- * Feral or semi-feral cats who are too shy and fearful of people and who much prefer the company of other cats and animals
- * Feral cats who must be relocated due to the unsafe nature of their original areas

What We Provide

- * At least one round of rabies and distemper vaccines
- * All cats have been spayed/neutered
- * Guidance on introducing your cat into their new environment

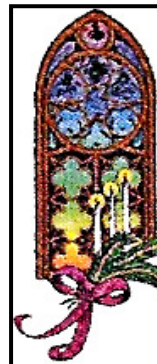
