Join us for lunch on Thursday, August 27th at 11:30 and listen to Gary Beyer, a motivation speaker tell his story of living with Inclusion body Myositis (a muscle disease).

Below is a message from Gary.

If interested in hearing Gary's story, call with lunch reservations by Wed., Aug. 26th.

I was diagnosed with Inclusion Body Myositis (IBM) after a thigh muscle biopsy in January of 2008. This is an extremely rare progressive and debilitating type of inflammatory muscle disease. There is no known cure or treatment for it at this time. My condition has been noticeably worsening as I'd been told that it would, but I'm not one to question or complain. I've found this to be a highly invisible condition to most others. If you see me you would find me to appear pretty healthy. In complete honesty, writing "You Must Answer This" and the developments associated with my pursuit of this book are being divinely inspired. I have consistently been given strong positive feedback from those who have read my book and also those who have been at my previous presentations. I am truly very honored and humbled by this.

The sub-title of my new book is "Living With a Seemingly Invisible, Progressively Debilitating Disease". I am very proud to let you know that was recently asked to be one of the featured speakers at the Wisconsin Writers Association Fall Conference in Wisconsin Rapids on October 3rd

I've been speaking at a number of different venues and to a wide range of people since March 6th of last year. I've given presentations at many Wisconsin libraries, at numerous senior centers, at various care and assisted living facilities, to area support groups (including Parkinson's, MDA and Cancer Survivors) and to different service groups and community organizations including Learning in Retirement. A month ago I spoke to a seniors group associated with First English Lutheran Church in their auditorium and there were over fifty people there. The level of feedback I've consistently received from presentation attendees is extremely positive and quite motivational. I'm consistently finding the interest level for my presentations to be very high. The local presentation to St. Raphael's Church group on December 17th was my 50th since last March. I've given presentations are far South as Brookfield, as far North as Green Bay as far East as Brillion and as far West as Wautoma.

I am very proud of You Must Answer This and I Promise I'll Pay Attention. I've always been an upbeat and positive-thinking person. My intent is to utilize these books (and the inspirational messages within them) as a channel for encouraging others to stay positive and encourage them to keep/or make hope an integral part of their daily lives.

My sincere desire is to be able to help other people not lose their faith and for some...to consciously find their own reasons for hope. Maintaining our hope through difficult challenges is so very important. I've already had many people tell me that others will definitely benefit from hearing what I have to say as well as reading my books. You just can't give up. We look forward to meeting you on August 27th. I will bring copies of both of the books along for anyone who is interested in purchasing them afterwards.


