The Bristol Fire Department took delivery of a new fire truck to replace the 1973 Pirsch pumper that was still in service, but used only occasionally. The new engine/pumper has the capabilities of pumping 1,500 gallons per minute and carries 1,000 gallons of water. It is set up to do firefighting and with the capabilities for the handling of motor vehicle accidents carrying extrication equipment of a Hurst tool, air bags and struts. It is equipped with a generator to provide power for lights and equipment operations at night. This vehicle will be handling a lot of the calls that the other older apparatus were being utilized in an effort to prolong the life of these vehicles as these have a replacement cost. The new engine is in service with all of the members trained on using it.



A reminder that “Fireworks ” are not allowed to be used or sold in the Village of Bristol per Ordinances, 5-2-12, 7-5-1 and 7-5-2.

The Kenosha County Sheriff ’ s Department will be enforcing the ordinances that come with a fine of \$1,000.

Notice is hereby given to each and every person who owns, occupies or controls land in the Village of Bristol to cut and destroy any noxious weeds, which include Canada Thistle, Leafy Spurge, Marijuana, or Hemp. Field Bindweed, commonly known as Creeping Jenny, Musk Thistle (*Carduus Nutans L*), Goatsbeard, Quack or Quitch Grass, Harmful Barberry and English

Charlock, Wild Mustard, Purple Loosestrife, and Mulitrosa Rose. This must be done at such a time and in such a matter as shall eventually prevent them from bearing seed, or spreading to adjoining property, as required by Section 66.0407 of Wisconsin Statutes. Thistles must be cut before they reach seed stage.

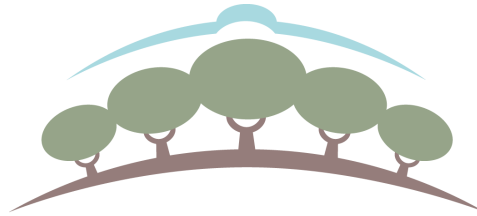
A WORD FROM THE DNR ABOUT RECYCLING

- Compost yard materials and vegetable food scraps. Composting is a smart way to keep valuable materials out of the landfill.
- Eliminate open burning. Burning even brush can cause pollution and health problems for you or your family and neighbors. It is illegal to burn treated wood, plastic, household garbage and most all other trash. State law allows burning of clean wood or brush and non-recyclable paper, but local ordinances may be more stringent than statewide requirements.
- Recycle used automotive materials. Used oil, oil filters, lead acid automotive batteries and used antifreeze should be recycled.
- Properly manage fluorescent and other light bulbs. Many types of bulbs contain metals such as mercury at toxic levels. These bulbs should be properly disposed of to avoid contaminating the environment or harming human health.
- Buy products in recyclable containers with as little packaging as possible. Look for packaging that can be recycled in your community and items which you can repair or reuse. Also, support recycling markets by buying and using products made from recycled materials.
